Eakins unofficial 4-H coaches

As if raising four active young boys and maintaining a job which carries him throughout a 4-state area, Jim and Wanda Eakin of Spearman somehow find the time to work with 12 to 15 young cowboys and cowgirls each week as they help with the 4-H youth toward rodeo competition.

The Spearman couple keep a place nestled in the Palo Duro Draw, a picturesque setting near where old Hansford used to stand. There they've built an arena for roping and riding and maintain the livestock for the kids' practices as well.

Interestingly enough, after three years and over 20 outings to

rodeo's, fun days and horse shows just this spring and summer, the Eakins still look forward to working with the boys and girls, and they're eager to add even more to the flock.

"We're always open for more," notes Jim. "Maybe this article will let everyone know about what we're doing."

What they're doing is working on a weekly basis with young cowboy and cowgirl rodeo hopefuls who then participate in area junior rodeos. And those cowboys and cowgirls come from both Spearman and Gruver.

Practices are held every week, either on a Tuesday or Thursday

evening, but generally on Thursday, notes Jim. "Mostly, it's whenever I'm home to help," he adds.

Jim and Wanda themselves are no stranger to helping kids practice -- they have four of their own ranging from Marty, the youngest at almost four years old, on up to Mark who is 13 and will be an eighth grader at Spearman junior high this year.

Also included in the Eakin group is 11-year old Matt who will be a sixth grader this year and 7-year old Monty who will be in the second grade at Spearman beginning in September.

This is the first year in their

three years of working with the 4-H youth for the Eakins to hold the practices on their place which is conveniently located about halfway between Spearman and Gruver.

"It's really more convenient for us," declares Wanda. "In the past, we had to move our horses into town. Now they're here, all we have to do is saddle and ride."

Both Jim and Wanda have rodeo backgrounds themselves. Jim mostly on the high school level and Wanda claims a passion for the sport since she was 11-years old.

"I've been rodeoing since I was 11," she states, "And I continued

Forgive him? Sure. Make a hero of the man? Well . . .



Following new Red Cave production rules . . .

TRC ruling has Hansford oil-gas producers 'guardedly optimistic'

A recent ruling by the Texas Railroad Commission has Hansford county oil and gas producers as well as royalty owners guardedly optimistic about changes which might stimulate drilling activity in the area.

That ruling came on the red cave pay zone which is located primarily in Moore, Potter, Carson and Hutchinson counties. Included in the ruling was the adoption of a new set of production rules for the Red Cave field.

Hansford county sets on top of the Panhandle field, an oil and gas zone which is primarily down to the 4,000-foot level.

The Red Cave field lies between 1,600 and 2,400 feet below the surface in counties along the Canadian River breaks.

The new production rulings issued by the Railroad Commission allows a 100,000-to-one oil-gas production ration -- that is 100,000 cubic feet of casinghead gas may be produced daily for each barrel of oil a well produces up to a maximum cap of 240,000 mcf cap.

An oil well producing as little as one barrel of oil per day may also pump 100,000 mcf natural gas. To reach the 240,000 maximum, the well must produce at least 2.4 barrels per day or more.

The new Red Cave field rules will allow a 20-acre lease to pump 60 barrels of oil daily along with 240,000 cubic feet of casinghead gas.

Production allowables decrease, however, for wells drilled on optional 10-acre and 5-acre spacings. Oilmen are allowed to produce 53 barrels of oil and 212,000 cubic feet of gas from a 10-acre well and 49 barrels of oil and 196,000 cubic feet of casinghead gas from wells on a 5-acre spacing.


Production in the Panhandle field has been in a lull for the past two years, notes one area oil field service business manager. But the future looks brighter now for the Hansford area if the Red Cave ruling is any indication.

"It appears the commission is more open minded," notes Ralph Boldgett of Spearman, an independent oil and gas producer. "It definitely shows a better attitude than what we've seen out of Austin."

Most independent producers look on the Red Cave ruling as a precedent-setting action by the railroad commission.

"We're hoping the Red Cave decision will be a precedent and a like decision will be issued here," reports Roy Bulls, vice-president of Baker and Taylor Drilling Company in Spearman. "If they rule similarly here, it will spur not only natural gas production, but oil as well."

For third consecutive year . . .

Spearman swim club wins league championship title

Utilizing team depth to its greatest degree, the Spearman Swim Team captured its third consecutive swimming league title this past weekend in Dodge City, Kan.

The Spearman club took 71 placings during the 2-day meet and saw individual performers establish 14 new pool records enroute to their 1987 win.

The prestigious team title was earned in competition with 12 other swim clubs from Kansas and Oklahoma. Spearman is the only Texas team in the Western Kansas Swim League.

Over 500 swimmers accounted for 2,305 entries in the meet which ran off this Saturday and Sunday in Dodge City.

Spearman claimed 22 first place wins, 13 silver and 15 bronze medals along with seven fourth, nine fifth and five sixth place medals to capture 1987 league title.

Carly Shieldknight led the pack of new pool marks, gaining five new records -- breaking three she set last year.

The talented Spearman swimmer set new records in the girls 15- to 18-year old bracket in the 100-yard backstroke, the 100-yard butterfly,

the 100-yard breaststroke, the 200-yard individual medley and the 200-yard freestyle.

She shaved a full 20 seconds off the 200-yard individual medley with a time of 2:40.1. The old record -- one she set last year -- was 3:00.5.

Carly's time of 1:21.6 set a new record in the 100-yard backstroke, besting the old time of 1:22.19. She also set a new mark in the butterfly with a time of 1:20.57, besting the pool record of 1:22.01 -- again her old record.

In the breaststroke, she trimmed just under 1.5 seconds off her old pool record of 2:33.73.

Ashley Shieldknight set three new pool records while teammates Haley Shieldknight, Mac Sheppard and Jill Lusby claimed two pool marks each.

Ashley set new pool records in the girls 9-10 year old age bracket in the 50-yard butterfly, the 50-yard breaststroke and the 100-yard individual medley.

Haley's new records came in the

girls 13-14 year old 100-yard backstroke and the 100-yard breaststroke.

Sheppard captured two new records in the boys 13-14 year old

until about 1981 to be pretty active. But then time pressures with raising a family pretty well fixed it to where I had to give it up."

She now works ardently with her own crew... plus another eight to 11 youngsters she has more or less adopted into her fold.

Fortunately, they have help with the practices as parents of the youth involved in the program help out each week.

"The parents are great," declares the elder Eakin. "They help saddle up the horses for the kids and run livestock for us during our practice sessions."

The two unofficial coaches of the Hansford 4-H youth group got into their current position in a rather round-about fashion.

"It's all because of Wanda," smiles Jim.

Wanda has been active in the 4-H program at Spearman since her oldest, Mark, entered the program.

Three years ago she was elected as president of the 4-H Horseman's Club, a position she still holds.

"The rodeo part more or less evolved over that period," she notes. "Last year most of the kids wanted to rodeo instead of going to horse shows, so we began rodeoing."

The crew they're working with now includes boys and girls from as young as 3-years old to 13-years old -- about the same range as their children.

Mostly it's something they enjoy doing. Neither are strangers to Hansford county. Jim is a native of Stuttgart while Wanda is a Spearman Native. Her maiden name was Greene.

All in all it represents a busy time for the Eakins and their crew. But from all appearances, it's a pleasant time for all concerned. And the Hansford county youth continue to win in big ways at area rodeos -- thanks in large part of Jim and Wanda Eakin and their unselfish and dedicated work.



that the ruling could effect not only new drilling, but would open to production many wells that are currently shut in.

Current rules in the Panhandle field limit production to 250,000 mcf per well per day as well as limiting the number of wells per section to one.

"The biggest help we could get would be if they declared the Panhandle field a common reservoir," reports Blodgett. "Right now producers are limited to where they may perforate depending upon whether they're going for oil or gas."

Most producers in the Hansford area look for a ruling out of the Texas Railroad Commission sometime this fall or early next year on the Panhandle fields.

"The majors and gas producers

have had things tied up for some time now," Bulls says. "A ruling in the Panhandle field similar to the Red Cave ruling would not only put people back to work, but it would help the independents and the land owners as well."

While the decision on the Red Cave field came last week, it follows over a year of formal hearings before the TRC. A decision made by the Railroad Commission in October, 1985, prompted independents to request consolidation of the Panhandle, West (Red Cave) and the Panhandle (Red Cave) Fields, and for the TRC to issue new production rules.

A formal hearing was held by three TRC examiners in May, 1986, but their findings and recommendations were not submitted to the

commission until January of this year.

The oil-gas production ratio was the main contention of the hearings. In the decision last week, railroad commissioners adopted a compromise submitted by Commissioner John Sharp.

"The examiners did not recommend that the fields be consolidated," explains Brian Shibley of Austin, a TRC public relations spokesman. "The two fields will remain separate even though there is some communications between them, but not enough for a substantial exchange of oil and gas."

He notes that the method of regulation chosen by the commission is to set a limit on the amount of gas to be produced to protect the rights of both the oil pumper and the gas producer.

In the Red Cave fields, ownership of the oil and gas has been separated. This led to the complex testimony submitted by oil-gas producers at the hearing.

"Because of the complexity of the geological structure of the field, commissioners believe that the recommended gas allowable was not enough to encourage new development," Shibley continues. "Oil and producers contended the 1,000-to-one ratio was not enough to pay out a new well."

The TRC spokesman says the compromise allowable "will accommodate new development" and the recovery of hydrocarbons from the Red Cave fields.

AUSTIN—Like two cowboys fighting in a buckboard who realize they're about to go over the cliff, Gov. Bill Clements and Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby opted to end their brinkmanship on the budget before the state goes over the edge.

And like an audience sitting on the edge of their seats, most Texans breathed a sigh of relief.

Along with House Speaker Gib Lewis, the trio last week met the press to outline a \$38.3 billion spending compromise, and then turned to the task of getting the Legislature to approve it.

Everyone gave a little. Clements agreed to not veto the bill, and Hobby lowered his spending levels.

Their accord left the Legislature a scant eight days to rush the spending and tax bills through conference committee and both houses.

Speaker Lewis predicted a tough House battle, but if some strength must be mustered, a second special session could extend the time.

Clements Rips Treasurer

Earlier, as committee members huddled, Treasurer Ann Richards called a press conference to warn Aug. 7 was the deadline to make a budget before state checks start bouncing.

When questioned later, Clements brushed off her warnings as the ploy of an alarmist using the budget crisis to get publicity. After all, everyone in state government had one eye on the well-publicized deadline.

The governor also hinted how he will defend himself for not vetoing the budget as promised. "The budget is not down. In fact, it is up. But it's not up as much as some people (Hobby) would like."

Delicate Passage

Lewis' warning that the House would not rubberstamp the plan proved correct. Some House members immediately slapped the new tax bill and the budget.

House Ways and Means Com-

mittee Chairman Stan Schlueter, D-Killeen, called the Senate proposals "the most anti-business, anti-competitive, anti-growth legislation I have ever seen in the form of a tax bill."

The Senate sponsor, Bob Glasgow, D-Stephenville, took a flexible position and said the Senate would work with the House.

Rep. Paul Colbert, D-Houston, now known for his clever amendment which would wipe out many agencies and colleges if Clements vetoed the budget, said the lower spending level would cause local taxes to increase.

"Why the governor thinks you can save taxpayers money by not putting it (taxes) on them at the state level, but forcing it on them at the local level, I don't understand," Colbert said.

The burden is now on local officials to make cuts, and those local officials who pass along higher local taxes will try to blame the Legislature for not approving more.

Other Highlights

• Despite his loss of credibility in the polls, Clements last month raised \$290,000 in campaign contributions.

• Sen. Ike Harris, R-Dallas, said he will seek re-election, which disappointed those who wanted to move up to that seat.



NGSPA discusses 'fair trade' practice at meeting in Dallas

"Fair trade" - not "free trade" - will allow U. S. farmers to maintain their vital share of the world market. That was the consensus of the executive committees of the National Grain Sorghum Producers Association and the Grain Sorghum Promotion Federation when they met in joint session in Dallas July 7-8, to review National GSPA

policies on international trade. The fair trade policy supported by National GSPA allows the use of government export enhancement programs, agricultural price supports, and bilateral or multilateral trade agreements to maintain the U.S. share of world agricultural sales. To balance world grain supplies, international fair trade

policies should require all grain exporting countries to cut back on grain production.

The executive committees of both sorghum groups rejected President Reagan's recent proposal to eliminate worldwide agricultural price supports and export enhancement programs.

Elbert Harp, executive director of the National GSPA, said that the president's proposal is aimed at moving grain producers into a total free-trade world market situation and is unworkable. Because other countries need to earn foreign currency and are determined to be self-sufficient, it is highly unlikely that many countries would support free trade.

"American farmers cannot eco-

nomically survive a free-trade policy. Free trade can't work unless grain producing countries such as Argentina, Brazil, Mexico, and China are willing to raise their standard of living or the U.S. is willing to lower its standard of living. Free trade will only work if all countries are on the same economic and political level," said Harp.

"A free-trade concept will give a larger share of the world's grain market to other countries. Such a program will give many of our competitors an unfair advantage over U.S. producers," said Harp. "U.S. producers cannot compete with producers from countries that do not have cost factors such as OSHA (Occupational Safety and Health Administration), EPA (Environmental Protection Agency), minimum wage, workers' compensation, and land taxes."

Under the National GSPA trade policies, the U.S. would work through the General Agreement on Trade and Tariffs (GATT) to assure access to the world market.

The National GSPA policies also call for increased funding for Foreign Agricultural Service market development cooperation pro-

grams - the implementation of laws such as Section 22 of the Agricultural products; and the passage of the Foreign Agricultural Investment Reform Act (FAIR) which would prohibit the use of U.S. tax dollars for development of agricultural commodities in competing foreign countries.
