

Winds clocked in excess of 80 mph . . .

Damages mounting from storm, hail, high winds

Damages from a heavy thunderstorm which moved through Hansford county Tuesday evening and dumped 1.62 inches of rain and hail in about an hour added to already burgeoning list of damage reports from spring and summer storms.

High wind gusts estimated in excess of 80 miles per hour, caused heavy roof damage across Spearman, knocked down barns out in the country and caused at least one light pole at the Jaycee's ball park to fall over.

Accompanying hail tore up sorghum fields in the country and caused heavy damage in Spearman itself to roofs, trees and other foliage.

A semi-truck was overturned on the Gruver highway and Frontier Feeders received damages to a trailer and power lines which were down, reports Hansford county sheriff, R. L. McFarlin.

At Spearman Cattle Feeders, several trailers were damaged, including one which had been utilized as an office.

In Spearman, brick was blown off one downtown business roof, exposing electrical wiring at Cates Men and Boys Wear. The Pizza Hut roof was blown off and signs at Nursanick Motel and Gillaspie Chevrolet-Olds received heavy damage. The dairy Queen was closed when flooding made it impossible to reach the building. Power lines were blown down across

the county, including at Frontier Feeders and one mile east of Gruver on Hwy 15.

Both airports in the county -- at Gruver and Spearman -- received heavy damage to both buildings and some airplanes which were housed outside of hangars.

Electrical power in Spearman was out for about an hour Tuesday evening, reports Texas-New Mexico manager Robert Elliott. Winds damaged transmission lines along Hwy 15 approximately five miles west of Spearman.

Power company linemen were still working on the lines Wednesday morning, he notes.

Other damages were to barns and outbuildings across the county, included barns at the McClellan, and Haggerman place along with barns owned by Carl Archer, reports the sheriff's office. Also receiving damage was a barn owned by Don McLain.

Other reports were still trickling in at presstime Wednesday. These latest reports are in addition See "STORM", p-2

Perryton man named supermarket manager

A Perryton man, Vance McGee has been named manager of the new Jack and Jill grocery store in Spearman, announces Bob Downing owner of the Beaver, Ok. based firm.

The new Jack and Jill Supermarket is located at 123 W. Kenneth in Spearman and is housed in an 11,000 square foot corner-lot building.

McGee, a Hereford native, has been with the Jack and Jill food store chain for two years. Jack and Jill also has stores in Beaver, Ok., and Perryton.

"We're still getting our store put together at this point," notes the new manager. "We're putting on the finishing touches and we're in the process of hiring from the applications we've already received" he notes.

McGee is a 1973 graduate of Hereford high school and received his BS in speech and communications from West Texas State University in 1978. He earned his masters' degree in 1980 from the Canyon-based university.

He and his wife, Suzanne, have one daughter, Darcy, who is three years old. They are in the process of moving to Spearman.

"We're not going to open for business until everything is

Spearman Independent School District board of trustees gave tentative approval to a portion of the 1987-88 school budget Monday evening, then settled back into a wait and see posture as the Texas Legislature continues to haggle on an education bill which could greatly affect school districts across the state.

"It's impossible at this point to adopt any type of budget," notes SISD business manager Orville Latham. "The emergency session of this legislature is almost over and we don't really see anything coming out of it. They may have to have another session in order to get all the details ironed out."

The portion of the budget approved Tuesday is that portion of the 1987-88 budget which does not include salaries.

Trustees tentatively approved some \$863,315 of the 1987-88 budget which carries a \$3,224,841 tag at this point. The amount receiving approval does not include salaries for the 113

employees of the Spearman school district.

At jeopardy for school employees across the state is a step increase passed two years ago by the last Texas legislature. Funding for the increase through the state has become a political football with the school employees caught in the middle.

During the regular session the step increase became a target for discontinuation by the Texas legislature, notes Latham.

"It hasn't been mentioned again during the emergency session, but we just don't know at this point," he adds.

The step increase approved two years ago by the Texas legislature would increase class room teacher salaries by \$1140. Wages for teachers are now based on seniority within the profession itself.

For beginning teachers, the state pays a base rate of \$15,200 before the step increase. SISD adds \$4400 for a bachelor's degree and \$4900 for a master's above the state pay.

The portion of the budget receiving approval by SISD trustees is normal operation expenses such as mainten-

ance, supplies, books and othe items for day to day operation of the school district.

The \$2,361,526 which has not been approved is salaries and benefits paid to employees by the school district.

Also worked into the current working budget is a 3.8 percent wage increase for all school employees who are not affected by the state's step increase.

Of the 113 employees of the SISD, 68 are class room teachers while another 11 are in administration. The remaining 34 employees are maintenance, bus drivers, cafeteria workers and others associated with departments outside the teaching ranks.

"Once we know what Austin is going to do, we can map out our budget plans," declares the school business manager. "Our plans right now are conjecture. It could change instantly once the legislature decides what it is, or isn't, going to do."

In the portion of the budget already receiving tentative approval by trustees, is the lease-purchase of a computer mainframe and 20 terminals

for classroom use beginning with the 1987-88 school year.

The computer terminals -- 15 of them -- will be in one classroom with five mobile units which will have the capability of being moved from class to class and tied into the mainframe in the central computer classroom.

The current budget is set at \$3,224,851 which is \$35,608 less than the 1986-87 budget of \$3,260,459. Most of the savings has come from elimination of five positions within the school.

Despite the loss of tax revenues due to evaluation -- the Spearman ISD faces a revenue loss of some \$262,494 -- trustees are looking at only three percent tax increase based on the current budget.

This would raise the school tax rate from \$.883 per \$100 valuation to \$.8574 per \$100 valuation.

If the budget does not have to be reworked -- and at this time that is speculation -- the Spearman ISD will be operating on a deficit budget of

Services for Mickel Chad Hargrove were held Monday afternoon in the Fellowship Baptist Church of Spearman with the Rev. James D. Jones, pastor, and the Rev. Carrol Redwine, associate pastor, officiating.

Burial was in Hansford Cemetery by Boxwell Funeral Home.

Mickel Chad was born in Littlefield and had been a resident of the Spearman area since 1972. He was a junior at Fellowship Baptist Church School and a member of Fellowship Baptist Church.

Survivors include his parents, Hilous and Sarah Hargrove; a brother, Joey of the home; and grandparents, Lenora Sharp of Sudan and J. D. Hargrove of Round Mountain, Nev.

Spearman commission passes ordinance

Spearman city commissioners voted to amend a traffic ordinance, passed a resolution in support of a broadened sales tax base, approved a master plan for a sub-division plat and approved a resolution supporting a regional drug enforcement unit during their regular Tuesday evening meeting this week.

The traffic ordinance -- one dealing with turning across the oncoming lane of traffic -- was amended to clarify what is, and what isn't an offense.

The new wording reads, "It shall be unlawful for moving traffic to make

a turn from one lane of traffic, except to make a left turn at an intersection, into or out of an alley, private road, driveway or off-street parking lot."

Prior to the amendment, the law could be interpreted in such a way that left hand turn at an intersection was illegal, Jim Murray, city manager, explained city aldermen.

City fathers also approved the master plan of South park Addition to the city of Spearman and approved the 1987-88 Hansford Tax Appraisal budget.

In a report from Mayor Ralph Blodgett, alderman heard an update on the city's FFA application for airport improvements.

"It would appear at this time that Spearman is number one in this district for funding," the mayor said. "Canadian is the second largest project and Plainview is third."

While no commitments have been made, it would appear that Spearman stands in good position to receive federal funding for their airport improvement project according to Blodgett's report.

some \$144,000 with the tax increase. Without the tax increase the deficit would be \$195,000.

The school would be able to operate with the deficit budget due to an estimated carry over of \$1.25 million in funds from the 1986-87 budget. Of that amount, only \$750,000 is needed for operations before taxes start coming in, notes Latham.

In other board action Monday evening, trustees voted to start the school day five minutes earlier and end it 15 minutes later beginning with this fall.

The school day will begin at 8:15 and end at 3:45 with the additional 20 minutes of time to be distributed among classes during the day.

This is being done to aid in scheduling difficulties and to give extra time for UIL studies, assemblies and other items, school officials reported to the board.

Cafeteria meal prices for students and employees were maintained at the same level for the upcoming school year. Guest prices, however, were raised from \$2 per meal to \$2.50 per meal.

A noon meeting scheduled Monday was postponed to July 28 when architectural proposals to be submitted by Larry Donham of Andrews were incomplete, school superintendent Larry Eutler reported. That meeting is also set for noon that day.

Trustees also accepted the resignation of second grade teacher LaVon Reid and the retirement of business office secretary Jessie Faries. They hired Cynthia Clyburn as replacement for Mrs. Reid.

to be a catch 22 situation for all taxing entities at this point.

Cities are pointing out that sales tax revenues are down. It only stands to reason that decreased sales tax revenues means lower sales. That then says that retail sales are down. And this means that operating margins for retailers are down.

It also means a lot of other things. It was the purpose of the Reagan administration to decentralize the federal government. In large part, this meant taking responsibility for a host of federally supported monetary programs and placing it back on the state or local governments to support.

The state utilized the same incentive whenever it reworked distribution of education funds. The fact that it increased large, metropolitan funds -- where the votes are concentrated -- at the expense of smaller, rural school district funds was a minor point . . . to the politicians.

The catch 22 is that increased taxes will make it harder for businessmen -- from agriculture to the professional fields -- to remain businessmen. And, as businesses go by the wayside, taxes will have to be increased again to make up for the lost revenues from the decreased base.

On the bright side, things won't be like this forever. And, once the economic pendulum swings back, we can blithely go about the business of keeping our politicians and political organizations in the pink -- or is that green?

The 8 to 10 year old class saw Matt Archer take first in pole bending and barrel racing along with a second place finish in the stake race.

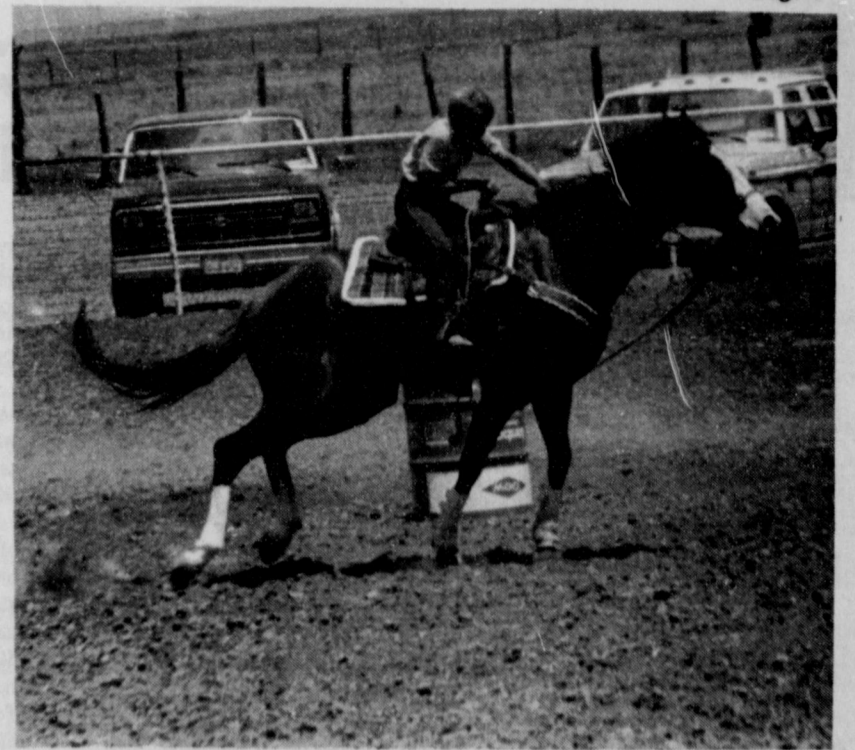
Sandi Rich took fourth in poles while Matt Gafford was sixth in the stake race for Spearman.

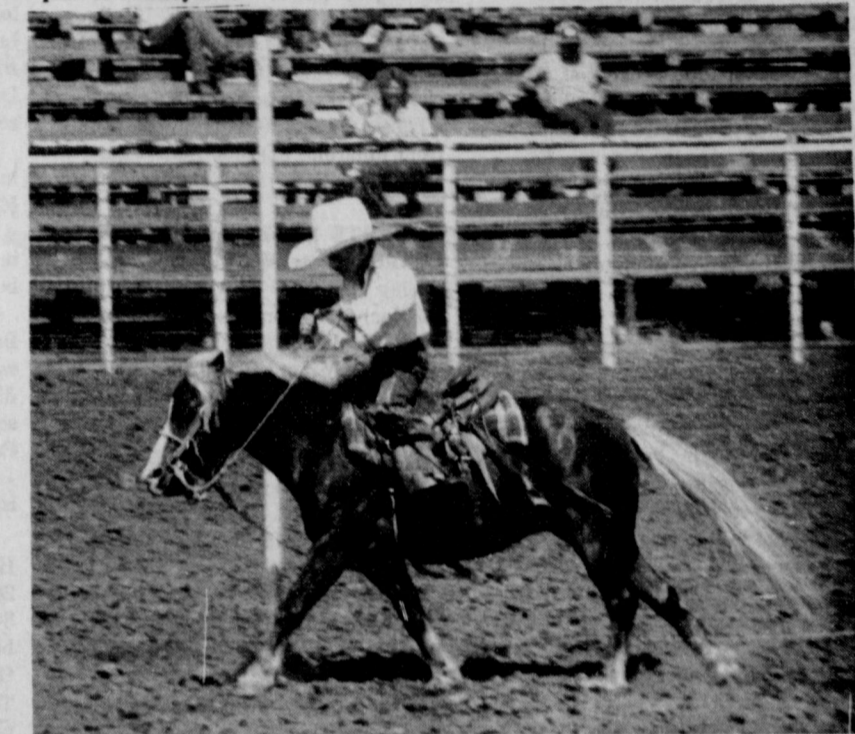
Services held for Emma Seitz's brother

AUSTIN—Lawmakers are speculating that a second special session will be needed to balance the state budget with a new tax plan. The current session closes July 21.

After the plan to tax insurance policies blew up in the Senate last week, scuttled by thousands of consumer protests, the leadership searched for new revenue sources and found nothing on which they could agree.

First, lawmakers must agree on how much to spend, and the budget committee labored all weekend to forge a compromise before time runs out next week.

Pro-tax legislators took some hope from Gov. Bill Clements' softened stance on new taxes, if it can be called that.

Clements indicated he may not veto a tax bill so long as the budget is around \$38 billion. "If they put that bill on my desk, I assure you I would sign it. So there is a bottom line," he said.

Mixed Signals Up

The next day, the governor retook his position against taxes after meeting with a group of Houston businessmen.

Clements' signals are mixed, and he is steadily faulted for that and for his failure to hold press conferences. On his side, he receives mixed signals, too, from a Legislature that has neither a budget nor a tax plan.

The frustration was enough to prompt Rep. Stan Schlueter, D-Killeen, chairman of the Ways and Means Committee, to tell reporters that maybe what's needed is a new governor, a new lieutenant governor, a new speaker and a whole new Legislature.

Sports Agents, Jails

On the positive side, the Senate approved a bill requiring sports agents to register yearly with the Texas Secretary of State.

Also passed was a bill allowing cities to contract with private firms to build and operate new jails. Clements vetoed a similar bill because of a Houston-area clause.

The sports bill limits agents' contacts with college athletes, bans unregistered agents, and requires they file copies of contracts they sign.

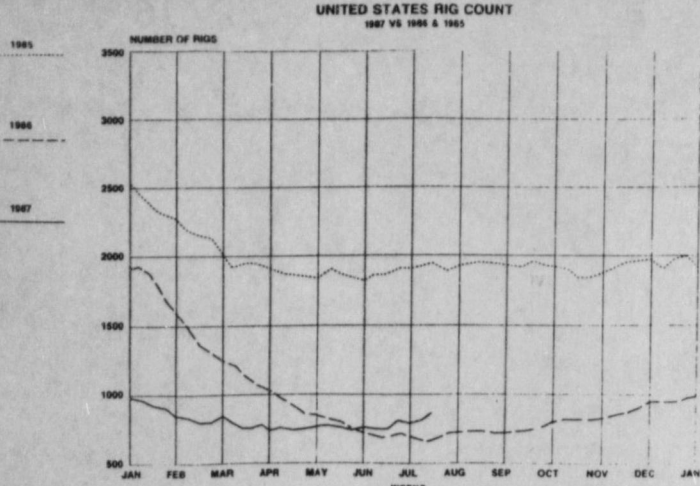

Comments
OPEC's agreement on oil production for the rest of 1987 has given crude prices a boost. In response to OPEC's decision to contain production at 16.6 million barrels a day in the third and fourth quarters, European prices for North Sea Brent blend edged up to \$19.30 a barrel for July Oil & Gas Journal, July 6, 1987.

Industry reaction in general is that the OPEC agreement reached late last month in Vienna is "just about right," and North Sea prices will remain at about \$19 a barrel during the next months.

OPEC sources do not expect a major change in world crude markets during the last two quarters of the year. But in the light of unexpected events or a collapse of OPEC discipline, a Venezuela, Iran and Algeria has been empowered to call an emergency meeting ahead of the next scheduled OPEC conference December 9, reports Oil & Gas Journal.

Glider pilots assemble at Dalhart camp meeting

Glider pilots from as far away as Florida and Pennsylvania will gather in Dalhart beginning July 18 for the Third Annual Texas Panhandle Badge and Record Soaring Camp.

And Ben Wilson of Gruver, an accomplished glider pilot himself, will be on hand at the Dalhart camp as coordinator and instructor for the special glider camp.

As many as two dozen of the pilots and their crew members will bring high performance gliders, also known as sailplanes, to Dalhart for a week of attempts to set distance and speed marks in their racing aircraft, using only the Texas Panhandle's rising currents of warm air to remain aloft.

"During July and August, the Texas Panhandle has some of the finest soaring conditions in the country and pilots will come from a long way off just so they can fly here and have a shot at some long flights," said Steve Sherry of Dalhart, one of the camp's organizers and a glider pilot himself.

The camp is sponsored by Dalhart Soaring, which is based at Miller Field outside of Dalhart.

As in years past, the public is invited to observe the meet and will be able to take rides in a glider.

Since the first Texas Panhandle Badge and Record Soaring Camp was held two years ago, a unique flight has evolved as the ultimate soaring challenge in the Texas Panhandle.

Because of Dalhart's location, it is possible on a day marked by

superb soaring weather to make a 221 mile flight in which the sailplane takes off from Dalhart and passes through five states -- Texas, New Mexico, Colorado, Kansas and Oklahoma -- before returning to Dalhart.

Two pilots made the demanding circuit last year.

Landmarks designated in advance are photographed from the air using a sealed camera to later verify that the flight was made.

The landmarks, or turnpoints, are at Clayton, N. M.; Campo, Co.; Elkhart, Ks.; Boise City, Ok., and return to Dalhart.

The record time around the course is 3 hours and 54 minutes, held by David Lawrence of Lakeland, FL., who flew a German-built ASW 20 an average speed of 56.67 miles per hour.

He is expected back again this year to attempt to shorten the time and defend his title.

Dave Lund of Boulder, Co., also successfully made the flight last year in a Mini-Nimbus in 4:29

Members of the public who want to see the pilots readying their gliders and being towed into the air by a propeller driven towplane should plan on arriving at the airport between 10 a.m. and noon C.D.T. any day between July 18 and July 25.

Miller Field is located six miles northeast of Dalhart near U. S. Highway 54.

"Our actions were never meant to alarm any of the citizens," the sheriff explains. "It was merely a case of making sure nothing was going on."
