### Lions Club Program

"Rattler" Bill Schardin, pastor of the Faith Lutheran Church of Spearman, gave the program at the Lions Club Tuesday. "Rattler" Bill attended the Mangum Snake Hunt last Saturday and gave a complete report on the hunt to the club members. The Rev. Schardin stated that the main purpose of snake hunts is to rid the area of the pesky rattlers who inflict wounds upon livestock. Bill reported that some 1600 snakes were caught at Mangum, but extreme high winds and cold temperatures caused his group to catch only 1 rattler.

Bill informed the Lions that a baby snake is 10 times more

poisonous than the venom from a full grown rattler. At Mangum, the snakes were brought in, butchered, rolled in flour and meal, and then deep fried. The sizzling snakes were served as fast as they were cooked.

"Rattler" Bill Schardin has a tie made from the skin of a rattler. The tie was sewn by Oscar Donnell, local tailor. The Rev. Your paper helps to bring back memories. The death of Barbara Patterson makes me recall many. She started to school in Panhandle a year or so before I did. I can not recall her parents, but I do recall they were one of the leading families in Panhandle. My father had the Gulf Wholesale Gasoline company there when he died in 1921. We had to move back to Wheeler and re-possess an old hotel we had sold there.

One summer, when I was teaching in Spearman, Sam Patterson offered me a job driving a wheat truck, a long wheel-based truck. The pay was to have \$10 a day. While waiting to get the truck filled, I did other things that needed to have been done. Sam did not keep a record of the time I put in. He took my word for it. Then, at the end of wheat season, he asked me how many days I worked and how much a day he had offered me. I told him, and he doubled my pay. Sam and Barbara were so nice to Lois and me.

The last time we visited Spearman, we stopped by to see Barbara. She was not at home. She, to me, was one of our greatest friends in Spearman.

I hope the citizens of Spearman, percentage-wise, realize that good people do not come any better in any town. I hope the new-comers realize this and help Spearman continue to be a town as any town in Texas or the USA.

We plan to visit Spearman in September. Our problem is that we have to many to see in Texas that we have little time to visit. We plan to travel from a Texas A&M Class of '37 reunion in Austin with a friend who lived a block away from our home in Wheeler.

In my opinion, God never made a better man than Clay Gibner—many as good but none better! Pete Fisher was a great guy as I knew him. Dr. Hackley was the kind of a doctor that all doctors should strive to be: a friend to their fellow man!

## a new look

With this issue, readers will notice a new look on the inside pages. We've changed our format, abandoning the traditional eight columns on the inside and switching to six columns.

Newspaper design specialists have urged newspapers to switch to the six column format for many reasons, including greater readability. And in this business, readability is the name of the game.

The main reason for the change, however, is that this summer most daily newspapers in the United States, and most of the smaller ones, will be switching to a standard six column format. This will enable national advertisers to place advertising with individual newspapers and know that they can use one size advertisement for all newspapers.

This is known as the Standard Advertising Unit concept. The practice has been adopted by the National Newspaper Association.

The new inside format has meant a change for advertisers. Each column inch is larger and calls for a new rate.

Travis Patterson and Randy Martin of Wheeler won third place in Team Roping.

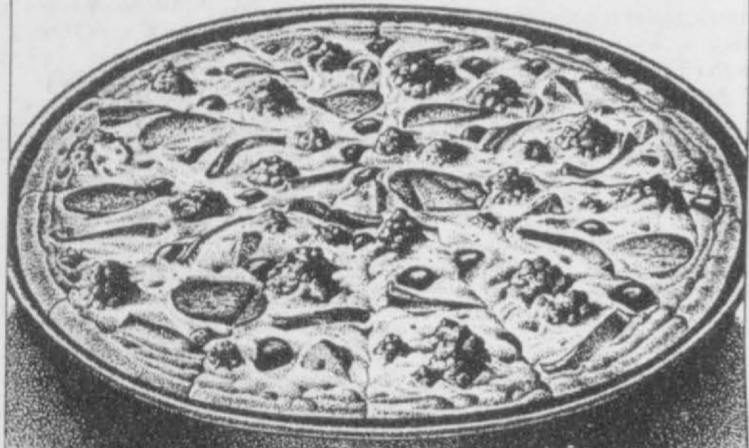
Hadley Reed, with a total of 11½ points, was named All-Around Cowboy.
