City receives rebate check

The City of Spearman received a check for \$17,412.60 for taxes collected on sales made in January and reported to the Comptroller by February 20. This compares with a check for \$15,241.76 for the same period last year.

1985 payments to date are \$42,167.11. 1984 payments were \$51,406.08.

This is off 17.97%.

The City of Gruver received \$3,708.82 this period compared to \$2,087.62. 1985 payments to date \$10,250.41 compared to \$9,520.16 up 7.67%.

Commissioners also agreed to pay the Home Demonstration Council for the use of the Clubroom one day a week for the Family Service Councilor to meet with clients.

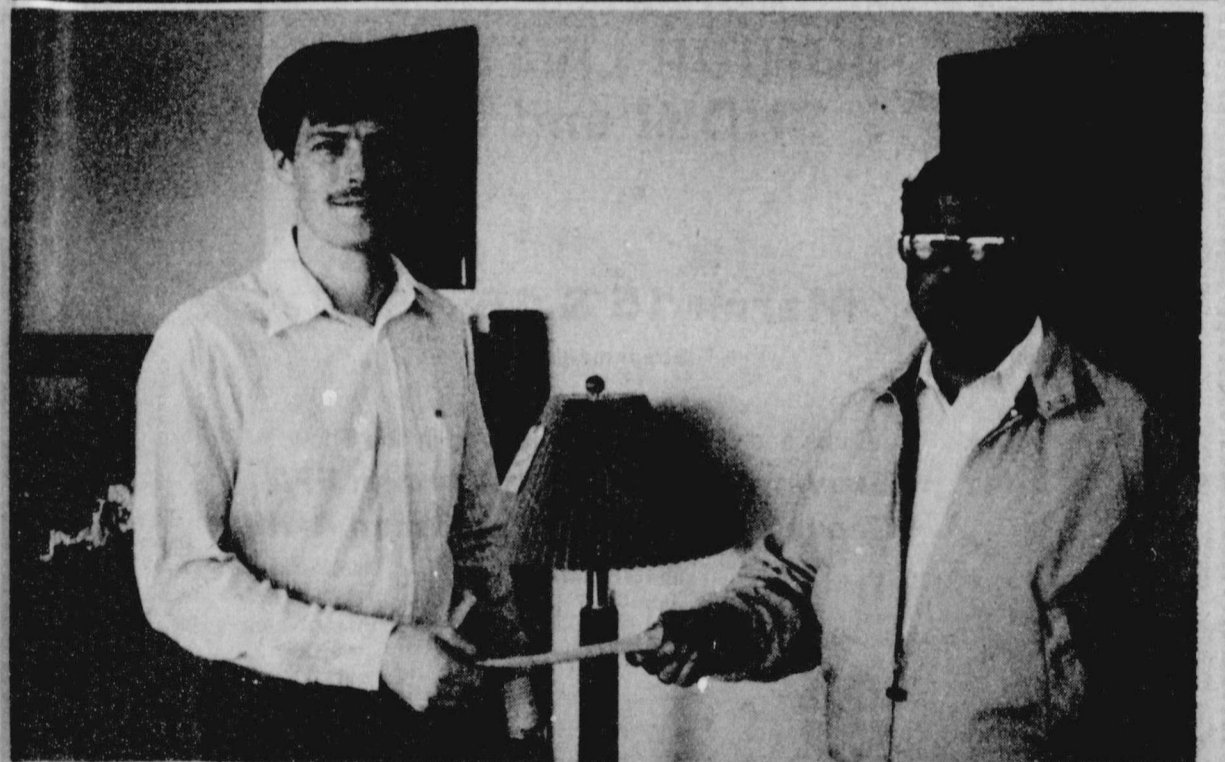

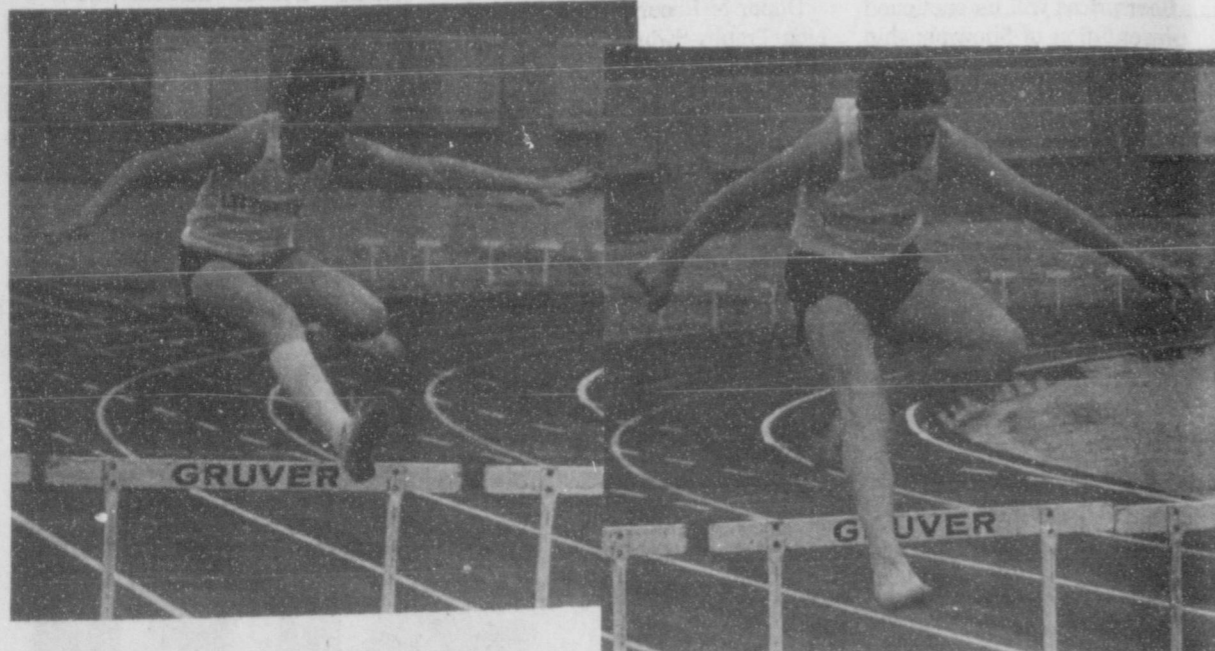

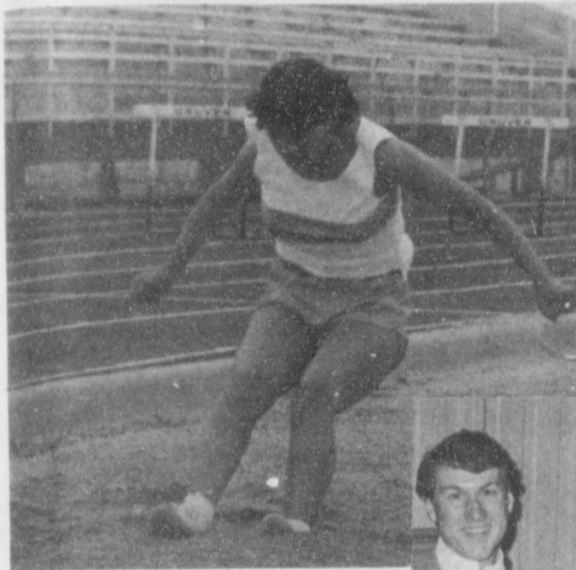

Several Spearman youth placed in the top three in several events. The winners in the Panhandle Exhibitors Association were as follows:

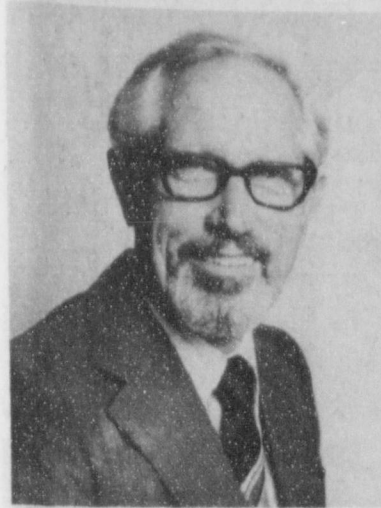
