## New information on Reye Syndrome

In the midst of the flu season, important new information has become available about the development -- in teens and children with flu -- of Reye syndrome, a rare but serious condition that kills 20 to 30 percont of its young victims and leaves many survivors braindamaged.
US Dew information comes from study of a possible link seen in fourearlier state studies between the use of aspirin in treating flu or chicken pox and an increased risk of Reye syndrome.
The Institute of Medicine of the National Institutes of Health and the Centers for Disease Control wil winter, the Institute of Medicine advised that the federal government not wait to inform and protect the public.
As a result, Health and Human Services Secretary Margaret M. Heckier has asked manufacturers to remove any recommended use in flu and chicken pox from aspirinren -- and to add a warning to all

The pilot study looked at the histories of drug treatments and other factors of 29 young people
who got Reye syndrome last year. Use of aspirin for fluo or chicken pox symptoms was the common thread shown in 28 of the 29 (whereas ordinarity less than half the young people with flu or chicken pox would be expected to take aspirin.) U. S. Surgeon General C. Everett Koop, M.D., has said that most childhood illnesses are seif-limiting and usually don't require any
medication at all. Doctors often suggest that a child with fever simply be made comfortable with cool compresses.
Of course, physiciens continue to find aspirin useful and safe for adult, teen and childhood arthritis and other conditions.
Reye syndrome in a rare condition -- a few hundred cases a year.
It was named in 1963 for an Australian pathologist who described it as a swelling of the brain, combined with liver malfunction
and blood chemistry disorders Improved recognition and early treatment of the disease has helped reduce the death rate, but still cases are fatal.
It is crucial to take action quick Reye's symptoms occur whether or not aspirin or an aspirin-containing product has been used. The first sign is generally persistent vomiting. The young person may be sleepy and lethargic, but still responsive.
Within half a day, he or she become disoriented, combative and delirious.
Untreated, the teenager or child can go into a coma and die. Thus, Reye is a medical emer gency. A child with Reye syndrome symptoms must be taken immediately to a hospital, where blood and body fluids can be monitored and a Surgery mas be needed, in fall. cases, to relieve pressure on the swollen brain. Therefore, act promptly if you suspect Reye syndrome.
