





Under the codes, strike prevention will be vastly simplified when industries create the form of industrial relations boards suggested by General Johnson to the code authorities. Meanwhile, until self-governing industries, which all of them are, set up such agencies for composing differences with their employees, the National Recovery Administration performs the next best service to the public, by pointedly discouraging strikes and lock-outs.

Last week 41 mills in the knitted outerwear industry in the Philadelphia area, with the endorsement of their code authority petitioned NRA for privilege of working their employees 14 hours a week above the 40 hours prescribed by their code, to take up the productive time lost during a 38-day strike last spring. The applicants explained that they were being hard driven to fill orders for sports wear, summer dresses, and bathing suits, and there was a scarcity of extra skilled workers.

In denying the application, Division Administrator H. O. King said the Administration had adhered to the general rule that it is against policy to grant hours in excess of code provisions because shut-downs due to industrial disputes. It was held that "settlement of such disputes by discussion rather than Strikes should be discouraged" and that "exemption designed to minimize for either party the unfortunate consequences of strikes are not in accord with sound policy.

LIQUOR DEAL

As reported by the New York Herald-Tribune, the Government has just figured in an extraordinary proposal. According to this account a syndicate had bought up an amount of bootleg liquor estimated as between forty and fifty million gallons. The proposal made to the government was that the liquor was to be released for sale on payment of Federal and State Taxes. The government has so far refused to legalize any known illicit liquor. In the present case, according to the Herald Tribune, the President himself refused the offer, insisting that the liquor is undoubtedly illegal and that to accept the proposal would place the Government in the position of compounding a felony.

To the drys still struggling with the peculiar ethics of present legalized liquor, the Government seems to be splitting hairs. If the liquor can meet governmental tests and pays the required taxes, it would seem now to be on the same status with any other stimulant. The argument that the manufacturers must be penalized for running the liquor before repeal does not weigh much, as the present holders have bought up the supply since repeal.

Meanwhile the question remains as to what will be done with the liquor itself? If it is illegal, why does not the Government confiscate and destroy it and thus end the argument altogether? The inference that Treasury agents are unable to locate fifty million gallons of liquor has difficulty in passing muster if the eminent respectability of the negotiators is borne in mind. These gentlemen could hardly have been in a position to refuse to disclose the whereabouts of their holdings. 1351




