## With \$116,415.20 total price bids . . . 1988 livestock show sets record

Another record setting Hansford county Junior Livestock Show and Sale wrapped up this past weekend with \$116,415.20 paid out by buyers -- over \$10,000 more than the \$106,059.90 for last year's show and sale and the largest ever recorded for the annual event.

Over 100 Hansford county 4-H and FFA youth had some 250 entries for the 1988 version of the show and sale which took place in the Hansford county barn in Gruver Friday and Saturday.

Quentin Harper's entry claimed the Grand Champion Steer award while Leslie Latta showed the Grand Champion Lamb and Derrick Schumann showed the Grand Champion Pig.

Harper's Grand Champion Steer brought the largest amount for any single animal at the sale with \$3,792.75 total price bid by the First National Bank of Perryton.

Latta's lamb brought \$1,032, bid by the First State Bank of Spearman and Schumann's grand champion pig brought \$956.25, bid by Gruver Equity.

Reserve championships were won by Lynette Williams for her lamb, Jennifer Burnam for her pig

and by Randie Renner for her steer.

Showmanship awards were given in all three divisions with Lynette Williams winning in lambs Lance Sparks in pigs and Lee Bob Harper in the steer division.

Placing second and third in lambs was Leslie Latta and Brent Wagner, respectively while Slavin Sparks was second and Laneida Burnam third in the pig division.

The steer division saw Deana Turner second in showmanship while Lynette Williams placed third there in that category.

Animal Husbandry awards were given by Hansford county Farm Bureau to Brandon Sutton of the Hansford county 4-H group while Spearman FFA winner there was Books Beck with Tony Setolo winning for the Gruver FFA.

In commercial steer judging, Wylee Maupin placed first, followed by Cody Pipkin in second and Wynn Maupin in third place.

Only the top 50 lambs, the top 50 pigs and 80 percent of the steers shown were eligible for bid at Saturday's sale.

## Races develop in city mayor, council election

Races in the May 7 city election developed this week with the additional filing of candidates for both the mayor's and council-member positions.

Burl Buchanan, a current city councilmember not up for election, filed for the mayor's seat and Lenix Simpson filed for one of the two positions open on the city council.

Filings for the two city offices and a pair of seats on the Spearman ISD board of trustees were open through close of business Wednesday.

The two school trustee positions had both incumbents file for reelection and, as of presstime at noon Wednesday, no race had developed there.

Incumbents for the three positions on the Spearman city council announced they would not seek reelection in 1988. These include mayor Ralph Blodgett and councilmembers Jim Nicholson and Ed Garner.

Races for those positions developed this week with the two filings Tuesday. Buchanan will face Bob Pearson in the mayoral election while Simpson will face Bob Boxwell and Donald E. Reed who filed earlier.

Buchanan is in his third term as a city councilman, having completed five years service there.

Simpson is employed at B&B Farm Industries where he serves as manager of operations of the firms oil and gas division.

Election to the city council is by plurality rather than majority with the top two vote getters being elected to fill the two vacancies.

Current school board president Mike Garnett, along with board member Joe Clement are the only two who had filed for those positions for the upcoming May 7 elections as of presstime Wednesday.

Should races develop there, election is also by plurality.

## Gruver hosts district contests . . .

## Over 200 expected for UIL meet

Some 200-plus entries from the 7-school 1-AA district will be in Gruver this week to take part in the 3-day Spring UIL Literary Meet -- a meet which has been dominated by this Hansford county community for the past four years.

Literary teams from Gruver, Spearman, West Texas Consolidated, Highland Park, White Deer, Panhandle and Stratford will be competing in the 3-day literary

meet which begins today (Thursday) with a ready writing contest at 4 p.m.

Judges for the events will be from Panhandle State University at Goodwell, Ok., and from West Texas State University in Canyon.

Individual medals of gold, silver and bronze will be awarded for the first three places in each event while pink, yellow and green ribbons will be awarded respectively for fourth through sixth place.

An overall team trophy will be awarded to the top three schools in the UIL literary competition.

Gruver -- despite the move from 1-A to 1-AA -- has won the district literary events for the past four years and are expected to be strong again this year.

The bulk of the competition will be held Friday and Saturday with events beginning Friday at 2 p.m. and at 9 a.m. on Saturday.

Friday's contests will open with editorial writing at 2 o'clock that afternoon. In addition, prose interpretation, poetry interpretation, and accounting will also run off at that time.

At 3 p.m., news writing competition will be held, followed at 4 o'clock by feature writing, informative speaking and persuasive speaking.

The day's competition winds up with headline writing and literary criticism events at 5 p.m.

## Postal rate increase set for April 3

The new 25 cent postage stamp is official and will go into effect April 3 following approval Tuesday by the federal Postal Rate Commission.

The new first class rate calls for an increase of three cents on both the first and each additional ounce. Current rates are 22 cents for the first ounce and 17 cents for each additional ounce. The new rates will be 25 cents and 20 cents for each additional ounce.

A wide range of new rates will go into effect as well with the largest increase coming in third class or bulk mailing rates.

These rates will increase anywhere from 21.7 percent to slightly over 32 percent.

Standard third class mailings will go from 12.5 to 16.5 cents while the cheapest postage rate -- carrier route pre-sort -- will increase from 8.3 cents to 10.1 cents.

This is the first increase in postage in three years.

The new series E stamp will go on sale March 23. Post offices will also have an ample supply of three cents stamps for the interim.

## At cost of \$30,634.14 . . . City awards seal coating contract

Spearman city councilmembers awarded a trio of contracts -- including a \$30,000-plus seal coating project -- in addition to several other items on their agenda at their regular meeting Tuesday evening at Spearman city hall.

The bid on the seal coating project was awarded to the E.D. Baker Corporation of Borger when apparent low bidder Hi-Plains

Sand of Kanopolis, Kan. received a poo: recommendation from the state of Texas.

Hi-Plains bid was for \$30,372.87 while E.D. Baker's was for \$30,634.14.

The poor recommendation was discovered by Dwight Brandt, city engineer in a routine check of references. Hi-Plains was cited for lack of proper equipment to do the job.

The other bids awarded were for uniforms and walk on mats used by the city employees and in city buildings.

Amarillo Industrial Services received the uniform bid at a price of \$7,321.20. Other bids here were \$8,601.70 from Perryton Laundry and Uniform; \$8,922 from Texas Industrial; and \$8,907.50

from Western Uniform and Towel Service.

The mat bid was awarded to Perryton Laundry and Uniform at a price of \$1,040. Other bids included Amarillo Industrial at \$1,118; Texas Industrial at \$1,300 and Western Uniform at \$1,248 for first line and \$1,040 for trim line.

Helen Etter was named election judge for the May 7 city elections with Marsha Kuehl as alternate judge. They also approved the hiring of three clerks.

A special presentation was made by a group representing the Hide Out Teen Center, led by Families in Action president Gary Ellsworth.

City councilmembers also approved a special grant application for participation from the State of Texas Criminal Justice Program to

split cloths on a \$4,720 software program for the police department.

Lynx and Lynxette Booster Club president John Crawford, along with his wife, Hester Sue and Spearman athletic director Don Mullins presented a request to city councilmembers to consider helping with a special summer leadership program to be initiated this summer.

The city council was unable to take any action on the request for \$3,000 to \$4,000 in start up expenses which are expected by the group since the request was not a formal agenda item.

The group was told, however, by Spearman mayor Ralph Blodgett that funds would be available, both from the private and public sector to help with the program.

## City receives favorable mark in gas report

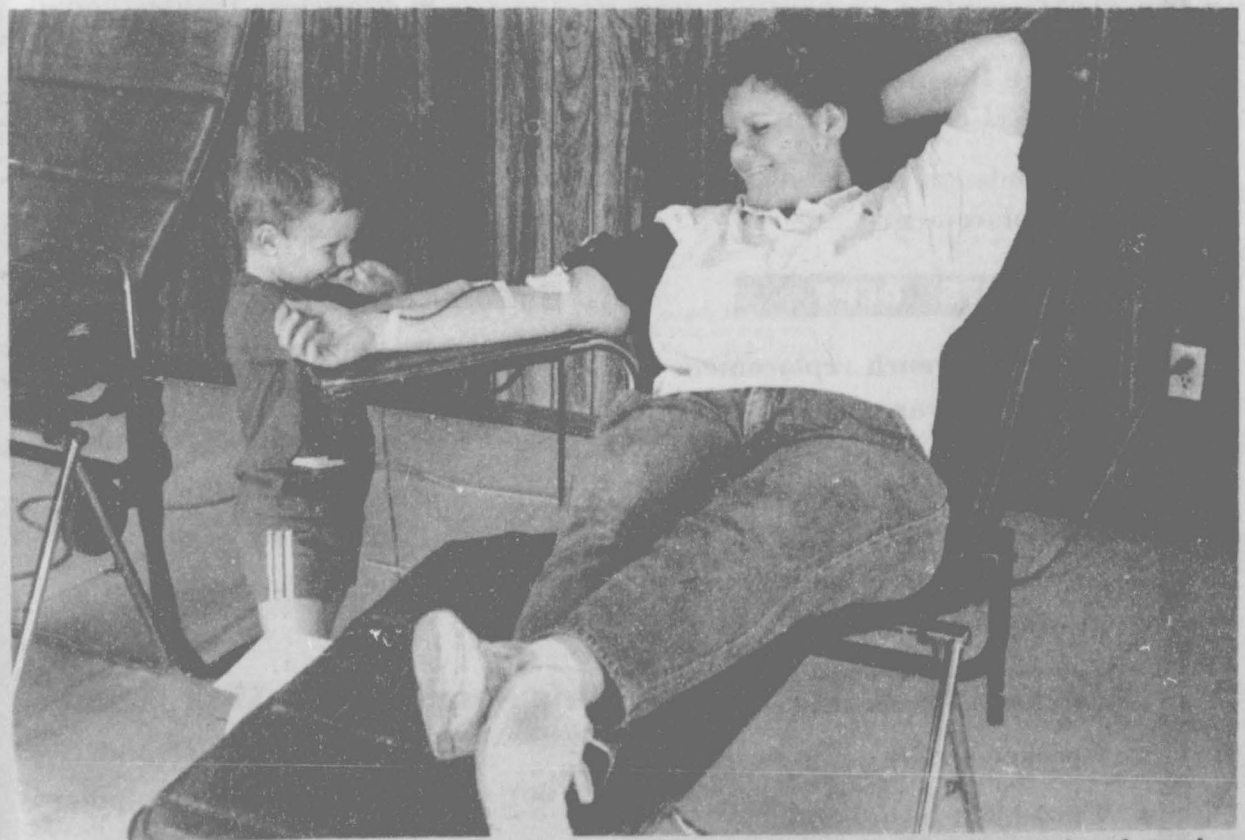
Insurance rates for the city of Spearman may be slightly better in the future city manager Jim Murray informed city councilmembers Tuesday evening, in large part due to a resurvey of the city's utility system by an independent analytical research firm.

The firm -- Analytical Petroleum Research of Houston -- rated the city in four different categories and gave them an overall rating of Good in the survey.

The scale used by the firm rates different aspects from 1 to 5 with one being the highest risk for insurers and five being the lowest risk.

Spearman was given a 4.5 for documents and records, a 3.0 for safety and training, a 4.0 for general operations practices and procedures, and a 4.5 unaccounted for natural gas.

The overall rating was a 4.0 or, Good, on the 1 to 5 scale. The scale utilized by the firm notes that 2 is minimal compliance level, a 3 is average, a 4 is noted as good.

## SVFD, police investigate blaze

The fire completely destroyed a shed in the back yard of a residence owned by Edwin Pearcy, 317 Hazelwood in Spearman.

In addition to the shed and its content, the fence was destroyed and a large portion of the yard was burned as well.

Pearcy's neighbor, Sam Wyson, 319 Hazelwood, had a portion of his fence and yard burned as well.

The fire was reported to the Spearman police at 1:49 p.m.

Monday by Calistro Vela. Vela had noticed the smoke while driving past the area and made the report.

A pumper unit from the Spearman Volunteer Fire Department along with several members of the SVFD answered the alarm and the fire was under control by 2:09 p.m.

No estimation of damages was available.

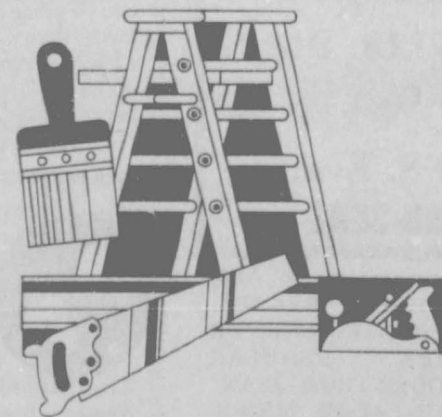
