





New Record In Corn Yield

213 Main

AUSTIN-Texas farmers are expected to harvest the third largest corn crop on record this year, Agriculture Commissioner John C. White recorded reported. A 111.1 million bushles yield is estimated by the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service for Texas. This will be the largest since the 111.2 million bushels produced in 1919. Texas' record crop of 117 million was harvested in 1910. "In 1910, it took five million acres to produce those 117 million bushels," White noted. "This year, our farmers are going to produce that near-record crop on only 1.1 million acres." White attributed this ability

White attributed this abuilty to produce more on fewer acres to an increase in irrigated acreage on the Texas High Plains. Yield per harvested acre is expected to reach 101 bushels per acre -





The title of the folder is "Man In His Own Star," taken from a 17th century poel by John Fletcher. Milestones in U.S. space achievement, from Project Mercury through Apollo Soyuz, are depicted through the U.S. stamps which were issued in honor of the missions.

were issued in honor of the missions. The colorful illustrations in the booklet were produced by technology as modem as the space missions them-selves. Conventional photographs were analyzed by an electronic process called "density silcing," which reduced them to a series of total values. A color was electronically assigned to each total value which the process is based was developed by NASA in the course of mapping the

topography of the moon. Orders for the booklet should be addressed to "Space Folder, Philatelic Sales Division, Washingto DC 20265". There is a 50-cent handling charge per order.

The U. S. Postal Service today announced the sub-jects of two major comm-emorative starting issues scheduled for the Bicentennial year of 1976. A sheet of 50 stamps will honor all the states of the United States. Each stamp in the colorful sheet will

reproduce one state flag. A sheet of 32 stamps will reproduce the entire De-claration of Independence, each stamp showing a por-tion of the document. Other subjects in the 1976 stamp program will be ann-ounced later. The Postal Service received many recommendations from cidens throughout the country as well as governors, and congressmen to honor the individual states as well as the original thirteen states. Flags on the stamps will be arranged in order of the admittance of the states to the Union.






