### SPD looking into flag disappearance

Spearman police are currently watching for a vehicle which was seen flying flags which could have been stolen from poles along Hwy. 207 in Spearman over the weekend.

The flags are part of a special project of the Spearman Volunteer Fire Department and are placed on the poles during special occasions such as this past weekend's Hansford Round Up.

"We have a pair of witnesses who have given us a description of the vehicle," reports Spearman police chief, Joe Raper. "We are looking into the problem now."

Meanwhile, the SVFD has been ordered by the city council not to fly the flags until further notice.

"We won't be putting them up on Flag Day or on July 4," reports fire chief Bill Porter.

The flags were purchased with donations from Spearman businesses and individuals at a cost of \$13.50 each. To date a total of seven flags have been taken from the poles the two times the flags were put out.

Anyone caught stealing the flags will be charged with a class B misdemeanor, warns Raper. Conviction could carry up to a \$1000 fine and/or 180 days in city jail.

of Hansford county -- that's what the Stationmaster's House Museum is, located at 30 S. Townsen in Spearman.

What began as an ambitious project of the Hansford County Historical Commission in the mid-1970's now stands as a living testimony to those early pioneer spirits who settled this rugged land.

There are over 40 different displays ranging from entire rooms reconstructed in early-day settings to individual cases and displays of early-day relics situated in the over 2000-square feet which now comprises the Stationmaster's museum.

And the history of the museum itself is a story of dedicated men and women seeking to preserve what they can of those early days in Hansford county for the present and future generations to look upon and be amazed.

The Stationmaster's house is just that -- the Santa Fe stationmaster's house from the days when railroads were king and the establishment of a railroad depot assured the birth of a new town.

Over the years, as road transportation improved, then finally replaced, rail transportation as king, the need for a station master -- even the need for a depot -- vanished and railway companies such as Santa Fe sold their houses, their depots, for whatever price they could.

The late Lloyd "Duke" Roberts became the owner of the Stationmaster's house in Spearman -- buying it from the Santa Fe RR for a price of \$3,500.

"Mary Lou Wysong, who was chamber executive at the time, gave us the idea to take the house and turn it into a museum," notes Clementine Renner who is the current secretary of the Hansford Museum board. "So I rushed over to see Duke and asked him if he'd be interested in selling the place."

Mr. Roberts sold it and let the Hansford County Historical Commission have it for the exact price he paid, according to Mrs. Renner's account.

"He didn't make one penny of profit," she declares. "We went to Interstate Savings and they loaned us the money to purchase the house and enough to make some improvements we wanted to make."

So, in 1975, the museum opened. It was a dream built on great hope and even greater expectations. But perhaps not the most solid of financial conditions as is often the case with county museums.

The early days of the museum were shaky financially. The Stationmaster's museum has always operated on donations from private individuals and not everyone shared the enthusiasm of the Historical commission.

"There were months we couldn't even pay our utilities," laughs Rubyjo Wilbanks, now treasurer for the museum board. "But somehow, somebody would come through and we'd manage to make it one more month."

Perhaps the largest single donation came from Gus and Clementine Renner who paid off the loan on the building to knock that continuing debt

## SISD awards junior high repair contract

A contract to make stop-gap repairs to a part of the existing Spearman junior high building was awarded to a Lubbock company for a total bid of \$9,000 during the Spearman ISD board meeting Monday evening.

The award is tentative, pending a financial statement and a bidder's qualification form which was required as a part of the bid proposal.

The work on the junior high building will be to the east portion of the campus building -- the original 1923 structure. Nothing will be done at this time to the west portion of the building which was constructed in 1930.

Bids were received from five different firms with bid prices ranging from the low bid of \$9,000 to a high bid of \$18,600.

Ed Lampe Building Contractors of Lubbock was the low bidder and was awarded the bid pending completion of bid requirements.

Other bids include a \$10,900 bid from Pharr and Company of Lubbock; \$12,447 from Hunter Construction of Lubbock; \$16,445 from Northline Construction of Amarillo and an

\$18,600 bid from B.E.W. Construction of Woodward, Ok.

SISD board members were presented with the first two of five possible solutions for rebuilding the time-damaged structure at the Junior high campus.

The presentation was made by Larry Donham, an architect with Huckabee and Donham of Andrews.

Both proposals Monday night added no addition space for the junior high campus. Both required demolition of the 1923 structure while leaving the remaining buildings intact and utilizing existing cafeteria and kitchen facilities.

The two proposals presented to the board also called for shifting the fourth and fifth grade classes to the elementary building adjacent to the junior high campus along with additions to the elementary building.

Neither of the two plans allowed for additional space for growth, Donham reported to the SISD board.

The stop-gap measures to the existing structure at the junior high campus calls for steel rods to be run both diagonally across the building

and then parallel to the east wall. The rods will protrude from the outside of the building and will be welded to plates to strengthen the structure.

Donham will meet with the SISD board again in July to present the other three proposals which the Andrews architect firm is currently developing.

### USDA cheese distribution set

Cheese distribution from the USDA Surplus Commodity program will be held in Spearman next Wednesday, reports county judge R. L. McClellan.

The distribution will be held from 1 to 5 p.m. that afternoon out of the county judge's office.

The special cheese distribution is open to all eligible head of households who meet income criteria established by the USDA.

Those drawing Social Security Income, food stamps or medicare are automatically eligible, the county judge's office reports.

## Jury makes award in condemnation suit

An 84th district jury awarded a Hansford county land owner \$13,949.50 in a condemnation trial which closed Tuesday afternoon in Spearman.

James Martin was awarded the money following condemnation proceedings in the court, brought by the city of Spearman for land near the city airport.

Martin had been awarded \$46,000 by a special commission earlier, but declined the offer. He was seeking an additional \$2000 in the jury trial, according to Spearman city manager Jim Murray.

But the seven-man, five-woman jury awarded the \$13,949.50 figure as a total payment for land, air space and

damages in the 2-day trial this week.

The condemnation proceedings stem from an FAA project the City of Spearman is currently involved with and which calls for extension of the existing air port runway from 4600 feet to 5000 feet.

In addition to the extra 400 feet of runway, FAA guidelines also call for an additional 300 feet of over run at the end of the runway along with a zone of air space beyond the land the city was to purchase.

The city asked for condemnation of 5.41 acres of land and air space over another 27.03 acres of land.

Negotiations for the purchase of the land has been going on since 1983 when the city first requested donation

of the land to the airport facility.

City fathers then made their first of a series of written offers which ranged from near \$10,000 to a final offer of \$36,500 after the land was appraised utilizing FAA guidelines.

Later, a special commission awarded the \$46,000 amount to Martin.

The condemnation proceedings in the 84th Judicial District court began Monday with jury selection and would up Tuesday afternoon with the final award.

Martin has the right to appeal the case. Such appeal must be made within 30 days of the written order awarding the judgement. That written order was expected to be written Wednesday, reports the 84th District Clerk's office.

"I'm sure we'll appeal," the Hansford land owner said in a telephone interview Wednesday morning. "We're not going to panic and I don't harbor any ill will toward anyone."

### Swim lesson sign ups to begin at Y

Swimming lesson sign ups have started at the Hansford Y for the 3-session, 3-day-a-week annual program to be held at the Spearman swimming pool.

The first of the three sessions will begin June 15 and will run through June 25. The second session begins June 29 through July 9 and the final session runs from July 13 through July 23.

Each session will have lessons on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday of each week with three classes a day from 5 to 5:30; 5:30 to 6; and 6 to 6:30 p.m.

Cost of each session is \$15 per child. Parents can sign their children to the program at the Hansford Y office.

Each class will be limited to the first 40 who sign up. There will be two beginner classes and one intermediate class each day. All classes are on a first come, first serve basis, reports Linda Wilkerson of the Y swimming program.

### PDRA sets tentative tax rate for 1987-88

A tentative tax rate of less than six cents per hundred dollars of valuation was set by the Palo Duro River Authority in a Tuesday afternoon meeting in Spearman.

The tax rate was established at \$.0576 and includes a \$.0119 maintenance tax which has existed since the inception of the PDRA, notes Johnnie

Lee, general manager of the Hansford county project.

The addition rate is required to retire the first portion of a total \$25.5 million in bond money to finance the construction of a dam in the northern part of Hansford county.

The resulting lake will furnish water to member counties and cities which include Hansford and Moore counties as well as the city Stinnett.

The first portion of the \$25.5 million bond money -- a \$4.4 million chunk -- will be authorized in a special meeting called for today (Thursday) at noon in the PDRA offices in the Pittman-Shieldknight building.

"The rate we established is tentative, it may be lower once we get all our figures together," notes Lee. "We had to get a figure to the tax appraisal districts for them to complete requirements they have according to the law."

In addition, the PDRA board of directors hired the firm of Brown, Graham and Company of Spearman to audit their 1986-87 fiscal year which ends June 30.

Total tax rate to service the entire \$25.5 million bond issuance is not expected to go over 13 cents per hundred dollars of valuation, the PDRA general manager reports.

"We don't have all the figures together yet," Lee says. "But we don't look for the tax rate to go above 13 cents -- in fact, it will probably be lower."

### City police investigate store burglary

Spearman city police are investigating a break in of Hansford Video which occurred sometime Sunday night or Monday morning, reports police chief Joe Raper.

The incident occurred sometime between 9 o'clock Sunday evening and 3:43 Monday morning when the break in was discovered by Spearman patrolman Dwayne Kyle.

The back door to the Spearman business had been forced open and the thief or thieves then entered the building.

Only cash was taken during the burglary and no other vandalism was reported, notes the Spearman police chief.

The burglary is currently under investigation by the Spearman police department.

# Hansford county examines fiscal budget

Hansford county commissioners reviewed their 1987-88 budget proposals, signed jail agreements with both Spearman and Gruver, granted a road easement, bought general liability insurance, signed a fire contract with Gruver and entered a resolution to extend an ambulance contract with the city of Gruver during their regular monthly meeting this past Monday.

Commissioners are looking at moving county employee pay back to 1985 levels for the upcoming fiscal year. Last year the Hansford court gave an across the board five percent pay cut to all employees.

The increase written in to the tentative 1987-88 budget moves all pay levels for both employees and elected officials back to the 1985 scale.

A road easement was granted to Phillips Petroleum Company to lay a line under an existing county road.

Jail contracts which require payment of \$7 per day and \$3 per meal for city prisoners was reaffirmed by the Hansford commissioners with both Gruver and Spearman officials. This is the same working agreement the three entities have had for the past two years.

Commissioners were given at least one pleasant surprise Monday when general liability insurance for the upcoming year was some \$7,000 less than last year's premium.

"There were a couple of factor involved," notes county judge R.L. McClellan. "First, premium rates for the state were down, and we lowered our coverage."

The county had been carrying a \$1 million coverage policy, but reduced those limits to \$300,000 per incident and \$100,000 per individual for the upcoming year due to changes in the tort reform policies of the state.

The bid for insurance for the upcoming year as \$13,115 compared to a premium in excess of \$20,000 for the current year.

"It wasn't that big a deal," notes Mrs. Renner. "We hated to see the board struggling each month and it was something we could do to help."

In the beginning, the Hansford Historical Commission was directly responsible for the museum. By 1980, however, a museum board was established as a spin off of the commission to oversee the museum and to be responsible for the month-to-month duties associated with any institution of its calibre.

The original group who worked to establish the Stationmaster's Museum included Gruver's Ann Cluck who served as president at that time.

Fred and Marilyn Groves were also members as was Irvin and Helen Boyd of Gruver, J.D. and Rubyjo Wilbanks, Gus and Clementine Renner;

Juanita Pierce, Gruver's Trixie Holt and Coretta Ralston and Spearman's Emmett Sanders and Kevin Rook.

Since becoming a board, the number of board directors has been

narrowed to eight. But those eight are dedicated crew who have worked and continue to work numerous hours of volunteer duty to build and maintain the structure.

Just a few years ago, the museum board purchased the old Santa Fe Depot building which was built in 1920, then had it moved to the lot where the Stationmaster's house is located and joined it to the existing structure to expand facilities and add to the showcases.

Today's museum board consists of president Helen Boyd, secretary Clementine Renner, treasurer Rubyjo Wilbanks;

Board members Irvin Boyd, Juanita Pierce, Harry Stumpf, Gus Renner and J.D. Wilbanks.

Ernest Newcomb takes care of the day-to-day activities of the museum as curator. His salary is paid by the Farmer's Union Green Thumb program.

Meanwhile, the financial stability of the museum has been helped to some extent by the addition of a motel tax -- a portion of it goes each quarter to the museum.

"We operate on a beggar's budget," laughs Mrs. Wilbanks. "We're considerably better off now than we were, but we still need donations from individuals to keep the doors open."

And the doors are open. They open on a world that passed away over 60 years ago. From early schools and bedrooms, offices and kitchens to individual pieces of clothing, work tools and hundreds of other items, the museum displays it all.

"Most of what we have in the form of displays has been given to us or is on loan," notes Helen Boyd. "The building has a 1300 square foot

## Low income families may be eligible for assistance

Some low-income Texans may be eligible for help in paying cooling bills this summer through the Home Energy Assistance Program, according to Texas Department of Human Services Commissioner Marlin Johnston.

Johnston said the one-time payment is available to many low-income households. Applications for energy assistance were mailed to households that received food stamps, Aid to Families with Dependent Children, or Supplemental Security Income in May. If those households have at least one member who will be 60 or older in 1987 or a member with a medical condition that is aggravated by heat, they may qualify for assistance. Other low-income individuals may request an application from local DHS offices during the enrollment period of June 15-July 17.

Eligibility is limited by gross income and resources. This year, because of budget cuts and participation rates, the benefits for the cooling program may be lower than last year's. Aid is

available for a one-person household having less than \$555.49 gross income per month. The gross income limits are \$745.49 for households of two persons, \$935.49 for three, \$1,125.49 for four, \$1,315.49 for five, and \$1,505.49 for six.

Households are eligible if the cost for cooling is included in the rent payment or if the household pays a portion of its home energy costs.

## Fees increased for ambulance

The Spearman city commission ratified an ordinance increasing fees for ambulance service to and from Amarillo, approved an agreement for detention services and established payment for community service projects performed by the Spearman Volunteer Fire Department during their Tuesday evening meeting.

Fees for use of the Hansford and Spearman Emergency Medical Service ambulance was increased from \$231 to \$425 for basic life support service to Amarillo Hospitals and from \$301.50 for advanced life support service to a fee of \$475.

In addition, personnel were awarded an increase in out of pocket expenses for an ambulance run from \$15 to \$20 for members and from \$35 to \$40 for paramedics on the advanced life support runs.

The commission also ratified an agreement with Hansford county for detention services at the Hansford county jail.

The contract remains the same as it has for the past two years, reports Jim

Murray, city manager. The fee is \$7 per day plus \$3 for meals for each prisoner the city houses in the county jail facilities.

In awarding payment of community projects for the Spearman Volunteer Fire Department, Spearman city fathers agreed to pay \$5 per man up to a maximum of six men each time the SVFD placed flags on poles up and down state hwy 207 and Main Street in Spearman.



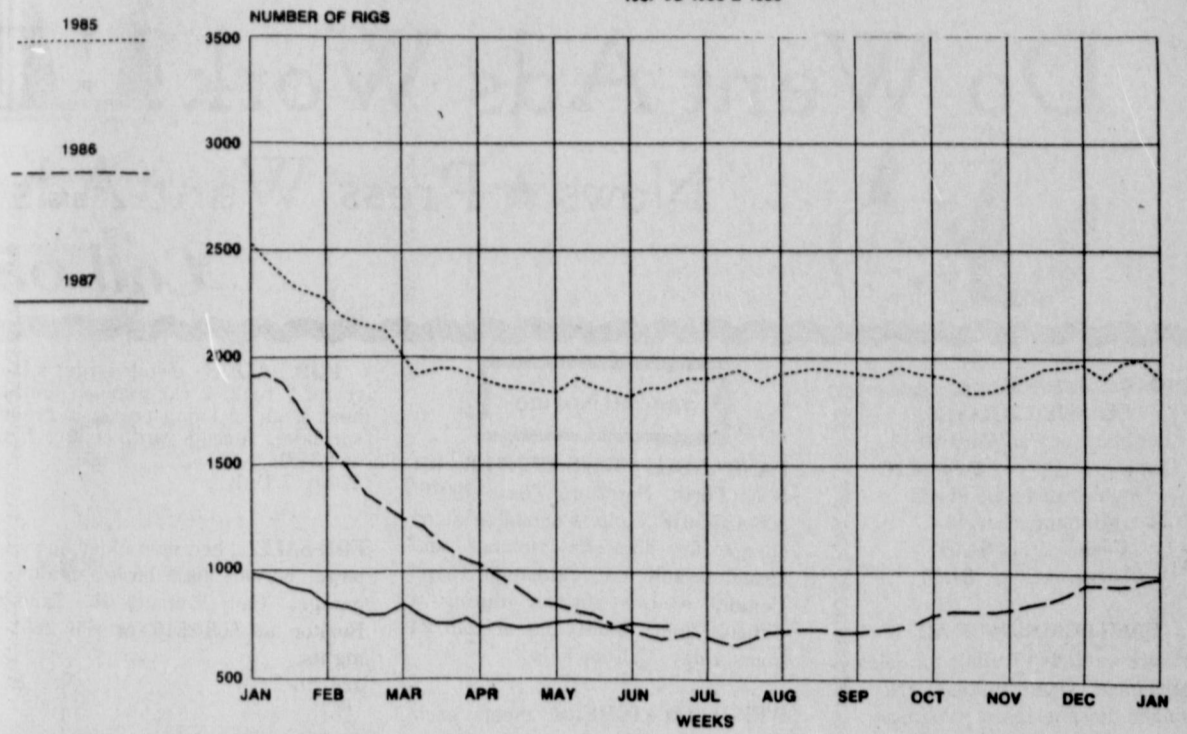

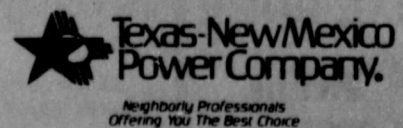
