This spring, a buffalo calf was born and now the buffalo roaming has increased to three.

Renaming of scholarship honors benefactor

The Extension Homemakers of Hansford County are announcing the renaming of the Extended Homemaker Scholarship in honor of Mrs. Ella Garnett. The first scholarship, in 1983, was awarded to Virginia Poole of Morse. Applications can be obtained for the Ella Garnett Scholarship at the County Extension Agent's office. The application can be returned there by July 15, 1984, to be awarded for the 1984 fall semester.

Home Demonstration Clubs started in Hansford County in 1938. The first agent was Pearle Locke. She began work on July 1, 1938.

On July 8, 1950, the Old Blodgett school building was moved from seventeen miles southeast of Spearman to its present location, 309 North Bernice. On that date there were 112 members in six clubs and 130 girls in 4-H out of seven clubs. On their 25th Anniversary celebration in 1963, there were five clubs with 78 members.

Mrs. Ella Garnett was one of the first charter members. She worked very hard in an Extension Homemaker club called Spearman clup up until it disbanded around 1980. As a child she had attended the Old Blodgett school and it was very important to her and she loved it even more when it became the Home Demonstration building.

Mrs. Garnett died March 17, 1984 at the age of 88. She was born in Hays County and moved to the Spearman area in 1931, from Bellville.

She married B.J. Garnett in 1911, at Jacob's Well in Hays County. He preceded her death in 1966, and a son, Stanley, died in 1978.

She and her husband donated the land for Hansford Hospital and Hansford Manor Nursing Home.

Survivors include two sons, Wesley of Spearman and Howard of Pousbo, Washington; a

daughter, Mrs. Tom Morris of Amarillo; two sisters, Lula Deck of Waco and Cora Alexander of San Antonio; eight grandchildren and fifteen great-grandchildren.

Today, there are three clubs in Hansford County; Serendipity, Happy Homes and Town and Country. There are 50 members and 126 4-H members.

Extension Homemakers awarded Jon Garnett, great-grandson of Ella Garnett, the 1983 4-H scholarship. The 1984 scholarship went to Will Jarvis. That scholarship is awarded to a deserving 4-H youth in Hansford County. It is a \$300 scholarship.

Hansford County is the first county in Texas to award an extended Homemaker a scholarship, a scholarship for a homemaker returning to or beginning college. This is the second year Hansford County has offered it and is honored to name it the Ella Garnett Scholarship.

Local fiddler on trail again



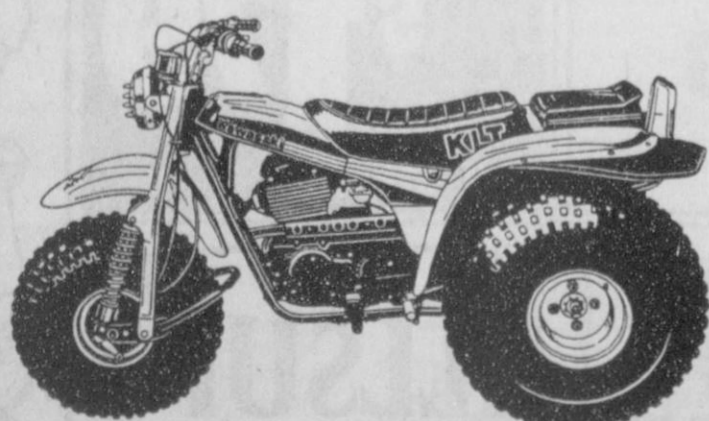

Appraisal District hearing

The appraisal review board (ARB) for Hansford County Appraisal District begins hearing taxpayer appeals on Tuesday, June 19, 1984. Property owners may protest some aspect of their property appraisals at any time prior to the date the ARB approves the appraisal records.

The ARB is a group of citizens of the appraisal district who have been appointed by the district directors to equalize property values and consider claims for exemption and agricultural value. With the implementation of the central appraisal district, taxpayers are able to address a single equalization board instead of one for each taxing unit in which their property is located.

According to Mrs. Peddy, chief appraiser for the Hansford County Appraisal District, a property owner may protest any of seven specific actions of the appraisal office, as well as any other action that applies to the owner and adversely affects him.

The seven protests are: --the appraised or agricultural value of the property; --unequal appraisal of the taxpayer's property in comparison to the weighted average level of appraisals of other property in the appraisal district; --inclusion of the property on the appraisal records; --denial of a partial exemption, such as a homestead exemption; --denial of agricultural-use, open space or timber valuation; -- identification of the taxing unit or units in which the property is located; --determination that the taxpayer is the owner of the property.

A property owner who wishes to lodge a protest based on one or more of these actions must file a written "notice of protest" with the review board, Mrs. Peddy said.

Official forms are available at the appraisal office, (he) (she) noted. However, the chief appraiser added that a letter from,

the taxpayer will also be acceptable as a notice of protest, as long as it identifies the property owner, the property that is the subject of the protest and indicates dissatisfaction with some determination of the appraisal district office.

A hearing will be scheduled after the notice is filed and the property owner will be informed of the time, date and place at least 15 days before the date of the hearing.

The property owner filing the protest is then entitled to appear in person before the ARB to offer evidence or argument. He may also offer his evidence or argument by affidavit without appearing personally.

The property owner and chief appraiser will be notified by certified mail of the ARB's decision.

Anticipated date for approval of appraisal records by the ARB is July 1, 1984.

FCC approves

GTE charges

Changes approved by the Federal Communications Commission on May 25, 1984 will affect General Telephone customers using interstate long-distance directory assistance, customers using AT&T to make long-distance calls, and businesses with more than one line.

An interstate directory assistance charge of 50 cents per call with a two-call allowance for each billing period. If the customer makes one or no interstate calls, the allowance would be one or zero respectively.

The FCC also ordered AT&T to reduce its interstate long-distance rates by approximately 6.1 percent.

At the same time, the FCC approved interstate end user access charges of \$6 per line for businesses with more than one line.

All of the changes became effective May 25.



Jim Murray commended by Bullock

Austin, Tex.--State Comptroller Bob Bullock today commended Spearman City Manager Jim Murray for his help in preparing the Comptroller's new Standard Financial Management System for Texas Cities.

Jim Murray was among 15 members of a committee of local officials picked by the Texas Municipal League to help establish accounting standards for Texas cities. These standards are included in a standard city financial manual dubbed the "Blue Book" that will be offered on a voluntary basis to Texas cities later this year.

"Our state's biggest cities have the resources to hire accounting firms to set up sophisticated bookkeeping systems. The Blue Book is aimed at helping the rest. And we could not have put this system together without help from the like of Jim Murray," Bullock said.

Bullock explained the Blue Book is modeled after the "Red Book," a uniform financial management system designed by the Comptroller's Office in 1978 for Texas counties. So far, more than 200 Texas counties have adopted procedures recommended in the Red Book and Bullock expects similar success from the city project.

Following distribution of the Blue Books later this year, the Comptroller's Office will explain the program in regional workshops and at the Texas Municipal League annual convention in November.

Final step in the program will come when the Comptroller's Office sends certified public accountants and auditors into cooperating cities to help them adopt the program.

Each must make a conscious effort to establish good relations and contribute to their continuation.

Russia's Response

Since President Ronald Reagan began his defense buildup, deployed new missiles in Europe, and escalated the verbal war with Moscow, the Russians have reacted in many ways.

The American people are not always informed of each Russian move. But there have been many reactions. The arms talk walkout was the first. A major Soviet offensive in Afghanistan came next.

The pullout from the Los Angeles Olympics came next. On May 9, apparently in reaction of President Reagan's meetings with Chinese leaders in China (and tough words), the Russians canceled a top-level Chinese visit.

The Russians have deployed nuclear-warhead submarines closer to U.S. coasts in the Atlantic. They reportedly are equipped with cruise missiles. Some think the escalating attacks by Iran on oil shipping in the Persian Gulf are also linked to the Soviets.

Meanwhile, the new Moscow leadership appeals publicly for an end to the space weapons race and accuses Mr. Reagan of escalating that and the nuclear arms race.

The average American watches this renewal of cold war with anxiety. He hears Cong. Dante Fascell (D-Fla), chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, call for an end to space weapons testing. (Fascell says this will cost as much as \$500 billion.) There are other warnings and objections.

The trend, in short, is quieting. If detente or some movement toward better relations is not evident in 1985, the present

military buildup will come under increasing criticism. Thus the next year will probably be the crucial one for President Reagan's approach to relations between the two superpowers.

President Reagan is reported by a national columnist to have said he would have few worries if the Democrat Party presidential nominee is Gary Hart.

All he'd need to win, he reportedly said, is a barber. Gary Hart's jug ears, if his hair were cut, would make him look like a sailplane.

Of course, this is all in jest, and Gary Hart is obviously attractive to millions of Americans--jug ears or no jug ears. (Clark Gable, by the way, also had jug ears.)

But it is true that appearance plays a role in presidential campaigns. The American public apparently didn't like Tom Dewey's little mustache, in 1948. President Carter's smile and teeth came in for much attention in 1980 (and stories of him being attacked by a "killer rabbit," he hit with a paddle).

Adlai Stevenson was too sophisticated for many voters. Dwight D. Eisenhower seemed just right. Ronald Reagan enjoys the advantage of "looking right," whatever that means. In this age of television, image and appearance are highly important.

But substance is what voters should place first in their priority list; substance, character, intelligence and ability.

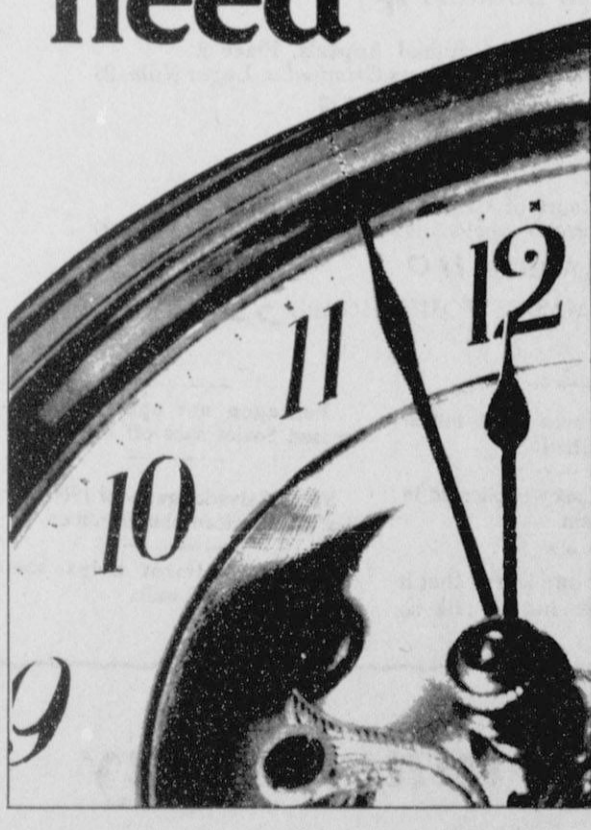

Controversy still rages over their vulnerability. But a few things are clear. They are tougher than some modern ships, and heavier. They are a smaller target than 80,000-ton aircraft carriers. With adequate air cover, they should be harder to sink.

Primarily, however, the recommissioning is a means of obtaining a major warship in less time, at less expense, than if built from the ground up. No one can really be sure of their comparative vulnerability, or value. One must hope their presence will help keep the peace and that they need never be used.

Iran said they will obey U.N. decision if Iraqis will.
