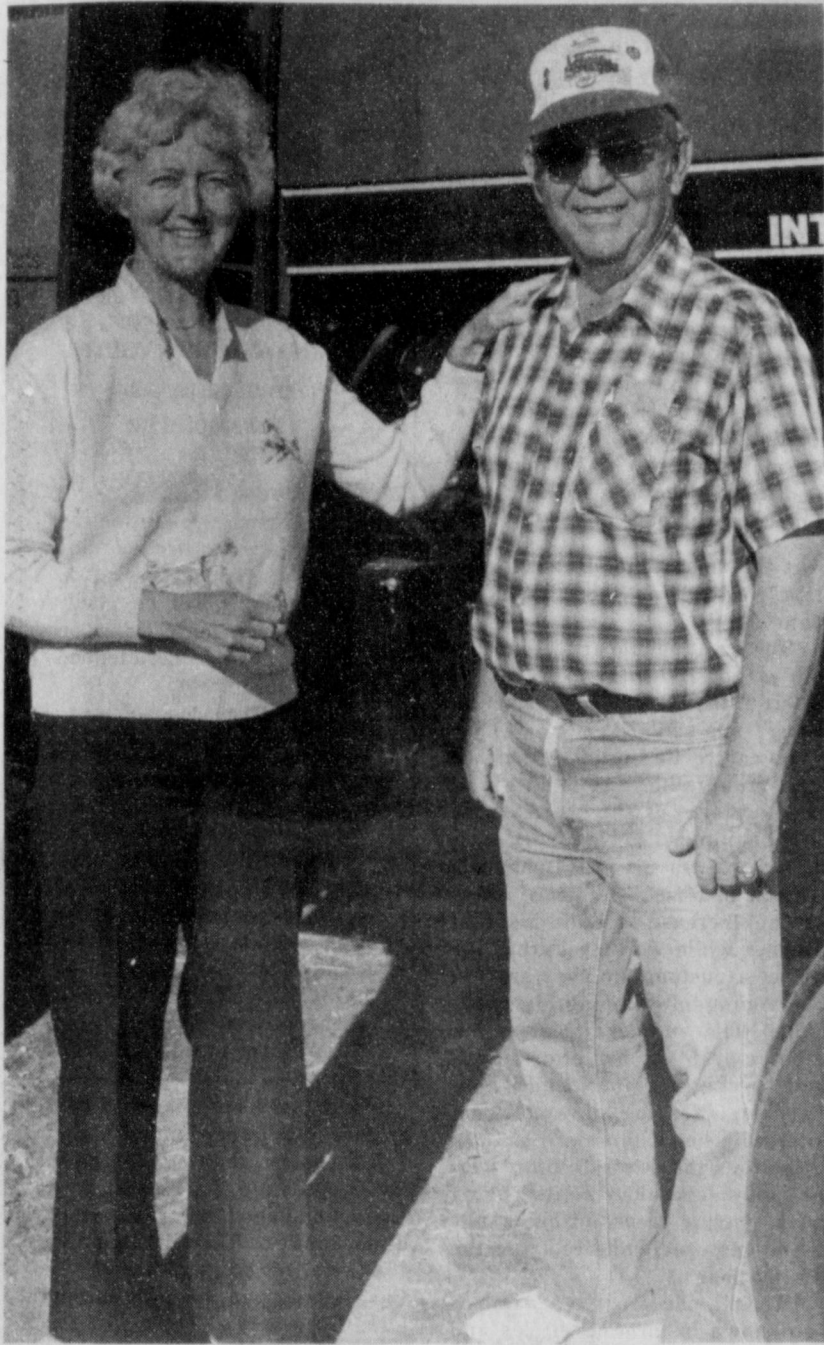

# Case descendant visits Hansford

Nowhere is family heritage more important than it is in Texas -- and especially so here in Hansford County at the very top of the Lone Star State -- so when the great-granddaughter of J.I. Case, the founder of today's corporate giant, visited in Spearman this weekend, that visit drew some attention.

Helen Case Brigham spent the weekend in Hansford County as the personal guests of the J.D. Wilbanks in Spearman.

Wilbanks, a long-time collector of antique tractors, boasts a Case steam-driven tractor and it was one of the featured items this past weekend at the Tenth Annual Golden Spread Antique Machinery Association Show held in Perryton.

The long-time Hansford resident first met J.I. Case's great-grand-

daughter at another antique machinery show -- this one in Pawnee, Ok. -- about three years ago.

J.D.'s love of antique machinery quickly won the respect of the Case founder's descendant and a friendship between the two has grown over the years.

Helen Case Brigham -- Helen, if you please -- is understandably proud of her heritage and stories concerning her great-grandfather are well-known by those within that select family which comprises antique machinery associations.

Helen is becoming quickly known in those same circles as she makes at least four trips each year to events such as that held in Perryton this past weekend.

She has become an almost one-woman walking encyclopedia

of J.I. Case -- the man, the machines which bear his name, and those early beginnings before the Case family quietly pulled out as the company went public in an ever-expanding and growing world marketplace.

A self-appointed ambassador for the Case family, Helen travels across the United States now attending antique machinery shows -- a situation which began out of curiosity and now continues out of family pride.

"I didn't even know there were shows such as this until my husband showed me a picture out of a newspaper one day," she remembers. "I went, mostly out of curiosity, to see what it was all about."

What she found was a family of

antique machinery collectors -- a special family which is strong throughout the United States. And, once she introduced herself as the great-granddaughter of the venerable Case founder, her success was instantly assured.

Much like her namesake, Helen has a special love of machinery . . . and her early years in Iowa and then on a south Texas ranch helped to reinforce that feeling. Today that love has grown and matured into a deep respect not only for machinery, but for her family lineage and those people today who collect and restore those early-model vintage machines which helped propel J.I. Case and his company to success.

## Spearman ISD trustees to look at non-binding referendum election

What's in a name? The immortal bard, William Shakespeare claimed "A rose by any other name would smell as sweet".

Of course, I can't help but wonder how he would have felt if he'd been called Willie or Billy.

It seems as if I have been inundated lately, by incorrect names and -- once again -- the many anomalies of the English language.

I remember a scene where a foreigner, eating at an American restaurant for his first time, took a tea bag and painstakingly tore it apart to put the tea in his cup.

His American friend explained to him that the bags were intended to remain intact, a convenience made possible by great American ingenuity.

Smiling both his understanding and his appreciation, the foreigner picked up a baglet of sugar and dropped it whole into his cup of tea.

The American condition of utilizing metaphorical cliches is another great past time if you're into that sort of thing.

Here you have to be careful, however, or you'll get into the nebulous land of puns, yet another atrocity of American use of the English language.

If you're a devout punner, look up a series of books by Florida's Piers Anthony concerning the magical land of Xanth. The series --

there's four or five books -- is a collection of puns brought to life from beginning to end.

Read it for sheer entertainment. There is simply no other reason for doing it. Forget redeeming social values, forget symbolism, forget any and everything your high school English teacher ever told you.

If you're into puns, this series of books will really "get your motor going".

How can a foreigner hope to understand Americans when they tend to translate everything we say literally.

Can you imagine what someone from France would think if he overheard a conversation where one participant says, "Boy, I bet that opened a can of worms."

Why not? He might think. After all, he's been to an American supermarket and everything under the sun is in cans . . . on the shelf . . . so why not worms?

Getting back to the "what's in a name theme", one cannot really imagine the power in the imagery of a word.

Getting held up at gunpoint is a frightening thought. But, what if we didn't call a gun by that name? What if it were called, say, a wuffle instead?

Getting held up at wufflepoint sounds comical.

Look what Johnny Cash did with the recording of "A Boy Named Sue". He made several thousand dollars without a doubt, but the song carries the moral to this column.

Be proud of your name and, for goodness sake, watch out for metaphors in your speech -- especially around foreigners. You never know when one might take you literally.

With the terrorism in today's world, painting the town red could carry an entirely different connotation.

It's a change of pace and a welcome one if Spearman ISD board members decide to allow voters a chance at a non-binding referendum on the construction of a new junior high building.

After all, how often does a person get a chance to tell a politician which direction to go?

All kidding aside, the non-binding referendum is a good thing for the people. It gives each voter opportunity to state their opinion without having to worry about whether that decision will become, so to speak, law.

In other words, this is not a fatal decision. More importantly, it allows public input, something which every governing board wishes.

Spearman Independent School District voters may get a chance to express their desires and to point out a direction for school officials to go if the SISD board of trustees elect to hold a non-binding referendum for a proposed junior high building project.

That decision will be made today (Thursday) during a special noon meeting of the school board in the board room at Spearman High School.

School officials will go over yet another series of proposals by Andrews architect Larry Donham. The new proposals came about when trustees balked at the first series of ideas presented by the architect.

Those proposals ranged in price from just under \$2-million to slightly over \$5-million and carried plans for additions to the elementary building to demolition and rebuilding the east wing of the junior high structure to complete demolition of the junior high building and completely new construction. One proposal included a new competition basketball gym to be built on the senior high campus.

Trustees then instructed Donham to return to the drawing board to incorporate ideas from one plan into another and so on. These latest plans will be presented to the board today.

Trustees will try to narrow the proposals down to two or three of the better suggestions, then may decide to allow SISD voters to voice their opinion by calling for a special, non-binding referendum.

The referendum would allow voters to view the proposals and vote for the plan they feel would be best suited to the needs of the community.

"What we really need is an idea from the community as to what direction they would like us to go."

Spearman businesses which have been in operation for 25 years or more will be recognized this Friday morning at the Spearman Chamber of Commerce's quarterly breakfast meeting.

notes one board member. "I feel it's important that the community have a voice in this decision."

Trustees will first decide whether to call for the non-binding referendum. If that decision is affirmative, then trustees will have to set a date for the special non-binding vote.

Logistically, the referendum probably cannot be held prior to the end of October or the first part of November.

Another topic of Thursday's special board meeting will be discussion of a possible bond election date. That could be held as early as December this year.

SISD board members have been studying the junior high campus continually since January this year when conditions at the campus became the focal point of complaints by parents of children attending the school.

"The board has been aware of the problem for some time," reports Larry Butler, SISD school superintendent. "In January, we ordered an engineering study to give us an idea as to the extent of those damages."

When the engineering studies were returned, the assessment was strong enough to cause school officials to close the use of the top floor on the east side of the structure.

Since that time, stop-gap repairs

# Lynx go to Stratford for AA district curtain raiser

The Spearman Lynx -- still smarting from a 13-13 tie the week before -- will travel to Stratford Friday to take on the Elks in the district 1-AA curtain raiser for both ball clubs.

Game time for Friday's 1-AA matchup will be 8 p.m. in Elk stadium.

In other district contests this week, area attention will be focused on the Panhandle-West Texas Consolidated contest in Panhandle as the district opener finds the number one and two teams, respectively, vying for supremacy.

Gruver travels to Highland Park in Amarillo while White Deer -- electing to forego an open date in 1987, goes up against 1-A Sunray.

Friday's Spearman-Stratford contest will pit two teams who have eyes on the district crown in a

contest which will pit size against size and match quickness for quickness.

The Elks -- always a tough opponent -- are even more so on their home turf and the team who walks away the victor Friday evening will be the one with the determination to do so.

Meanwhile, the Lynx will be out to eliminate the mistakes -- turnovers and costly penalties -- which plagued them last week against Sunray.

Spearman has dominated their three non-conference foes starting with Memphis of district 2-AA. The Lynx won that contest by a 25-12 count but were still plagued with penalties.

In a storm-abbreviated contest against Hooker, Ok., the Lynx cut down the penalties and rolled up an

impressive first half, 20-0, win over the Bulldogs of Oklahoma.

In the season opener against Memphis, the Lynx were flagged nine times for 86 yards while in the 20-0 blanking of Hooker, Spearman received only three penalty markers for a total of 45 yards.

Last Friday against Sunray, Spearman was called 13 times and penalized 135 yards while giving up four turnovers -- two of those led to scores for the Bobcats.

In a game where the Lynx are matched pound for pound on the line and step for step in the backfield, the winning team will be the one with the fewest mistakes.

Stratford, coming off a 5-4-1 record of a year ago, has eight offensive regulars back and six

defensive returnees. Running out of a Wing T offense, the Elks are led by quarterback Doug Pittman, a 157-pound senior who runs the option well and who likes to throw the ball.

Also in the backfield and running strong for the Elks is 145-pound senior Parker Johnson. The Stratford starter is also one of Stratford's better defensive players.

Runningback Gared McBryde, a 158-pound senior, is their workhorse both offensively and defensively. He's quick to hit the hole from his offensive set and is their leading tackler on defense from his monster position.

Tightend Mike Kirkwood, a 165-pound senior, also plays middle

linebacker in the Elks' "27" defense. A strong blocker, the Elks like to run behind him. He's a capable receiver as well.

have been made to the building. Those repairs were completed just prior to the start of the 1987-88 school year and the top floor is back in use again for a time.

The quickly deteriorating condition of the 1923 structure has come about due to a series of renovations which removed bearing walls then added concrete floors to the second floor.

Those floors are braced by steel beams which sit on a 3-inch lip of brick columns along the outside walls. The weight load is the main suspect in the extreme bowing of the outside walls of the building.

The make-shift summer repairs consist of steel rods being placed first at an angle, then parallel to the east wall throughout the east wing of the complex.

Steel plates were then welded into place on the outside walls of the structure to give added stability to the structure.

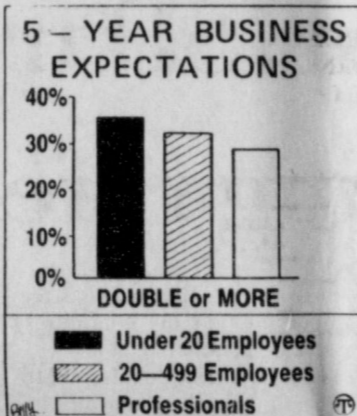

around visiting people and telling them about the riches of our country and about those men and women who laid the foundation for us," she notes.

Those visits, however, take a certain toll and -- now in her retirement years -- requires the support of her husband, Arthur P. Brigham, who often accompanies her on these trips across the United States.

"I wouldn't be able to go to these different shows without his support," she declares. "His support and understanding makes it all possible."

After attending that first show, Helen began receiving letters from antique machinery buffs which urged her to attend other shows.

Her own natural inclinations, combined with those requests, provided the impetus for those visits.

She now travels across the United States and, in fact, is secretary for an antique machinery association which helps promote all antique machinery, not just that of the Case family.

"The spirit we've seen has been wonderful," Helen reports. "I felt as if I was going through some purposeful exercise."

Today she and her husband author and publish a quarterly antique machinery bulletin which is included as a part of the membership fees in the association she helped to form.

Membership is open to anyone and everyone who shares that common love for antique machinery. For those interested, membership fees are \$15 for individuals and \$20 for family.

To become a member, write to Mrs. Brigham at 204 East Melbourne Avenue, Silver Spring Maryland, 20901 and include a check or money order for the appropriate membership.

While she has not been officially recognized by today's International-Case conglomerate, she has certainly caught their attention.

Today, she is a stockholder in the

company and has made several acquaintances within the corporate hierarchy of the company. They know of her travels and have heard, on several occasions her feelings on today's company.

"It's important to me that nothing be done to impinge on the name of J.I. Case," she declares.

And, while the corporate giant has never officially recognized her efforts, they are cognizant of what she is doing and they make sure that, where ever she goes, a new Case prototype -- many times a machine which hasn't even gone into manufacture -- is on hand at the different locations she manages to make each year.

At the same time, Helen downplays her roll at these different events.

"The great people are the people who've got and either kept up or restored the machinery over the years," she smiles.

She can recite the history of her great-grandfather and is an excellent storyteller as she shares those early beginnings in New York state through his travels to Wisconsin.

It was in Wisconsin where J.I. -- Jerome Increase -- built his first thresher while working during the day as a custom thresher and, in the evenings developing his own.

She tells of her great-grandfather's pride in his efforts and, later, in the machines which bore his name, sharing several anecdotes with her listeners.

She tells the stories quietly with the only embellishments being quick, darting moves of her hands as she gestures while relaying the information.

After all, the J.I. Case name is well-known in farming circles and the story and legacy behind the

### Teen center holds special fund drive

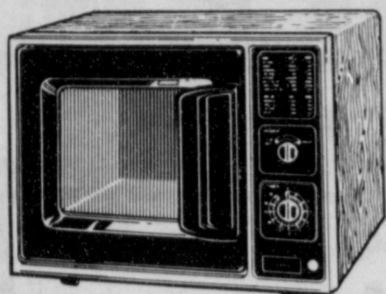
A special fund raiser for the Spearman Hideout Teen Center will be held Saturday with a special "garage" sale at the group's Main Street location.

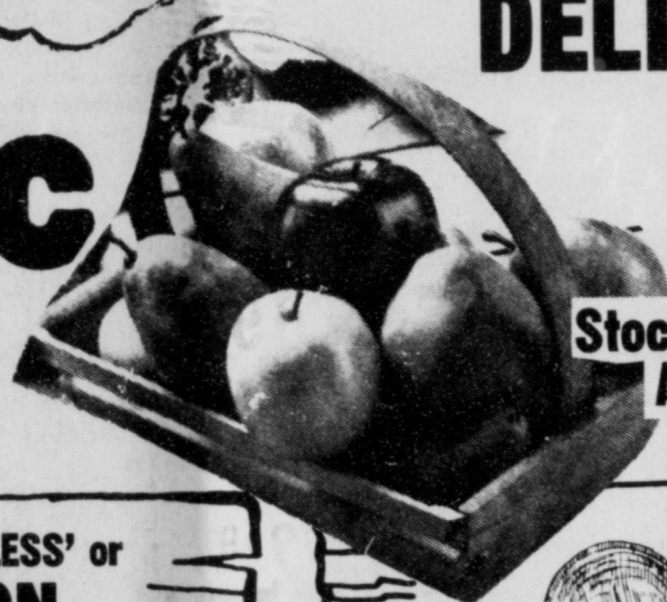

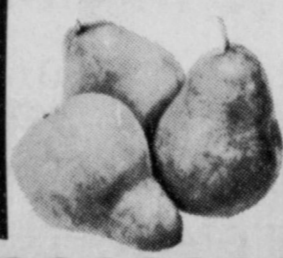

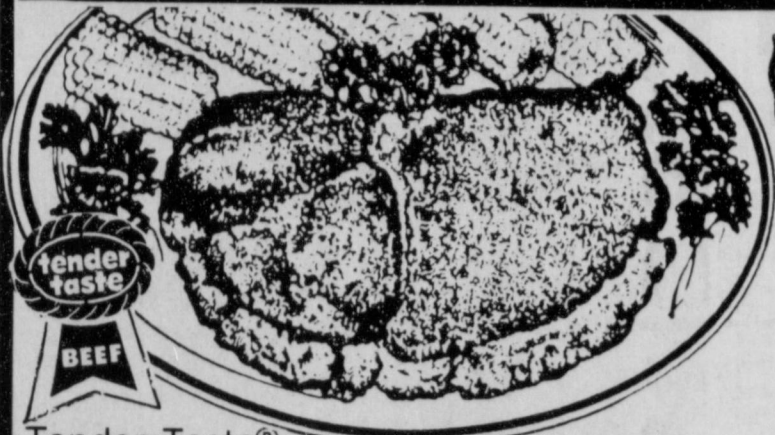

Hansford county commissioner Val Winger of Gruver has been named by Gov. Bill Clements to a Panhandle Federal Grant Review committee.

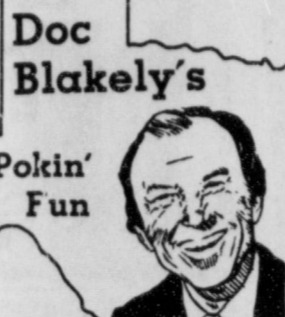
The 12-member Panhandle Regional Community Development Review Committee will consider requests for Community Development Block Grant funds for the geographical region served by the local Council of Governments. The panel is made up of elected governing officials from participating subdivisions, which generally are towns, and smaller cities and counties.

In addition to Winger, appointees are Randall County Judge Charlie M. Purcell, who was named chairman; Borger City Councilman Meryl Barnett; Silvertown Alderman John Bowman; Ochiltree County Commissioner Larry Hardy.

Also, Roberts County Commissioner Don Morrison; Hemphill County Commissioner Kenneth Osborne; Dimmitt Alderman Wayne Proffitt; Carson County Commissioner Jerry Strawn.

Because members serve staggered terms, Bowman, Hardy and Proffitt will serve through Dec. 31, 1987, while the terms of the other appointees will end Jan. 1, 1989.

The state's larger cities, such as Dallas, Houston, San Antonio and El Paso, and Harris, Bexar and Tarrant Counties are direct recipients of federal funds, and, thus, do not participate in the state program.
