## SALARIES UNDECIDED

In the 1984-85 school year, teachers in the Spearman School District received the state required minimum salary plus \$4,400 for a bachelor's degree, or \$4,900 for a master's degree. Spearman teachers will receive the state required increase of \$1,140, for the 1985-86 school year if the local increment remains the same. Determination of final salary schedule figures will be made along with many other factors to arrive at a

final budget figure for 1985, prior to September 1st.

Final valuations for tax purposes have not been received from the Hansford County Appraisal District, but are expected to be lower than the 1984 valuations. Estimates of State aid for 1985-86 have not been received from the Texas Education Agency, but is expected in the near future. Until such time as all this information is available, final decisions on budget matters cannot be made.

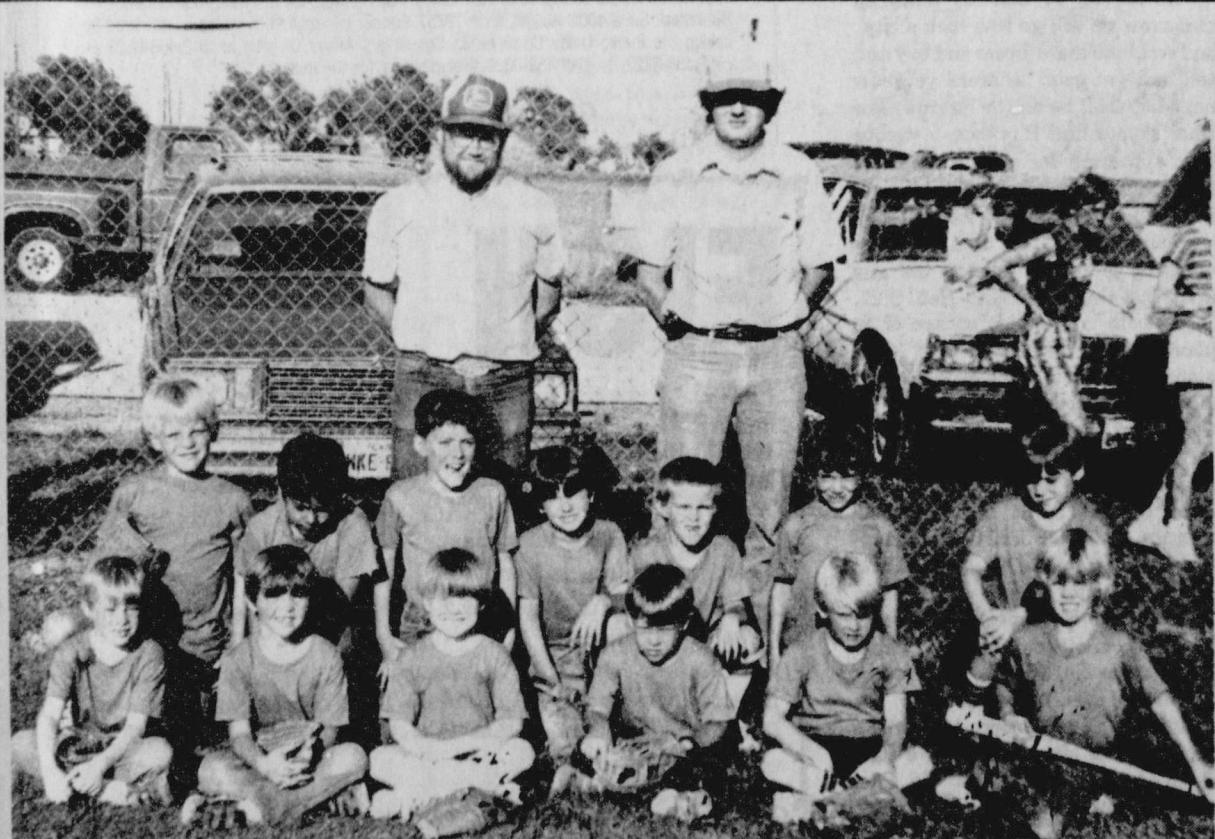

### NOTICE OF INTENT TO IMPLEMENT RATES

General Telephone Company of the Southwest in accordance with the Public Utility Regulatory Act and the Rules of the Public Utility Commission of Texas gives notice of its intent to implement new exchange access rates for the provision of shared tenant and tenant resale services.

These proposed rates are applicable to customers of General Telephone Company of the Southwest, excluding hotel/motel customers, who provide local exchange telephone service of General Telephone Company of the Southwest to their tenants or patrons on a resale or shared use basis. This resale or sharing arrangement is normally provided utilizing a customer-provided PABX or other similar stored control switch capable of common control processing or other features commonly associated with a PABX "Smart" switch.

These proposed rates are designed to recover costs on a usage basis for local exchange telephone service access and are identical to General Telephone's "Optional Measured Service" rates. The monthly access rate will be \$28.95 per trunk line and the usage rates are as follows:

As this is a new service offering, we are unable to determine the number of customers who may be affected. Currently, there are no known prospective customers. Until any customer utilizes this new offering, there will be no effect on the revenues of the telephone company, and in any event, the telephone company does not expect revenues to be affected by more than 2 1/2 percent. These proposed rates, where applicable, will provide tariffed local exchange access to customers who then will provide shared or resale services to tenants.

These proposed rates have been suspended by the Public Utility Commission of Texas and will become effective as proposed or modified by order of the Commission on a date to be determined by the commission.

The proposed rate schedule is on file with the Commission for public inspection and is also available at any business office of General Telephone Company of the Southwest. Persons who wish to intervene or otherwise participate in these proceedings should notify the commission as soon as possible. # Scholarship tourney set

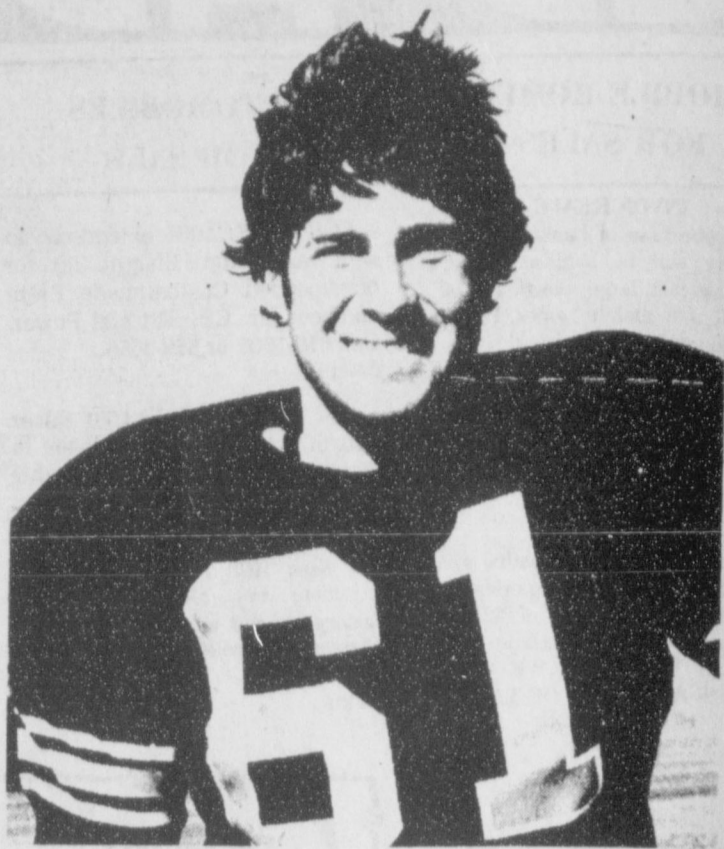
He also was a member of the track team, competing in shot put and discus.

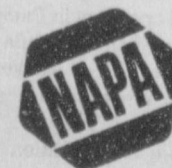

**Local girls elected at Girl's State**

Girls State was organized as a National Americanism activity in 1937 by the American Legion Auxiliary. Non-political, the purposes of the Girls State program are to provide citizenship training for girls of high school age, to afford them an opportunity to live together as a self-governing group and to inform them of the duties, privileges, rights, and responsibilities which they will assume when they become adults. They learn the problems of government by simulating the duties of city, county, and state officials. Each year citizens are selected at local levels from students who have just completed their junior year in high school. The selection is based principally on character, leadership, and scholarship.

The 1985 session of the American Legion Auxiliary Bluebonnet Girls State has grown from an experimental conference of ninety-four girls, held at Baylor University in 1941, to become the largest single extracurricular educational program for high school girls in Texas. This year 580 girls are in attendance, making a total of more than 17,500 girls in Texas who have participated in this top-level citizenship program.

During the ten day session the citizens heard talks from several prominent persons. Among them were five former citizens of Bluebonnet Girls State. Ann Richards, Treasurer, State of Texas; Carole Keeton Rylander, former Mayor, City of Austin and presently a member of the Texas State Board Insurance Commission; and attorneys Claudia Sangster and Collyn Peddie, of Houston, and Kappy Allen of Austin, each attended Girls State. Mrs. Jane Shultz, President, American Legion Auxiliary Department of Texas; Mrs. Betty Jean Jones, Mayor of Seguin; and Commander John Morris, American Legion, spoke to the citizens during opening ceremonies June 12.

Former citizens of Girls State and members of the Texas American Legion Auxiliary comprise the seventy members of the staff and counselors who volunteer their services to direct and lead this program. The Director, Frances Goff of Houston (now retired), is a former Assistant to the President of The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute at Houston. The Associate Director for Administration is Jo Hudson, a former Professor of Speech Communication, and now a Student Activities Advisor and a Ph. D. Graduate student in Educational Administration at Texas A and M University, College Station. The Associate Director for Educa-

tion is Mary Ellen Trahan of League City, Chairman of the Department of Social Studies at Clear Lake High School.

Supreme Court Chief Justice John Hill administered the oath of office to the elected state officials of Bluebonnet Girls State Monday, June 17 in the Rotunda of the State Capitol. Secretary of State Myrn McDaniel represented Mark White, Governor of the State of Texas and addressed the citizens during the Inauguration of the Bluebonnet Girls State officials.

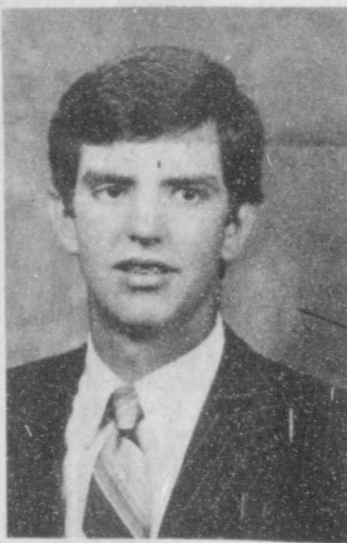

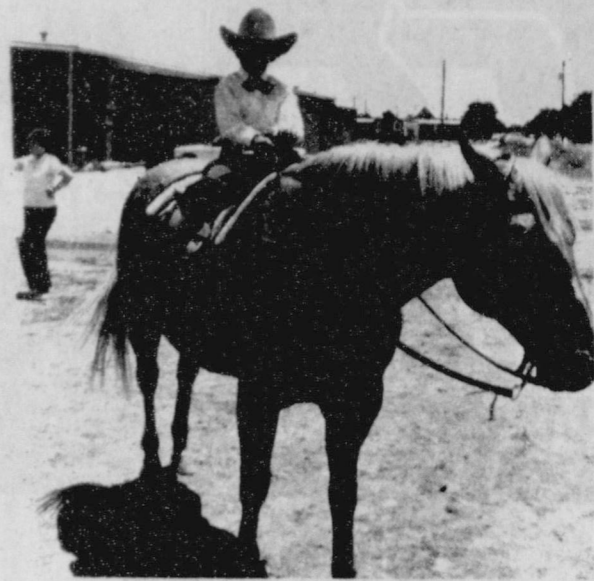

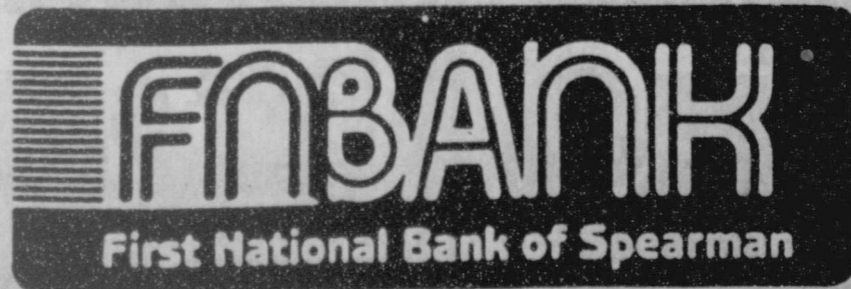

All VOA broadcasts originate from studios in Washington, D.C. Tourists may visit the new, up-to-date studios dedicated at VOA headquarters last May. The tour concludes with a look at the Voice newsroom where visitors observe journalists preparing information for 300 plus newcasts aired daily.

Only blocks from the world famous Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum on one side and the Capitol Building on the other, the Voice of America is waiting to be explored.
