EATING HABTIS (PART II) -

discipline can improve the problem. In dact.parental concern, anxiety, eexhorta-

Any time a child's eating habits change abrupty or he seems in distress or
unusually lethargic, parents should unussaaly lethargic, parents should

of appetite, bizarre dining room behaviors, or finicky eating. Here are eust

headaches, abdominal pains, or asthma. Soon, they learn to avoid these foods and perhaps others with similar tastes. Some
children develop ANEMIA (insufficient children develop ANEMIA (insufficient
red blood cells), perhaps due to poor red blood cells). perhaps due to poor
eating, and then suffer a weakness and
loss of appetite that leads to even poorer loss of appetite that leads to even poorer
eating. A variety of INFECTIONS especially ear and throat infections, make a child temporarily y ranky and inrritabe

and glandular disorders, as well as parasites, can cause eating, probbems that
can't be cured by stricter discipline. Various mental disturbances also relate
e eating difficulties. ANOREXIA NER. VOSA, for instance, leads to a liife-

means of losing weight. BULIMIA results means of losing weight BULIMIA results
in enormous eating binges followed by
purging via vomiting or laxative purging via vomiting or laxative abuse.

## Operator sentenced in credit card scheme

GLORIANNA GUIMARRA, age 51 , formerly of Dallas, TX.,
has been sentenced to has been sentenced to serve five years in a federal prison, after mail fraud in connection with a scheme to defraud people who attempted to obtian Mastercard and Visa credit cards. Giumarra, who was indicted on 15 counts of mail fraud by a federal grand jury on May 8, 1984, pled guilty to one count of the indicment on July 24 and was sentenced on August 23 by U.S. District Judge Barefoot Sanders.
According to Postal Inspector in Charge D.C. Strader, Fort
Worth, between June, 1983, and March 30, 1984, Guimarra operated two similar companies that placed ads in numerous national publications which led respondents to believe the companies could secure Mastercards or Visa credit cards for them, regardiess of their credit standings. Upon responder to the 800 relephondents were furnished a credit application which they were instructed to complete and return with a $\$ 25$ to $\$ 35$ fee in a business reply envelope furnished with the application. Those who sent money were sent a 20-page booklet on how to improve one'
credit card.
The companies operated by Guimarra were INTERTRUST 2552 Royal Lane, Suite 305 Dallas, TX. 75229, and CREDIT ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA 8140 Walnut Hill Lane, Suite 501, Dallas, TX., 75231. The addresses were mail drops; the companies were actually operatod out of Guimarra's home of North Dallas.
North Dallas.
Cheryl Wattley, who Attorney the case, indicated there were approximatety 5,000 victims of the scheme. Wattley and postal inspectors obtained Temporary Restraining Orders (TROs) on mail to Intertrust and Credit March, 1984, which prevented delivery of mail to the two firms. False Representation Orders (FROs) were later obtained which allowed the mail, which
had been held because of the TRO, to be returned to the senders.
During the investigation, a During the investigation, a search warrant was obtained
on mail which had been detained on mail which had been detained
due to the TRO. Approximately $\$ 20,000$ was found in mall which had accumulated during a 15 day period. Because of the FRO,
approximately 1500 to 1800 pieces of mail were returned to
the public with a potential savings of $\$ 50,000$ to $\$ 60,000$, Postal inspector E.D. Odom, one of the investigators in the case, stated that those who respond to similar ads found in newspapers and shopper guides, are told that for a fee (usually $\$ 25$ to $\$ 40$ ) anyone can be
uaranteed a Mastercard or Visa credit card, regardless of credit history. After people nay the fee they are either sent a complicard list of ways to improve credit so that a financial institution will eventually issue a credit card, or are told to place $\$ 300$ to $\$ 2,000$ in a pledged savings account at a edit cards. Those who respond
to such ads, Odom noted, usually do so because they do not have that kind of money available for pledged savings Strader also cautioned that just because similar ads are found in legitimate newspapers and magazines, the public should not assume the publish-有 of such promotions. He stated that the investigation of other operators of similar credit card
schemes in Texas and Oklahoma is continuing, and that other indictments are expected.
