

With 59-51 playoff win over Stratford . . .

# Spearman Lynx capture district 1-AA title

A tenacious Spearman Lynx cager crew overcome a 5-point deficit to pop in 18 points in just over three minutes and claim the district 1-AA boys basketball crown over the Stratford Elks 59-51, this past Friday evening in Dumas.

That win propelled the Lynx into the prestigious 1-AA throne room and gave Spearman boys their first district title in basketball since the 1976 squad gained regionals.

This season wound up a jumble at the end of district play with Highland Park, Stratford and Spearman finished with identical records of 8-4 each.

A special playoff saw the Hornets knocked off by Stratford last Thursday and that set the stage for Friday's district championship tilt. Things opened up doubtful for

the Lynx when -- in the first four minutes of play -- they managed only one field goal and two grace shots to trail by a 10-4 count.

Then the Lynx came alive, hitting for 12 points while Stratford managed only two and Spearman went into the second frame in control of a 16-12 score.

The Elks managed to stay fairly even with Spearman throughout the second quarter, but the Lynx did manage to up their lead to six points and they held the long end of a 31-25 halftime scoreboard.

Action in the third period of play was slow to develop for the Lynx again as they managed only two field goals during the entire eight minutes.

To that they added three charity shots, but meanwhile, Stratford

had stolen the lead and the momentum and held a 40-38 advantage going into the final eight minutes of play.

With 3:16 remaining in the game, the Elks held a 46-41 edge, but the Lynx converted 11 of 15 free throws in those final few minutes, added three field goals -- one of those a 3-pointer -- to take the 59-51.

A 3-point jumper from the far left corner by Brett Davis tied the game with 1:26 left to play, the score at 46-ALL.

Just 21 seconds later, Carl Urban found the bucket to put the Lynx in the lead for good with the score at 48-46.

From that point on, it was Spearman to the free throw line as the Elks tried desperately to get

the ball, fouling Spearman players in the process.


In the final minute of action, Stratford managed only two field goals -- their final points coming off a game-ending 3-point shot from mid-court by Dirk Davis gave the Elks their 51 points.

Prior to that, the Lynx were in firm command of a 59-48 lead. Davis' shot gave the Elks small consolation for their district title loss to the Lynx.

Urban led all scorers with 17 points, hitting on five field goals -- one of those a 3-pointer -- and six free throws.

Also in double figures for Spearman was Brett Davis with 13 points which include three field goals -- two of them 3-pointers -- and five

## Cudd, McFarlin earn C-of-C honors

Mike Cudd was recognized as Citizen of the Year and Hansford County sheriff, R.L. McFarlin, was named as Citizen Over the Years at the 1988 annual Spearman Chamber of Commerce Banquet Saturday evening.

Cudd came to Spearman in 1976 and is a past-president of the Spearman chamber group.

He currently serves on the Spearman city council and is a director of the chamber as well.

Active in the Spearman Jaycees, Cudd was instrumental in reactivating the group in Spearman, serving as president there for 18 months.

"The Spearman chamber would surely have a large hole in its ranks without the many contributions of both time and effort that Mike has made during his years in Spearman," Janie Kunselman -- the 1986 recipient -- states in awarding this year's honor to Cudd.

The 1987 Citizen Over the Years award was presented to McFarlin

by Betty Jean Davis, the 1986 honoree.

McFarlin has served as Hansford County sheriff since September, 1973, when he was appointed to fill an unexpired term. That office was left vacant by the death of then sheriff J.B. Cooke.

Prior to that, McFarlin had served as a deputy, moving to Hansford County in 1966.

Named as the Women's Division Member of the Year was out-going president Helen Melton.

A Spearman businesswoman for the past 18 years, she has been active in both the chamber of commerce and various civic groups as well.

She currently serves as president of the Spearman Music Booster's group and is a member of the Spearman Lynx and Lynxettes Athletic Booster organization.

## Lynxettes bow out to Shallowater

A pair of last-second heroics by veteran playoff contenders Shallowater Fillies proved the undoing of the Spearman Lynxettes Tuesday evening in Canyon as the Spearman girls bowed out to Shallowater in an edge-of-the-seat overtime thriller, 44-43.

This was the third trip for the Fillies to the area playoff contests and their first area win.

For the Lynxettes, the only veteran on the starting line up was class A All Stater Krista Kirkland, a junior standout among a crew of junior class performers.

Tuesday evening, the Fillies took an early lead, but a tenacious pack of Lynxettes slowly wore down the veteran Shallowater crew, edging closer and closer as the game wore on.

It appeared as if the Spearman girls might have the game in hand when Kirkland hit the top end of a

one-and-one free throw to boost the Lynxettes to a 42-40 lead with 13 seconds left in regulation play.

But a rebound by Kirkland under the Fillies bucket and an ensuing free-for-all that referees finally called a jump ball, gave Shallowater the ball out-of-bounds with one second left to play.

The toss in bounds went to Fillies' standout performer, Johnna Pointer who sank the bucket as the buzzer sounded to knot the game at 42-ALL and to send the contest into overtime.

A lone field goal by Shallowater's Dee Dee Moore in the first

minute of overtime play provided the Fillies with just enough to win as the Lynxettes succumbed to the pressure of the playoff situation.

Spearman was able to convert only one of four overtime free throw attempts.

The loss ends the Lynxettes season with a 27-3 record, but -- more importantly -- provides a solid base of experience for a crew who will return intact next season.


High point for Spearman in Tuesday's area playoff game was Kirkland with 15. Heather Murrell

## State ruling may half life of Spearman land fill site

Spearman city councilmembers were apprised of a ruling from the Texas Department of Health which will ban open pit burning at the city's landfill and, effectively cut the life of the city's waste disposal land by more than 50 percent.

City manager Jim Murray informed the city of a letter from the TDH which calls for a cessation of all open pit burning in Texas by Aug. 31, 1989.

Spearman currently has just under 30 acres of land on contract adjacent to the existing land fill area which will be purchased as soon as the TDH grants a permit. That is expected in late August or early September according to Murray.

The addition to the city's landfill area was expected to add at least 60 years to the life of the landfill, but the city manager informed the city council Tuesday evening that the ban on open pit burning could cut that life expectancy down to between 20 and 30 years.

The council discussed several options and instructed Murray to ask for added participation from Hansford County in the digging of pits at the landfill and to look into the purchase of a used compactor to be utilized at the city waste disposal site.

Currently, the city landfill is available to county residents at no charge and is open on a 24-hour, 7-day a week schedule.

In other action at Tuesday evening's city council meeting, city fathers approved a resolution to bring city personnel policies in line with recent federal rulings and new state regulations.

They also approved a contract with an Amarillo engineer for the 1988 seal coating at a price of \$3,200. That is down from last year's cost of \$3,400.

A \$5 per drill fee to members of the Spearman Volunteer Fire Department, up to a maximum of \$10 per member per month was also approved by the council.

And Murray was instructed to seek quotes on a swimming pool heater for the city pool to replace one which broke down.

## Filings made for mayor, school board positions

A former Spearman city councilman, Bob Pearson, opened filings for the Spearman city council this week when he filed for the mayor's spot Monday afternoon.

Two councilmember positions remain open on the city with both incumbents indicating they will not seek re-election to those posts.

Spearman ISD trustees Joe Clement and Mike Garnett who earlier indicated they would seek re-election to their posts, made those intentions formal when they filed at the school business office this week.

the city or school offices open to election this May had surfaced at presstime Wednesday.

Pearson, a Spearman oil and gas attorney, has previous experience on the city council, having served two terms as a councilmember from 1980 through 1984.

## Chamber offers Junior show, special ID tags sale slated March 18-19

Identification tags which can be sewn onto articles of clothing or tennis shoes to help identify children are available at the Spearman Chamber of Commerce to area residents.

A project of the Women's Division of the chamber, the special Lifesaver ID tags have lines for the child's name, address, phone number as well as for medical information.

The tag also has a special medical release parents may sign which would enable physicians to give emergency treatment only in case of an accident.

"We're doing this in cooperation with Lifesaver, a non-profit organization which works with other organizations to help identify and protect our children," notes Vickie Genn, spokesperson for the WDSOC.

Only a limited number of tags are available. These can be picked up at the Spearman Chamber of Commerce located at 211 Main in Spearman.

The 1988 Hansford County Junior Livestock show and sale is scheduled for March 18 and 19 in the Hansford County barn at Gruver, announces Burt Williams, Hansford County extension agent.

In addition to the show and sale, a judging contest open to area judging teams will also be held during the 2-day affair.

Some 150 to 175 Hansford County youth are expected for the annual event with approximately 250 head of lambs, hogs and steers to go through the show ring, notes Williams.

"We generally have about 120 hogs, 100 lambs and 30 steers at the show," he observes. "The judging contest appears to be fairly popular as well."

Last year, Williams reports that some 40 judging teams from across the area competed in the contest.





