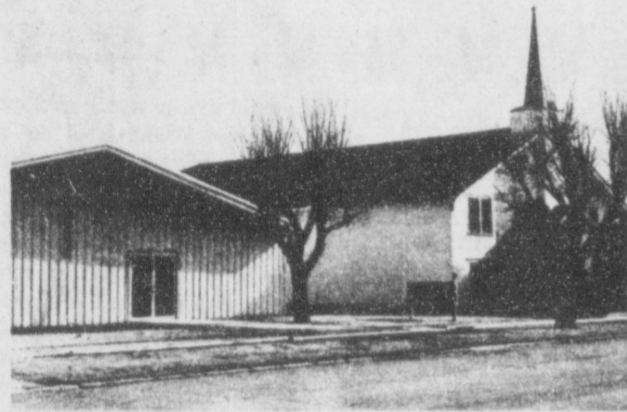

Union Church "Ground Breaking"

**Spearman
Union Church
Spearman, Texas**



The Spearman Union Church cordially invites the public to "ground breaking" services at the church in Spearman, Sunday, April 21.

The "Ground breaking" will be held immediately after the 11 a.m. church services.

Complete details and cost of project are explained in the following story.

The Spearman Union Church was organized on January 13, 1921 as a place for people of all faiths to worship. The first business meeting was held at which the first board members were elected to start the plan for a building. They were L.M. Womble, E.A. Greever, J.M. Glover, H.E. Barber and John L. Hays. At this time funds were raised and building started by January 29. D.E. Dillow and Sons were hired to build the church. The building was completed by May 12 and ready for a revival, that was scheduled for May 15 with the Morton Sisters and Dr. C.P. Nelson of Detroit, Michigan. For many days crowds estimated at 1000 came from six or seven states. Scores of people were saved, healed and received the Holy Spirit.

Mrs. E.A. Greever was in charge of the services until the early 1930's when Susie Dacus began as a co-worker. The women of the church had a Thursday prayer meeting and a work day in Mrs. Dacus' home. They quilted approximately 150 quilts for the needy and also distributed food and clothing.

Brother Albert Durham came in the fall of 1948 to pastor. The front of the church was changed and classrooms and restrooms were added.

On July 23, 1953, Brother Calvin Springer came to pastor. During this time hardwood floors and new seats were added to the church.

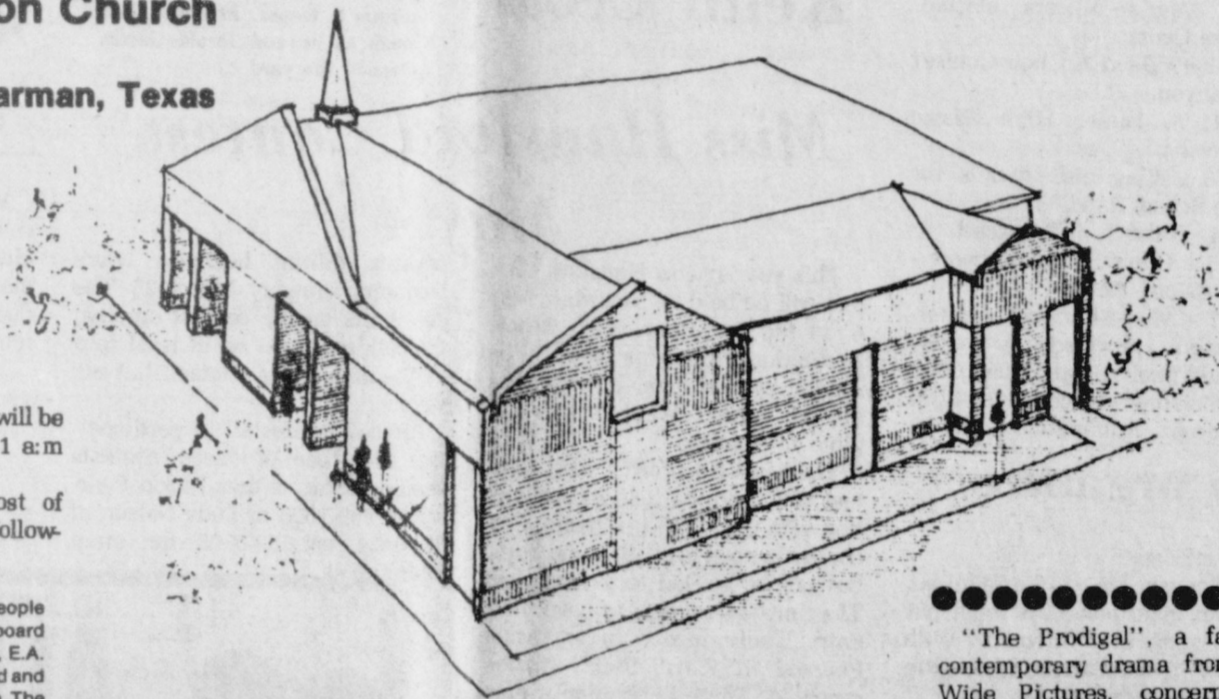
In 1960 Brother Albert Durham came back to pastor for 2 years. An annex (now our Primary department) was added and the present heating system was installed.

Brother Gall Ott came to Union Church as pastor in 1968. An air conditioning system and new light fixtures were added to the sanctuary. A pastor's study and office cabinets were also installed.

In August of 1970 Brother Ray Christianson came to pastor. Stained glass windows, paneling and a church library were added to the church.

Brother Archie Burreas and family came to pastor on July 23, 1973. In 1976 construction began on an Educational and Fellowship building now called "The Family Life Center". The building includes several classrooms, a large kitchen and meeting area for church dinners and the Annual Thanksgiving Dinner, a church parlor and Men and Ladies restrooms.

Now we feel the need for even more space. The pastor and board of deacons have been meeting with Mills-Davis Architect for the last 3 years and seeking the Lord for a plan that will be a blessing and allow room for growth. This is an addition to our present sanctuary. The plan includes increasing the church's seating capacity by one half, providing an adequate and modern nursery for our now cramped facilities, large modern restrooms, additional Sunday school and office space, easy access with no steps for wheel chair, elderly or physically impaired and a beautiful brick exterior which will not deteriorate.
