Dear Editor:
Congressmen are destroying our freedoms through their tightening
down of the serews down of the screws on American
individualism and accomplish ments, through the wrecking of Constitutional Common Laws of Biblical origin.
On M ay 26,1 On May 26, 1987, Justices of the
Supreme Court informed the Supreme Court informed the nation
that "we are now living in a police state." It is quite a political revelation to read in detail the
Supreme Court Opinions Supreme Court Opinions on the
May 26 preventative detention May 26 preventative detention
case. I say opinions because there case. I say opinions because there
were three of them: the majority were three of them: the majority
opinion endorsing preventitive detention (representing the view of
six justices), six justices); and two separate dis
senting opinions opposing it (rep resenting the view of the other three justices). Although the massive stone lettering above the
entrance to the Supreme entrance to the Supreme Court
says "equal justice under law" says "equal justice under law",
justice is, in fact, becoming in creasingly uncommon in such high locations.
The preventitive detention case
called into called into question the constitu
tionality of the 1984 Bail Reform Act (18U.S.C. 3141 et seq) which passed the U.S. Senate by an
overwhelming 96 to 1 vet Since overwhelming 96 to 1 vote. Since
its passage, approximately 7,000 its passage, approximately 7,000
individuals have been held withou bail under the "preventive detention" sections of the Act because the government claimed they rep
resented a future danger to society resented a future danger to society.
This number is likely to grow; and This number argely so is pleargaining, because (for tactical reasons) overworked prose cutors are using the threat of no bail against arrestees to gain their
"cooperation". The message is cooperation. The message thought. Arrest is given the weight of irrefutable evidence and convic tion under this corrupt scheme.
What this means is that government claims as "future government claims as "uture
threats" to society (i.e. patriotic Christians, so-called "tax protesters," so called "right-wing ex tremists." etc.) are to be held
without bail and in many cases held
