



4. The allotment committee should be given enough leeway to make individual adjustments, but not at the expense of other contract signers in the county. The base accrage is unquestionably too low.

5. Provisions should be

5. Provisions should be made to eliminate a large part of expenses of the Association The Allotment Committee should be practically the only expense, outside of office expenses.







Not so favorable and those in the West were hostile to any such control of industry, wages and prices in the future.

The steel industry has long had a system for keeping prices up. The NRA played right into the hands of these gentry, for it allowed them to do by law the very things which they had been forbidden by law to do—namely to meet, combine and lay down non-competitive prices. Even with the NRA lid off, the steel magnates are sitting pretty. They declare that they intend to keep on with the price fixing plan. At that, the industry is running now at only 40 per cent of capacity. The great heavy industries, lies steel, don't depend on sales of little trinkets in stores; they have to depend on huge orders from big users of steel. The best customers used to be the railroads, but the railroads are now buying almost no rails, and almost no cars, engines or other equipment.

25 per cent more paint than you did a year ago you are not getting your share. But if your name is Woolworth and you keepa 5 and 10 cent store, you will find your sales are running four per cent less than this time last year. In a way, the reduced sales of the 5 and 10 cent stores is a good sign for regular business —as it is a fact that these chains of stores with their immense variety of cheap artices make it almost impossible for independent merchants to thrive. The chain stores can often sell goods at retail for less than the local small dealer can purchase them for at wholesale. In bad times the people turn to the cheap stores—because they have to make their money go as far as possible. These stores have undoubtedly been of great help in keeping the cost of living down. But it is a good sign when the buying public have enough money to make larger purchases also.—Pathfinder.

# **GOVERNMENT BANK** UNSUITED TO U.S.

Would Serve Politics Rather Than Business Needs, Says R. S. Hacht, Citing Previous Experiences.

# QUOTES PRESIDENT JACKSON

Extent and Diversity of This Coun try Presents Different Situation From Europe and Makes Regional Banking Necessary.

WASHINGTON, D. C .- A refuta tion of arguments in favor of a gov-ernment-owned central bank system for the United States is presented

erament-owned central bank system for the United States is presented in a statement by R. S. Hocht, President of the American Bankers Association, on the basis of exhaustive studies of European central banks. He also points out the disabrous consequences of previous central bank experiments in America. "Our present regional Federal Reserve System under private ownership is infinitely better for this country than would be a government-owned and controlled central bank." Mr. Hecht says. "If history teaches us anything, it is that it is almost certain that a central bank so owned would be run to meet the varying exigencies of the government in power rather than to serve the commercial needs of the country."

Central banking has been tried twice in the United States, but was finally abolished because the credit control which the central banks exercised became objectionable and unpopular, he goes on to say.

"The continued existence of the Second Bank finally became a bitter political issue and President Jack-son succeeded in abolishing it." Mr. son succeeded in abolishing it," Mr. Hecht says. "Permit me to quote from his farewell address: The immense capital and peculiar privileges bestowed upon it enabled it to exercise despotic sway over the other banks in every part of the country. From its superior strength it could seriously injure, if not destroy, the business of any of them which might incur its resentment... If you had not conquered, the government would have passed from the hands of the many to the hands of the few; and this organized money power. from its secret conclave. power, from its secret conclave, would have dictated the choice of your highest officers.... The forms of your government might, for a time, have remained, but its living spirit would have departed from it."

when the Wilson Administration considered banking reform it carefully kept away from vesting central banking powers in a single institution and instead introduced the regional idea by creating twelve reserve banks located in different economic and geographical sections of the country, Mr. Hecht says, a plan that has worked exceedingly well because the separate banks are under the guidance of men chosen on account of their intimate acquaintance with the problems and needs of their respective territories. He adds:

"The great size and diversity of America tends to make a central bank undesirable. The central banks of Europe such as the Banks of Engand, France and Germany, coverareas not as large as some of our

areas not as large as some of our states. A central bank in the United States on the other hand would be called upon to administer the finan-cial policies of an area larger than all of Europe, in which there are quite a number of central banks.

Subservien: to Popular Demands
"Moreover, history has proven
that any banking system entirely
owned and dominated by the government usually demonstrates much
greater ability in aiding expansion
of credit than in putting on the
brakes at the right time to prevent
undue inflation by restraining and
contracting credit. This is easy to
understand because in times of depression everyone is urging the gorernment to make money and credit
easy and to encourage expansion.

"On the other hand, it always has
been and always will be a difficult
task for any government to call a
halt in time of apparent prosperity
because in the very nature of things
the government would be very sensitive to public criticism and would
hesitate to take any action which
would tend to curtail business activity. It is such undue susceptibility to popular demands which makes
government b an king inherently
weak.
"Our studies show that of all the Subservien: to Popular Demands

ty to popular demands which makes government banking inherently weak.

"Our studies show that of all the central banks at present existing there are only four whose stock is owned by the government."

The American Bankers Association, Mr. Hecht says, is convinced that a central bank would not be in the interest of the public or the banks. Its position, he concludes, is "well understood by the President and the leaders in his Administration, for we have been absolutely frank with them in all of our discussions and have missed no opportunity for emphasizing that in our opinion no banking system will, in the long run, be sound if it is dominated entirely by the ever-changing political administrations. We should do all we can to keep our banking mechanism as far removed from vartisan politics as possible."
