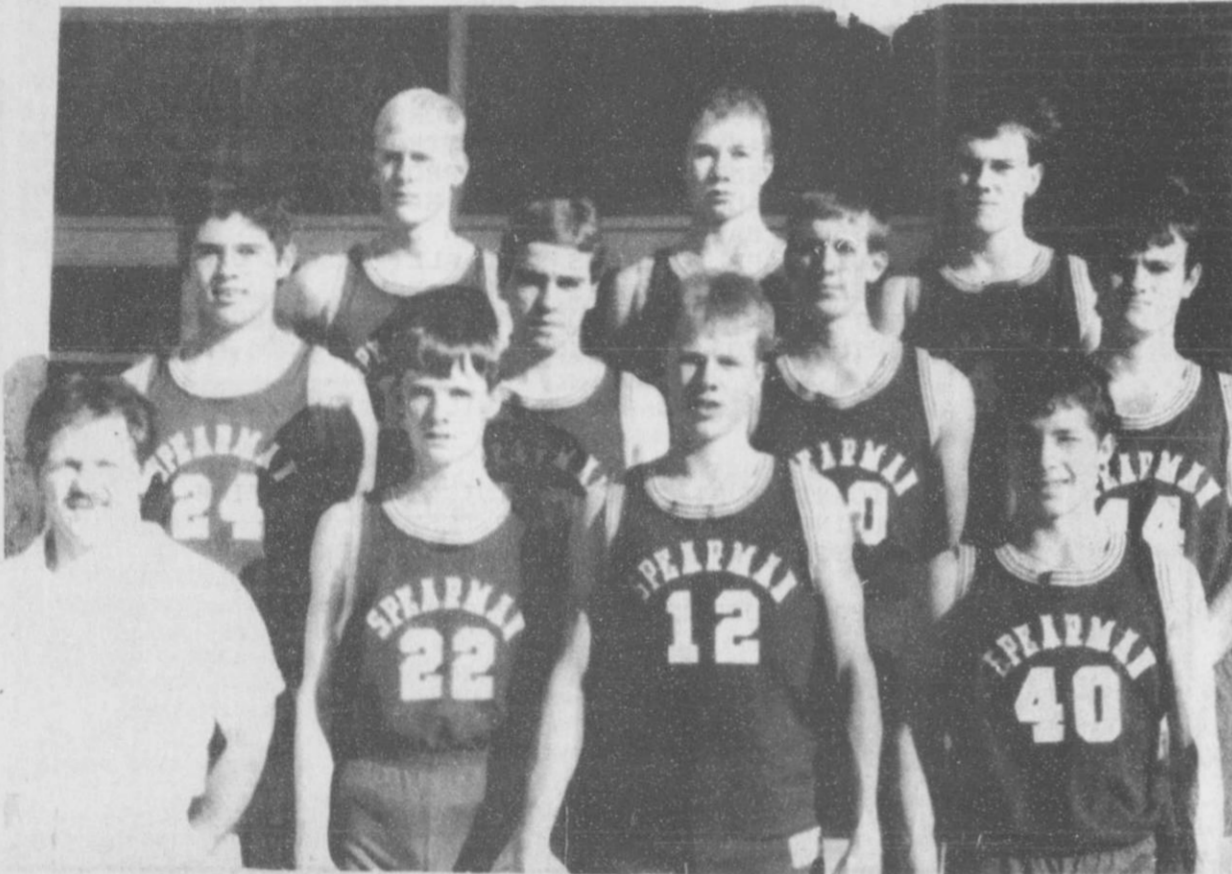

Lynx defeat Rangers to win Championship

The Lynx played Perryton in the finals Saturday evening, December 6 of the Spearman Tournament.

The first quarter, the Lynx trailed 6 to 12, making three field goals to Perryton's six field goals.

The second quarter, the Lynx scored seven field goals and all four free throws to Perryton's seven field goals and none of one free throws, but the Lynx still trailed 24 to 26 at half time.

The third quarter, the Lynx took the lead with five field goals, while hoding Perryton to only three field goals and a miss on their only free throw. Third quarter score was Spearman 34, Perryton 32.

The final quarter, the Lynx scored seven field goals but missed all four free throws. Perryton scored six field goals and two of three free throws. The Lynx won the tournament with a final score of Spearman 48, Perryton 46.

The Championship game of the Spearman Tournament was played Saturday evening December 6, the Varsity Lynxettes and the Canadian Wildcats.

The first quarter, the Lynxettes scored three field goals and all four free throws, while Canadian scored six field goals and one of four free throws. First quarter score was Spearman 10, Canadian 13.

The second quarter, the Lynxettes scored only two field goals and seven of nine free throws to Canadian's five field goals and eight of eleven free throws. Half time score was Spearman 21, Canadian 31.

During the third quarter of play, the Lynxettes scored six field goals and four of eight free throws to Canadian's five field goals. Third quarter score was Spearman 37, Canadian 41.

During the final period of play, the Lynxettes scored two field and two fo four free throws, while Canadian scored two field goals and one of three free throws. The Lynxettes finished the tournament in second place with a loss to Canadian 43 to 46.

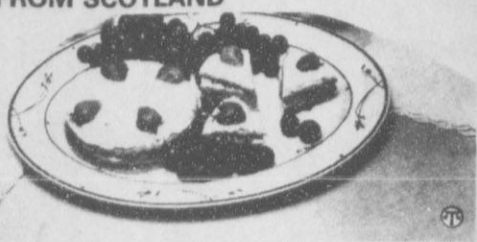

Tis The Season...To Safeguard Your Money

It's the holiday shopping season and everybody is engaged in the annual holiday rush at the stores. However, because shoppers often carry more money at this time of year, the pickpockets and thieves are also taking their places in the crowd. So, here are some steps to follow in order to safeguard your belongings when shopping.



If you see a sign saying "Beware of Pickpockets," DON'T check your wallet. That tells the thieves which pocket to pick.

1. Men should carry their wallets in the front trouser pocket. For extra protection, you might consider wrapping your wallet in a rubber band. This creates a friction that is very easy to detect if anyone tries to lift your wallet.

2. Women should keep handbags in front of them with the clasp or flap toward their body.

3. Minimize the amount of cash you carry. Try using travelers cheques for your holiday shopping instead. They are as good as cash and can be replaced if lost or stolen.

4. If you see a "Beware of Pickpockets" sign, DON'T check your wallet. The sign might have been put there by pickpockets themselves and by checking your wallet, you signal where to look first.

5. Keep your wits about you in crowded places. If you're bumped or jostled, drop your arms and turn around quickly to break contact with a possible pickpocket.

6. If you go to a restaurant to eat while shopping, do not put your purse on the floor or
