Now, at the age of 74 , he has livec through some of the hardest fighting ever witnessed. And two years ago, in
1985. he was on the losing 1985, he was on the losing end of
another battle - cariovascular disease. another atate... Cariovasculur case sease.
But a triple-bpass took care of that and the venerable American patriot is around for yet another Memorial Day
observance observance.
Would he do it again? "Yes," he declares without hesita--
tion. "If it were necessary. I would do it again. Today."
Is it any wonder there are observances such as Memorial Day .. soldiers
and men with the same quick patria and men with the same quick patrio-
