

# SHS 1-Act play in public performance March 20

Christa Sims, another performer in her third UIL play performance, will act the part of the Woman in the Audience.

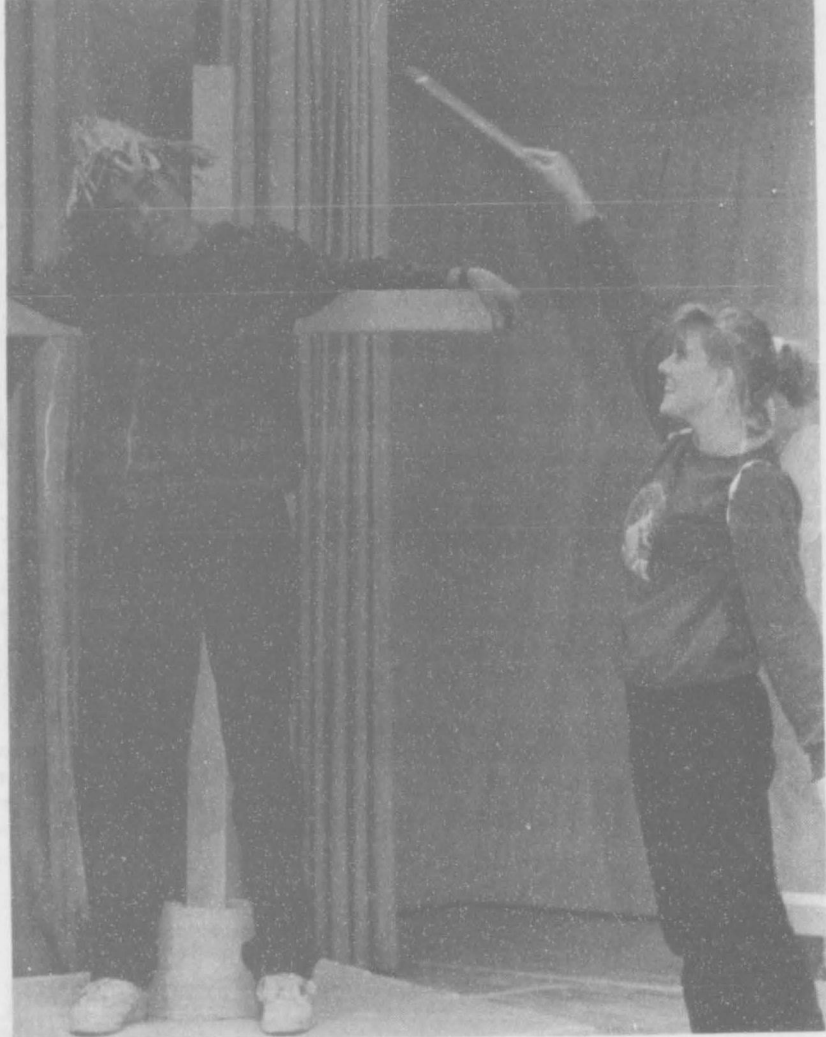

## Hansford voters show intentions

Democrat John LaGrone easily outdistanced opponent Vance Jones for his party's nomination as 84th District Attorney on the strength of a strong vote from Hutchinson county while in the Republican contest for that office, incumbent Gene Compton lost his bid for re-election, but a runoff between vote leader Stephen F. "Steve" Cross and Phil Black will be held April 12 to decide the Republican candidate.

The district attorney's race was the most highly contested local race on either primary ballot in Hansford county during Tuesday's election.

The only other race of local

interest saw incumbent B.J. Renner win the Democratic nomination for the county commissioner of precinct three over challenger Don Evans.

Renner received 121 votes while Evans received 66. There is no Republican candidate for that office, so Renner will be unopposed in November.

In the district attorney's race, Hansford county's vote helped to eliminate Compton from the running as Hutchinson county voting was almost neck-and-neck for the three men running on the Republican ticket.

In Hutchinson county, Cross pulled 1117 votes while Compton garnered 1055 and Black 994.

But the incumbent, Compton, carried only 94 votes in Hansford county to give him a total vote of 1,149. Cross carried the county with 400 votes to put his total at 1,517 and Black has 222 Hansford

county votes for a total of 1,216.

Since none of the candidates received more than 50 percent of the vote, a runoff between Black and Cross will decide the Republican candidate for 84th District Attorney.

For the first time ever, more Republicans than Democrats voted in Hansford county with 796 Republican ballots cast against 651 Democratic ballots.

A total of 1,447 ballots were marked Tuesday, for a total vote turnout of 42.5 percent of eligible Hansford county voters. There are 3,404 registered voters in Hansford county.

Of those voting, 55 percent voted in the Republican primary.

Hansford county Democrats rallied behind Tennessee senator Al Gore who received 208 votes, just ahead of Dick Gephardt with 177. Michael Dukakis pulled 111 votes.

Gary Hart came in with 52 votes while Jesse Jackson pulled 21 to round out the top vote getters for president in the county.

Bill Sarpalius garnered the most votes in Hansford county for US Representative of the 13th congressional district with 345. Ed Lehman, Vernon, pulled 157 while Randy Hollums had 117.

Veteran U.S. Senator Lloyd Bentsen was an easy winner over challenger Joe Sullivan in Hansford county as in the rest of Texas with Bentsen taking 481 votes to Sullivan's 129.

The Hansford county vote for State Senator, district 31, pretty well followed the rest of the area with Mel Phillips receiving 249 votes, Bryan Poff, 205, and Nancy Garms, 125.

On the Republican ticket, Hansford county voters strongly endorsed. See "VOTERS" p-2

### THE HANSFORD REPORT

For those who go and vote, it seems an easy enough task. Those who work the elections and have that behind-the-scenes experience know better, however.

The county clerk's office here in Hansford closed up shop at 12:30 a.m. Wednesday. For those like me who often get confused over the a.m.-p.m. method, that's known as midnight-30.

Over in Hutchinson county, they still had a precinct out as of 3:45 a.m. Wednesday morning. I don't know it for a fact, but I suspect there were a few cots unfolded in the county clerk's office there.

The hold up came from the Republican camp which wound up pulling many more voters than they had expected. That happened here in Hansford county and across the state as more and more conservatives moved over to the Republican primary.

Perhaps that explains how a liberal Democrat such as Michael Dukakis could carry the conservative state of Texas.

There were a few surprises in the Texas primary -- both on the Republican and Democratic side. Those surprises were split almost equally between amazement over who lost and consternation over who won what and where.

But, that's the way it is in elections.

Now we've got a bunch of runoffs to contend with -- and there will be runoffs in both the Democratic primary and the Republican primary.

We've already been asked if a person were to register now, could they vote in the runoff. The answer is yes, if you will register by March 13. You may vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary runoff if you did not vote in either primary election this past Tuesday.

However, if you did vote, there are a couple of rules you will have to follow.

Those eligible to vote in the Democratic primary runoff are those who did not vote at all or those who did vote and voted in the Democratic primary.

Those eligible for the Republican runoff are those who did not vote at all or those who voted in the Republican primary.

If you did vote, you may not crossover in the runoff. If you voted Democratic, you must vote in the Democratic runoff and the same goes for Republicans in the Republican runoff.

The runoff will be held on Tuesday, April 12 in Hansford county and across the state of Texas.

In Hansford county, there are 796 Republicans eligible to vote in the Republican runoff and 651 Democrats eligible to vote in the Democratic runoff.

Remember, if you did not vote in the primary, you may vote in either runoff. If you voted Democratic, you may not vote in the Republican runoff. If you voted Republican, you may not vote in the Democratic runoff.

What's really sad about the entire situation, is that right here in Hansford county only 42.5 percent of those eligible to vote actually exercised that freedom.

There's only two good excuses for not voting -- one is sickness, the other is death. If you did not have one of those two excuses, then there was absolutely no reason for you not to vote.

However, if you think those figures are low, wait until you see the runoff voting totals. Those who exercised their right this past Tuesday will stay away in droves and only a handful will decide this one.

That's even sadder than the scenario above.

I may be the only one in Hansford county with a twisted sense of humor. Probably not, but I'll take the blame anyway.

Those who voted in the Republican primary got a chance to voice their opinion on whether English should be the official language of both the United States and Texas.

My first question is -- isn't Texas a part of the United States? Why was it written as "both the United States and Texas"?

If it had said the United States or Texas, it would have been more grammatically correct, but then you'd have had to have two separate votes -- one for the United States and another for Texas, both for or against.

An item I found particularly ironic was the fact that the proposition was printed quite plainly on the ballot -- in both English and Spanish.

Naturally, that's a requirement of the Texas Election Code that all ballots be in both English and Spanish.

But you have to admit, when you're asking opinions about English being the official language --

### Gruver youth has Houston grand champ

After a long and careful analysis of the top three steers by the judge, 11-year-old Lee Bob Harper was awarded the Champion Shorthorn Junior Market Steer banner at the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo today.

Lee Bob's 1,034-pound steer, "Spuds," placed first in the light weight division earlier in the show. He is the son of Tony and Lee Harper of Gruver and is a member of the Hansford County 4-H club. Lee Bob has shown livestock at the Houston Show three out of the four years has been involved in 4-H.

"I am so happy," Lee Bob said. "I can't believe I did so well."

Lee Bob's mother, with tears in her eyes, said, "Winning here today makes all the hard work and hours worth it."

Lee Bob attends Gruver Junior High School and plans to continue showing steers in the future.

Judge Harlan Ritchie of East Lansing, Mich., said the Champion Shorthorn was an especially good steer.

"This steer is correctly finished," Harlan said, adding that he had the best muscle combination of any steer in the Shorthorn show.

In the heavy weight class, Jay Long, Allen FFA, exhibited the first place steer. Quentin Harper, brother of Lee Bob and member of the Hansford County 4-H, showed the second place heavy weight steer.

The 6-man race for the Republican nomination for U.S. Representative in the 13th congressional district saw the Hansford county nod go to Bob Price with 264 votes.

Second was Chip Staniswalis with 159, followed by Jim Brandon with 149. Larry Milner received 135 votes while Ron Buffum gained 30 and Alan Pickering, 28.

In the Republican race for 31st State Senator, Amarillo oil/cattleman Teel Bivins was a handy winner in Hansford county, getting 562 votes to Ron Slover's 187.

## Contracts on HCHD agenda

The approval of a pair of contracts heads up the Hansford Hospital District's regular monthly meeting Thursday evening, with board members to consider a new physicians contract along with renewal of the hospital administrator's contract.

A contract with Dr. Lawrence Behney of Kansas will be considered by the board along with a new contract with current hospital administrator, Al La Rochelle.

In other business, the board will discuss the possible sale of land currently owned by the district in Spearman, along with hearing a report from Hansford County Appraisal District's Alice Peddy on the 1986-87 audit of the appraisal district.

The board may elect to go into an executive session in order to discuss the administrator's contract.

## DECLARACION PARA IMPUESTOS SOBRE LA PROPIEDAD

31 Thursday March 1988

LE AYUDA A PROTEGER SUS DERECHOS COMO CONTRIBUYENTE

Una declaración (rendition) es un reporte al distrito de valoración que enumera todas las pertenencias que usted tiene o controla a partir del primero de enero de 1988 sobre las cuales se pueden cobrar impuestos. Si usted lo desea, puede presentar lo que en su opinión es el valor de su propiedad.

Usted debe presentar una declaración si es dueño de bienes muebles tangibles (tangible personal property) que son usados para producir ingresos tales como la maquinaria y otro equipo usado por una empresa.

El distrito de valoración puede exigir a cualquier contribuyente que entregue una declaración notificándole por escrito y enviándole un formulario para hacer su declaración.

Tal vez usted quiera presentar una declaración, aun si no se le exige, para proteger sus derechos como contribuyente.

Usted puede indicar cual es su dirección correcta para que sus cuentas de impuestos sean enviadas a la dirección correcta. Si su cuenta es enviada a una dirección incorrecta, la ley aún lo hace responsable de que pague sus impuestos a tiempo o que pague cargos extra por hacer pagos tardíos.

Usted puede establecer lo que en su opinión es el valor de su propiedad ante el distrito de valoración. Si el distrito impone un valor más alto sobre su propiedad le debe de notificar por escrito de esa valoración más alta y le debe de explicar como puede protestar esa valoración ante la junta de revisión de valoración.

Entregando un tipo especial de declaración llamado *reporte de valor decreciente*, usted puede notificar al distrito de valoración de daños graves que le ocurrieron a su propiedad en 1987. El distrito envía a alguien para que verifique los daños y se tome en cuenta para cuando se le asigne valor a su propiedad para 1988.

Presente su declaración en las oficinas de su distrito de valoración local en la dirección citada abajo. Ahí encontrará los formularios que usted necesita.

El plazo para presentar su declaración para 1988 es el 31 de marzo. Usted puede recibir 30 días adicionales si lo pide por escrito antes del 31 de marzo.

Para más información pida una copia gratis del folleto *Los Derechos, Remedios y Responsabilidades del Contribuyente de Impuestos*, en la oficina del distrito de valoración o puede pedirlo del Consejo Estatal de Impuestos sobre la Propiedad (State Property Tax Board) en Austin

He has been interested in English evangelism in Japan and has traveled to several mission fields.

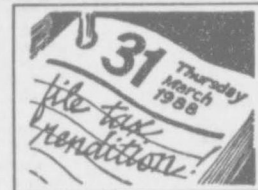
During this service, Faith Promise Pledge will be taken. An all-church covered-dish luncheon will follow the service and will close the conference.

## PROPERTY TAX RENDITIONS



### HELP YOU PROTECT YOUR RIGHTS AS A TAXPAYER

A rendition is a report to the appraisal district that lists all the taxable property you own or control on January 1, 1988. You may also give your opinion of the property's value, if you wish.

You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property used to produce income—such as the machinery and equipment used by a business.

The appraisal district may require any taxpayer to file a rendition by sending the taxpayer a written notice and a rendition form.

You may want to file a rendition, even if you aren't required to file, to preserve some of your rights as a taxpayer:

- You put your correct mailing address on record so your tax bills will go to the right address. If your bill is mailed to the wrong address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or paying extra charges for late payments.
- You can put your own opinion of your property's value on record.

If the appraisal district then places a higher value on your property, it must notify you in writing of the higher value and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.

By filing a special type of rendition called a report of decreased value, you can notify the appraisal district of significant damage to your property that occurred in 1987. The district will send someone to verify the damage and take it into account when assigning a 1988 value to your property.

File renditions with your local appraisal district at the address shown below. Forms are available there.

The deadline for 1988 renditions is March 31. You can get an extra 30 days if you ask for it in writing before the March 31 deadline.

# Tax reform act makes changes for farmers

The Tax Reform Act made some changes in how farmers and ranchers deduct expenses for installing conservation measures.

Producers who want to claim a deduction for the cost of a conservation practice on their 1987 income tax returns need to make certain that the practice is listed in the county plan or that they have a site specific plan.

They will also need to complete Internal Revenue Service form 8645 "Soil and Water Conservation Plan Certification" to file with their return.

Management practices such as fencing, brush management, and range seeding are listed in the county plan. For such practices, a dated site specific plan is not necessary. However, practices that

require technical design and layout such as terraces, waterways and diversions need to be in a site specific plan.

Copies of the county plan and IRS form 8645 are available at the Soil Conservation Service office at 505 W. 11th in Spearman. Producers who use this form certify that soil and water conservation expenses paid or incurred after December 31, 1986 were made according to a plan approved by SCS.

A site specific plan can be developed by SCS personnel but the plan cannot be back-dated to permit claiming a deduction for previously applied practices.

For further information, producers should talk to their tax consultant.

the handling of emergency vehicles during emergency situations.

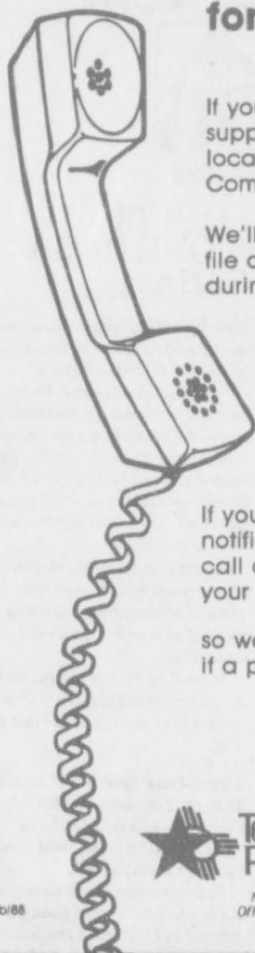
Then, on March 24, a meteorologist from KVII-TV in Amarillo will address Hansford county weather watchers.

## HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS



CAN LOWER THE PROPERTY TAXES ON YOUR HOME

A homestead exemption lowers the property taxes on your home by lowering its taxable value. For example, if your home is valued at \$50,000 and you receive a \$5,000 homestead exemption, your home will be taxed as if it were worth only \$45,000.

You qualify for a homestead exemption if you owned your home on January 1 and used it as your primary residence on January 1. It doesn't matter whether your home is a house, a condominium or a mobile home.

Exemptions are available to all homeowners to lower their school taxes. Additional exemptions are available to homeowners who are disabled or age 65 and over. Other exemptions may be offered to homeowners by school districts, counties, cities, and special districts. All taxing units offer exemptions to disabled veterans.

Apply to your local appraisal district office at the address shown below for all exemptions you may qualify for. Application forms are available there.

If you received a homestead exemption on your present home in 1987, you won't need to apply again for 1988 unless your chief appraiser requires you to reapply.

However, if you became 65 or disabled before January 1, file a new application to receive the additional exemptions.

If you haven't received an exemption on your present home, or if you've moved to a new home, make a new application for 1988.

The deadline for applications is May 2, 1988. Contact your appraisal district before then if you need more time.

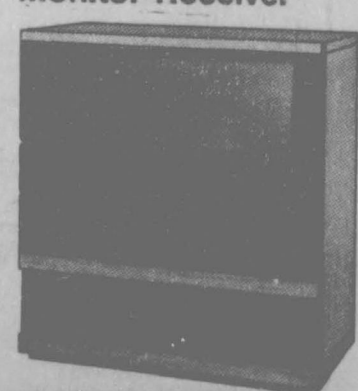
