Evans in professional singing debut

When the bright lights hit the stage of the Will Rogers Auditorium in Ft. Worth Saturday, April 30, Spearman's own Laquita Evans will grab the spot light in her first professional singing performance.

Her stage debut will be on the internationally known Johnnie High Country Music Revue, a family entertainment program which is broadcast each Saturday night via CKBI International Radio -- 117.35 KZ on the 25 meter band.

And Laquita's performance April 30 will make her a credible personality on the country music scene as an entertainer.

The talented Spearman woman will perform a Reba McEntire favorite, "How Blue" and will be accompanied by the Johnnie High Band during her live performance.

Always musically inclined,

Laquita professes to a desire to be a professional singer since the age of three.

"I was raised on country music," she laughs. "I enjoyed it until I was about 12... then Elvis

came along and I got wrapped up in rock and roll."

Then, a few years ago with the release of the film "Coal Miner's Daughter", a film based on the life of country music great Loretta Lynn, Laquita's interest in country music came to life again.

Like many, she was a closet singer, always singing along with her foavorite music. She and her husband, Jim, enjoy dancing so music was always close to their lives.

She worked up enough courage to enter a talent contest in Pampa a few years back but was displeased with her efforts there and laid off for a period of about nine months.

Then she decided that, to make a go of it, she'd better get back to practicing or forget about it all together.

Last year she performed during the Spearman chamber of commerce's Hee Haw Revue and received several nice comments from those who attended.

"People were so kind and com-

plimentary," she remembers. "I got to working long and hard after that."

So, she went back to Pampa last July 4 and entered the talent contest again. This time she caught the attention of a country music fan in the audience, a gentleman from Amarillo who helps record and mix music at his own studio.

"He's helped me a good deal," she states. "He's helped me with my voice control and I've had a few recording sessions there."

This past February, Laquita went to Ft. Worth to audition for the Johnnie High CMR. A few weeks later she got her reply, inviting her to appear in their April 30 show.

"I'm really excited about the Johnnie High show," she explains. "I feel like it gives me some credibility."

But packed behind that credibility is several pounds of desire and hours of work and practice. Laquita is not one to skimp anywhere.

She spends at least seven hours

each week rehearsing, and sandwiches that time between an active life with her family.

Laquita -- in addition to being an active home maker -- also works with her husband at their business in downtown Spearman, Gordon's

"Of course, being the boss's wife does have its privileges," she says with a smile. "I can pretty well get off when I need to."

That time off has been needed in some instances. Along with home maker and now professional singer, one has to add her work with her two daughters in area pageants and a stint with her husband as a tournament chess player.

She finally gave up tournament chess and her two daughters have now outgrown the pageant scene, which is giving Laquita more time for her own interests.

"The pageants were something we all tried to keep in perspective," notes the busy mother of three. "We really enjoyed it and See "EVANS" p-2

Ft. Worth meeting seeks financial solution for PDRA money dilema

Palo Duro River Authority board members, their engineers and the staff of the Texas Water Development board were scheduled to meet in emergency session in Ft. Worth Wednesday as the group seeks ways to overcome a \$1.2-million budget over run.

The cost over run came about when bids for construction of the dam and spillway proper came in with a low bid of \$17,206,100 -- well

over the \$16-million budgeted for the building of the project.

Since that time, PDRA general manager Johnnie Lee has been in close contact with engineers and the state water board, seeking cost savings and financial plans to go ahead with construction.

The impass may have been breached with Wednesday's meeting to finalize plans for constuction.

"The engineers have come up with some design plans which may save us as much as \$1-million," Lee noted Tuesday, prior to the meeting. "And the financial people with the state water board staff have some plans for their own which they'll present to us Wednesday."

Due to press deadlines, the actual outcome of the meeting was not available for publication.

The main contributing factor to the cost over run appears to be the construction of the emergency spillway, the PDRA manager explains.

"It would appear there's more hard rock there than we anticipated," reports Lee. "We could save money by building two smaller spillways rather than one large one because of the rock."

Optimism for the project remains on a high level, both locally and in state meetings.

state meetings.

The Hansford county project is the first project to be brought before the newly created Texas Water Developement Board and,

as such, is receiving a good deal of attention, according to the PDRA manager.

"The members of the water development board have been

working with us very closely," says Lee. "We're going to get our dam built and we're going to have a lake."

Meanwhile, the PDRA engineering staff is continuing to pour over bids submitted at the March 16 bid letting as they check out contractors who are eager to get started on the project.

That process has been slowed by the fact that the staff has been working on cost-saving design changes which would affect the bids submitted.

Wednesday' meeting is expected to overcome the final hurdle in awarding a contract and Lee is hopeful that the board will be able to make a final decision by May 1.

The Palo Duro Water Authority is coming under some time pres-





Crisis Center Report

By MARY FRANCES ELLZEY

As you probably know, the PCC has been intensely interested in court procedures for battered women. This report will share some items from an interview with L. Tracy Brown, Assistant State's Attorney for Baltimore, Md. My source is The Exchange, a publication of National Woman Abuse Prevention Project.

Mr. Brown had been a legal advocate for a shelter for battered women before he became a prosecutor in Baltimore's Special Unit for Prosecution of Domestic Violense. He stated that he had noticed that the women are much more honest when they talk with a Shelter advocate than when they talk with a prosecutor.

When talking with an advocate, they will discuss years of abuse they had suffered from the batterer. When talking with the prosecutor, they will often swear that their partner had never before laid a hand on them. This, said Mr. Brown, explains why it is that the experiences that prosecutors have with battered women are different from those that Shelter personnel have.

Furthermore, Mr. Brown stated that when it is impractical to have a separate unit for the prosecution of domestic violence, the prosecutor must have a policy that treats domestic violence as a crime, that the cases will be vigorously prosecuted, and that support services will be made available to the

Mr. Brown had little brief for mediation or diversion. Domestic violence is a crime, and should be so treated by the courts. A victim in a violent relationship is not in a position to bargain with the person who has abused her. The policy in Mr. Brown's unit is pro-prosecution because it does not revictimize the battered woman. In a criminal case, the state is the client, not the victim.

When the woman is reluctant to prosecute, Mr. Brown's department talks with her about their obligation to prosecute, their desire to protect her from further harm, and also the way domestic violence works. This is not just for her case, but is for the sake of all domestic violence cases.

Mr. Brown also believes that for a Crisis Center to have an advocate to go to court with the woman, as a sort of watch bird watching you, encourages those in charge of the case to be more careful in handling

The New Tax Laws:

Getting the Most From Home Improvements

The sweeping changes in our tax system created by the Tax Reform Act of 1986 (TRA '86), have left thousands of taxpayers wondering how the new rules are going to affect their pocket books.

While TRA '86 has closed many tax loopholes and time-honored concepts of taxation, one feature of our tax code that continues to benefit taxpayers is homeownership. It is after all the single largest investment that most of us will make in our lifetime.

The new tax laws also benefit homeowners who make improvements to their home. In fact, home improvements can be one of the most rewarding investments not only in terms of adding comfort and space, but from a fiscal point of view as well.

There are two major changes in the tax law that you should be aware of before you undertake any home improvements.

First, before the Tax Reform Act of 1986, interest you paid on personal loans and credit card finance charges were fully deductible. After 1990, the new law states that such interest expenses will not be deductible at all. For the interim, a gradual phase-out period has been enacted beginning in 1987, when only 65 percent can be

One alternative to help you pay for home improvements is the home equity loan, another interest category that is still fully deductible. You can actually turn the equity in your house into cash and write off the interest on your income tax using

Second, when you sell your home, major home improvements can be used to help reduce the amount of capital gains tax you will have to pay. An improvement is anything that adds to the value of your home or appreciably prolongs its life, such as improving the home's

Specific projects that count as home improvements include, upgrading the insulation levels in your attic, walls and crawl space, caulking, weather stripping, landscaping, room additions, installing timed thermostats, attic fans, cooling equipment, lighting fixtures, awnings, adding a deck or greenhouse, skylights, smoke detector or fire alarm system.

One extra benefit from major home improvements, not related to TRA '86 is that many improvements such as making the home more energy efficient, will actually add to the

value and selling price of your home. A recent study by Remodeling Contractor indicates that by upgrading the insulation levels in your home, you will boost its resale value and also get an estimated 83% return on your home improvement investment.

Note, though: The cost of ordinary repairs and maintenance designed to keep up with your house and grounds are not deductible. Do not confuse home maintenance with home improvements. Non-deductible projects include, repainting inside and outside the home, fixing the gutters or floors,

mending leaks or replastering. For all home improvement projects that you undertake, remember to keep accurate, detailed records of the work done. Cancelled checks, copies



of contracts, receipts from material purchases, and other similar documents should be kept in a special home improvement note book or file folder. These records are necessary for itemizing on your tax return and substantiating your expenses.

In order to maximize your benefits under the new law, it is important to understand how the tax changes affect you. The Texas-Oklahoma Panhandle Group of the National Association of Bank Woman hald its carried rangelands, pastures

Early spring is the time for Texas ranchers to examine rangelands and improved pastures for profitrobbing weeds, according to Dr. Tommy Welch, Extension range brush and weed control specialist.

Ample moisture in the winter and spring generally leads to heavy weed infestations as does overgrazing or other stress on pastures, Welch says. But other factors may play a role as well.

Without inspection and, if needed, appropriate control measures, ranchers stand to lose substantial forage to unwanted weeds. Through competition, weeds also reduce grass ground cover and allow more rainfall and soil to be lost through runoff, the Extension specialist says.

"As a rule of thumb, any time you have more than eight weed seedlings per square yard, they'll reduce grass production significantly," Welch says. Often several hundred weed seedlings may be counted in a square yard.

Most weeds can be controlled economically with an early spring application of herbicides, Welch says. "It depends on the weeds out there, but if herbicides are properly applied at the right time. 85 to 90 percent control is achiev-

Demonstrations consistently show a pound of grass produced for every pound of weeds controlled, the Extension specialist says.

Herbicides will be most effective

if sprayed when weeds are two to four inches tall and actively growing, usually mid-March to mid-April in Texas, Welch says.

Ranchers have several options in herbicides. "If you spray early enough and conditions are good, 2,4-D amine will control most weeds at the least cost," Welch says. If growth conditions are less than ideal, better results may be obtained by using one of the commercial herbicide mixtures, such as Grazon* P+D (1:4 mixture of picloram and 2,4-D and even more effective commercial herbicides may be necessary.

In addition to a slightly broader spectrum of weeds, commercial mixtures such as Grazon P+D and will do more damage to brush regrowth and seedlings than straight 2,4-D. Spraying nearly every year should help contain brush in pastures as well as control weeds, Welch says.

Good grazing management following weed control will allow ranchers to see the benefits not only in the same year as treatment but a year later, the Extension specialist says.

"There's usually enough weed seed in the soil that, if conditions are right, you'll have weeds again. But with a good grazing program, you can improve and maintain that grass cover so it will reduce the opportunity for weeds," Welch



Extension workshop for youth set

Saturday afternoon, from noon until 3 p.m. the Extension service will introduce counselors and youth leaders from across the Panhandle to a lesson series designed to help youth develop a healthy selfimage.
