The Stationmaster's House Museum Board met in regular session at the Museum the morning of May 7th. Helen Boyd presided.

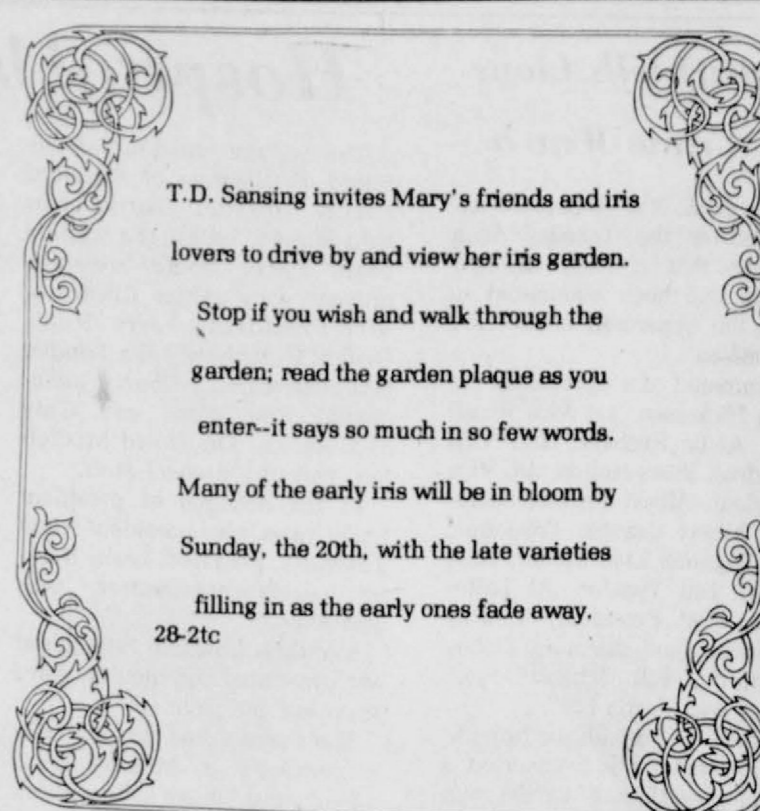
Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved and Rubyjo Wilbanks gave the treasurer's report.

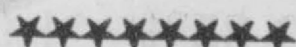
