The Spearman Fire Department held a bucket brigade contest and a fire hose relay.

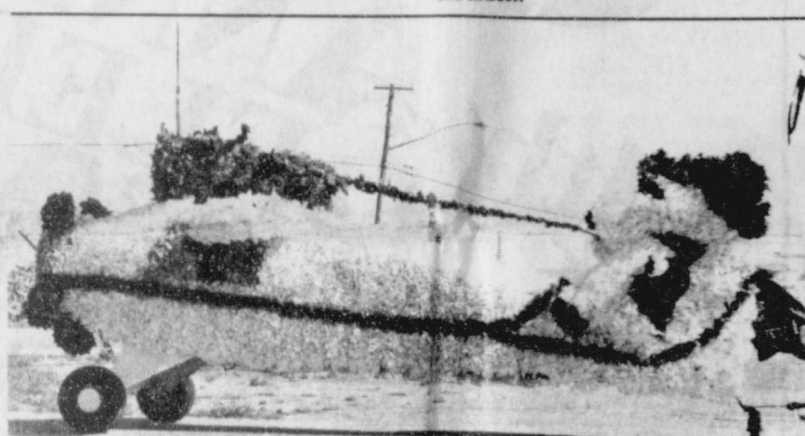
A free teenage swim night was held at the pool Friday from 8 until 10 p.m., sponsored by Parents Support Group.

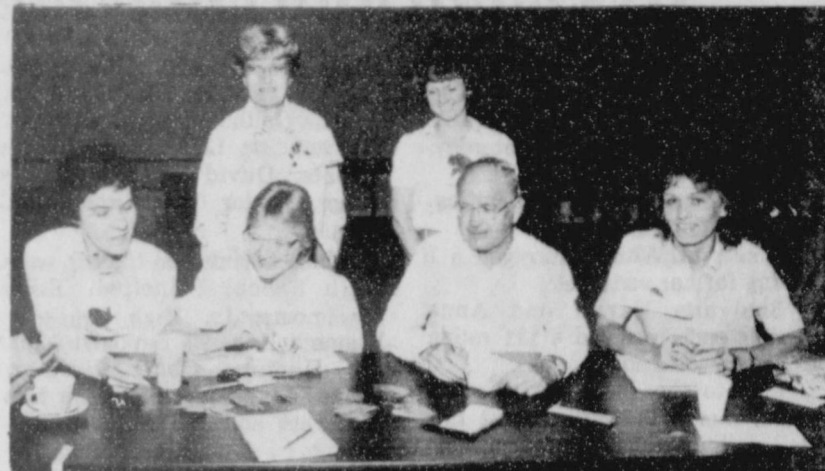
Area Teachers participating in Continuing Education

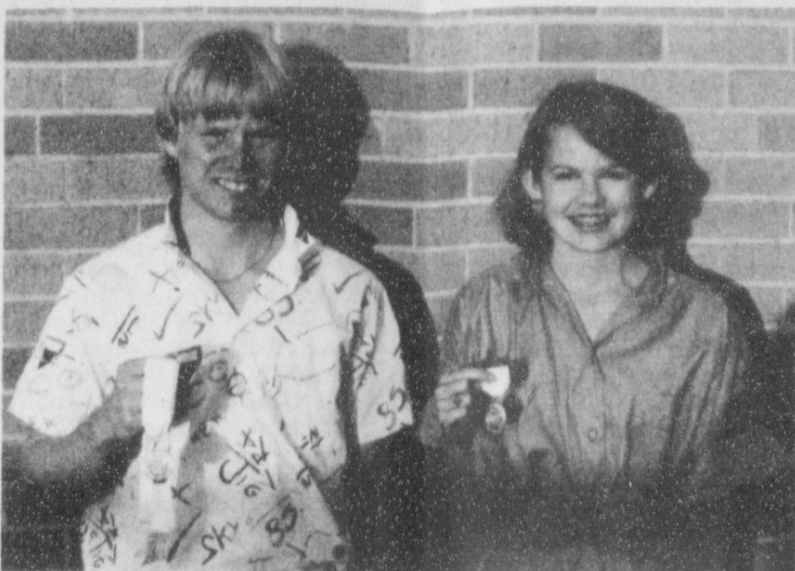
