Museum celebrates caboose addition

Board of Trustees for the station Master's House Museum hosted an open house on Saturday, July 1, 1989, to celebrate the addition of a working caboose to the museum collection. Starting at 10 am, when the open house began, there was a steady stream of people to tour the caboose, and to view the other displays in the museum.

As each person entered the door they were greeted by one of the founders of the museum, Gus Renner. He invites the visitor to sign the register and then turns them over to one of the members of the Board of Trustees of the museum for a conducted tour of the museum.

The Board of Trustees for the Station Master's House Museum is made up of husband and wife teams. Each team fills a position on the board. The current presidents are Irvin and Helen Boyd. The other two top positions are Treasure's J.D. and Rubyjo Wilbanks, and Secretaries, Gus and Clementine Renner. The rest of the board is made up of J.L. and Juanita Pierce and Harry and Hazel Stumphf. Juanita Pierce is the display coordinator. She is responsible for the design of all the exhibits in the museum.

One of the newest exhibits in

the Station Master's Museum is the working caboose purchased from the Santa Fe Railroad. Helen Boyd traded with the Santa Fe office in Wichita, Kansas to purchase the caboose for \$3,000. "We wanted a complete caboose not a junker," said J.D. Wilbanks. Mr. Wilbanks stated further, "This caboose had everything in it, even had paper in the toilet." The caboose was so complete that its trip to Spearman was interrupted when it was mistakenly put on a train going to Brownwood, Texas, in Amarillo. It made a working trip even after it was retired and sold to the Spearman museum.

The caboose started its trip to Spearman in the rail yards in San Buenaventura, California. After its purchase by the Station Master's Museum it was moved to the rail yards in Amarillo. There it was mistakenly assigned to a train going to Brownwood, Texas. When it arrived in Brownwood, the mistake was corrected, and the caboose was returned to Amarillo. In Amarillo all the communication and other electronic equipment were removed. The caboose was then moved to Shattuck, Oklahoma. In Shattuck the caboose was put on a local rail

line to finish its trip to Spearman. At the museum in Spearman the Board of Trustees were busy

preparing a site to display the caboose. They prepared an authentic railroad bed for the caboose to sit on. All of the labor to prepare the site was donated by Irvin Boyd, J.D. Wilbanks, and Gus Renner. The materials were donated by the Shattuck, Oklahoma Santa Fe railroad offices and local businesses.

John Seamers, Palo Duro dam contractor, arranged for the gravel to serve as an balast for the foundation of the display. The Perryton agent of the Santa Fe Railroad donated the ties. The rails, that rest on the ties, were donated by the Shattuck office of the Santa Fe railroad. Using all of the donated material, the members of Board of Trustees assembled the site on the southside of the Station Master's House Museum. The caboose was moved from the local railroad tracks to prepared site by the Baker and Taylor

company. It is now open to be toured by visitors to the Station Master's House Museum.

Hansford County 4H Rodeo gets underway

The Hansford County 4-H Rodeo gets under way at the Oscar Archer Rodeo Arena on Saturday July 8th. The boys and girls entered in the 14-18 year old age groups start at 10 am. All the other age groups get under way at 6 pm. In case of rain the rodeo will be rescheduled to July 15th.

There are one hundred and fifteen boys and girls from the 4-state area of Texas, Kansas, Oklahoma, and New Mexico. They range in age from under seven to 18 years of age. The entrants are divided into 4 age groups to compete. The four age groups are 7 and under, 8-10, 11-13, and 14-18. They are further divided into boys events and girls events.

The boys and girls do not compete against each other but do share some events in common. These events are the barrels, pole bending, flag race, goat ribbon, goat tying, and break away roping. The events that the boys only participate in are calf riding, steer riding, ribbon roping, and team roping.

Awards for the contestants include 2 saddles, Robert Yellowhair belt buckles, tack, and a 60% of an entry fees jack pot. The All Around Cowgirl and Cowboy will receive the saddles. The All Around event winners will receive the Robert Yellowhair belt buckles, if they did not win a saddle. The first place finishers in individuals events all receive tack awards. All other places awarded

participate in the 60% of entry fee jack pot awards.

Judging from the Sherman county 4-H Rodeo results, some of the local Cowboys and Cowgirls should take home some of the awards from the Hansford County 4-H Rodeo. In the 6 and under boys, Marty Eakin, took home a 3rd in pole bending and 1st in goat ribbon. Autumn Bateman finished 3rd in poles bending and 5th in barrels. In the 7-9 year old boys, Monty Eakin place 4th in pole bending, barrels, and calf riding. Sandi Rich finished 3rd in pole bending and 5th in barrels. Another Eakin boy, Matt, took 3rd in barrels, 2nd in break-away roping, and 1st in steer riding. The combination of all those awards earned him the All Around Cowboy prize of a handmade saddle. Mark Eakin finished 1st in steer riding and 2nd in ribbon roping.

In the team events, the Eakin boys were involved in all of the winning teams. In Jr. Team roping Matt and Mark Eakin took 1st, Jim and Monty Eakin finished 2nd, and Monty Eakin and Dusty Harris nailed down 3rd. Clay Brandon and Mark Eakin finished 3rd in the senior team roping.

These local cowboys and cowgirls will be competing with other cowboys and cowgirls from the 4-state area, at the 4-H Rodeo on Saturday starting at 10 am. The rodeo will be held at the Oscar Archer Rodeo Arena.

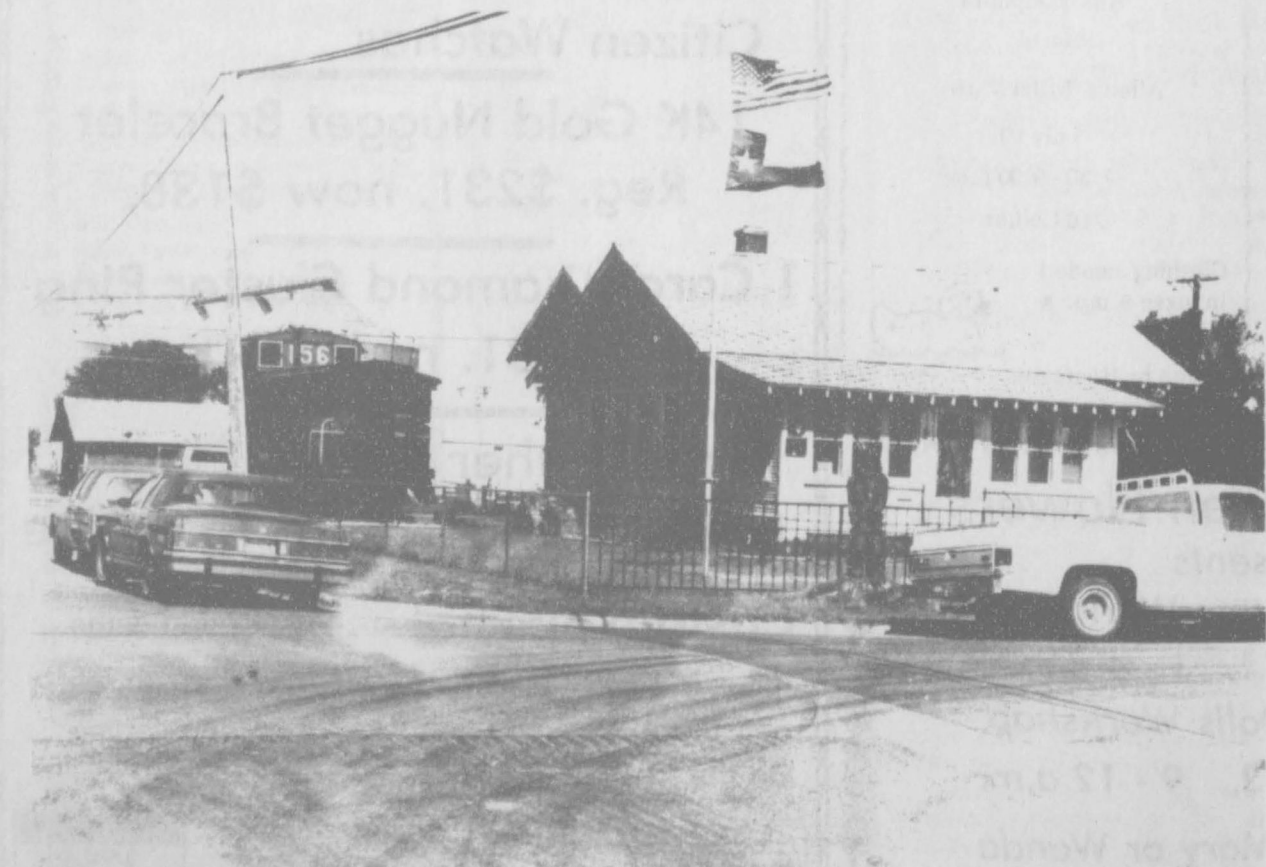

Veterans of the famed 11th Airborne Division who, together with the First Calvary Division and the 37th Infantry Division, liberated Manila in 1945, will meet in Columbus Georgia, October 12-15 1989 to celebrate the 46th anniversary of the Divisions activation at Camp Mackall, North Carolina in 1943.

Commanded by Major General Joseph M. Swing, the 11th landed at Batangas south of Manila, while the 511th Parachute Infantry and the 457th Parachute Field Artillery RCT team dropped by parachute on Tagatay Ridge near Lake Taal on February 3 1945.

The 11th Airborne Division gained its nickname "The Angels" from a daring raid behind the Japanese lines to liberate 2,147 internees at the Los Banos

prison camp, by land, water and parachute. The defending Japanese force was wiped out and the internees who suffered over

three years of imprisonment declared that the Paratroopers looked like "Angels" descending from Heaven.
