County fair opens Thursday

The fourth annual Hansford County Fair will unfold this Thursday, Friday and Saturday at the Hansford County Barn in Spearman with exhibits ranging from photography to arts and crafts.

The fair opens at 3 o'clock Thursday afternoon with non-perishable exhibits being accepted. Art, clothing, needlework, crafts and hobbies, toile painting, canned goods and photography exhibits will be brought in to be set up that day.

On Friday, the barn will be open to receive horticulture, flowers,

field crops and baked goods from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m.

Beginning at 11 o'clock Friday, all exhibits will be judged. The judging will continue on through the afternoon until all categories are finished, reports Burt Williams, county extension agent.

Then, at 4 o'clock that afternoon, the exhibits will be opened to the public. A concession stand will be provided. The fair will close at 7 p.m.

Saturday the fair will open at 8:30 a.m. with dog show registration until 9 that morning. The dog show will begin at 9:30 a.m.

The lamb and steer show will begin at 11 a.m. Saturday -- one of the fair's many highlights.

New to this year's fair will be a talent show contest beginning at 2:30 Saturday afternoon.

Exhibitors are urged to become familiar with the general rules governing the fair and the specific rules regarding the category in which items are entered.

"It's really a shame when someone enters something and is disqualified because of a rule technicality," notes a judge of one of the exhibits. "There are general rules governing all exhibits and then there are specific rules for each category."

Beginning at 4 p.m., exhibitors will begin picking up their entries.

The clinic will run from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. with vaccines for childhood diseases such as polio, diphtheria, lock jaw, whooping cough, measles, rubella and mumps being offered.

The Texas Department of Health is charging a fee to help with the cost of the program, but the amount charged will be based on family income, size and the ability to pay, notes DeSha.

Lynx looking for 2nd 1-AA win . . .

Bucks visit for homecoming

Like the predator for which they're named, the Spearman Lynx will be stalking the White Deer Bucks, seeking their second district 1-AA conference win when they play host to White Deer this Friday evening in a homecoming clash in Lynx Stadium.

Game time for the 1-AA gridiron tilt is set for 8 p.m. with pregame ceremonies for the homecoming celebration beginning at 7:30.

Friday's matchup pits the Lynx -- 3-0-1 for the year and 1-0 in district play -- against a steady White Deer crew who has managed to build a 3-1 non-conference won-loss record.

This will be the first district game of the 1987 season for the Bucks who opted to dispense with an open date this year. Instead, they played Sunray to a 33-7 win last Friday evening in White Deer.

The Lynx -- who finally managed to erase mistakes and tone down penalty yardage against them -- come into Friday's homecoming clash fresh off a heady 37-8 district win over Stratford.

But Spearman will be going into the 1-AA contest hobbled slightly by key injuries to their backfield. Near the end of the Stratford game, Lynx head coach Don Mullins and company were down to two backs

to run their patented veer offense. Listed as questionable for Friday's game are Stan Brandt who

SISD officials discuss bond election dates

Spearman Independent School District officials met in a special session Tuesday morning to officially rescind an earlier vote to seek a public referendum on a proposed junior high building project.

The decision to go with a new proposal from an Andrews architect was made last week in another special session. Trustees were unable to vote on the matter since it was not included on that meeting's agenda.

In addition to the official vote, school officials also discussed the pending bond issue vote and looked at the time frame for an election.

The earliest vote could be held would be Dec. 8 or Dec. 15 due to time requirements of state law.

Trustees will meet with a bond specialist at their next regular board meeting which is scheduled for Monday, Oct. 12.

"We'll have to keep our mind on the game this week," observes the Lynx head coach. "White Deer feels like they can make it into the playoffs."

That feeling stems from six offensive and seven defensive returning starters from last season's 4-6 team.

Bart Thomas (160, junior) runs the Buck's wing-T offense and has proven an effective weapon on counters and through the air for

34,500 statements in mail for 1988 taxes

Over 34,500 tax statements from Hansford County and the Hansford County Appraisal District will be mailed today (Thursday) to county property owners as taxing agencies in Hansford County go into the 1987-88 fiscal year.

October 1 is the first day of the fiscal year for all taxing jurisdictions in the county -- except for the three school districts which began their fiscal years on Sept. 1.

County property owners will be receiving statements totaling over \$7.87 million from taxing jurisdictions serviced by the two tax collection agencies in Hansford.

Hansford County -- which serves as collector for the county, the Hansford Hospital District, North Plains Water District and the Palo Duro River Authority -- will be mailing out 11,454 statements which total just over \$3-million.

And the Hansford Appraisal District -- which serves as collector for Spearman, Gruver and Pringle-Morse Consolidated ISD's in addition to the cities of Spearman and Gruver -- will be mailing 23,119

City sets 87-88 tax rate at 69.5 cents

The Spearman city council officials set the 1987-88 tax rate at 69.5 cents per \$100 valuation during their regular meeting Tuesday evening in the Spearman City Hall.
During Tuesday's meeting, the council also approved the 1987-88 budget, okayed revenue sharing expenditures and established new rates for garbage collection done by the city.
The new rates are 12 percent higher than those currently charged and will be assessed on all levels -- residential, commercial and industrial.
The residential rates will go from \$5.35 per month to \$6 and the commercial and industrial rates -- which are based on the number of

containers being utilized by the business or firm -- will experience the same 12 percent increase.
The Spearman city council also voted to update the city's retirement program for employees by authorizing updated service credits and by authorizing changes to bring the program in line with new legislation recently passed.
Roy Bulls of Spearman and Wayne Garrett of Gruver were again nominated by the city council as board members for the Hansford County Appraisal District.
Dr. Romeo Sangalang will take over duties as city health officer, replacing Dr. Fred Taylor who has resigned to return to his native land in Canada, following action by the city council Tuesday night.

The backfield talent lies in fullback Lane Cross (170, senior), a hard running back who is a breakaway threat in addition to being a sound all around football player.
Thomas likes to single out tight end Todd Haynes (185, senior) who has become White Deer's number one receiver in 1987.

In addition to his solid blocking abilities, Haynes also possesses good speed when catching the ball.
Anchoring the line for the Bucks is guard Brady Burns (201, junior) and tackle Lee Barrett (207, junior) with the talented White Deer backfield finding easy running room behind their blocks.
Defensively, the Lynx will have to be aware of Mark Greene (165, senior), the Buck's defensive leader from his linebacker position.
"As a team they have good quickness and a lot of strength," Mullins sums up his discussion of White Deer. "We'll have to be in top form to stay on the field with them."

Last Friday's game against Stratford saw Shawn Cook leading the team's defensive efforts with a score of 73.

Offensively Brett Davis, Monty Ross and James Tindell scored the highest for Spearman in the Lynx-Elk contest.

Davis scored 97 percent, Ross scored 96 percent and Tindell finished the night with a 93 percent score to lead Spearman.

As a team, the Lynx averaged 77 percent in coach Mullins and company's complicated scoring chart.

Mrs. Ora Lee Blackburn and Bodil Stackhouse attended the Homecoming activities last Friday at Vinita, Okla.

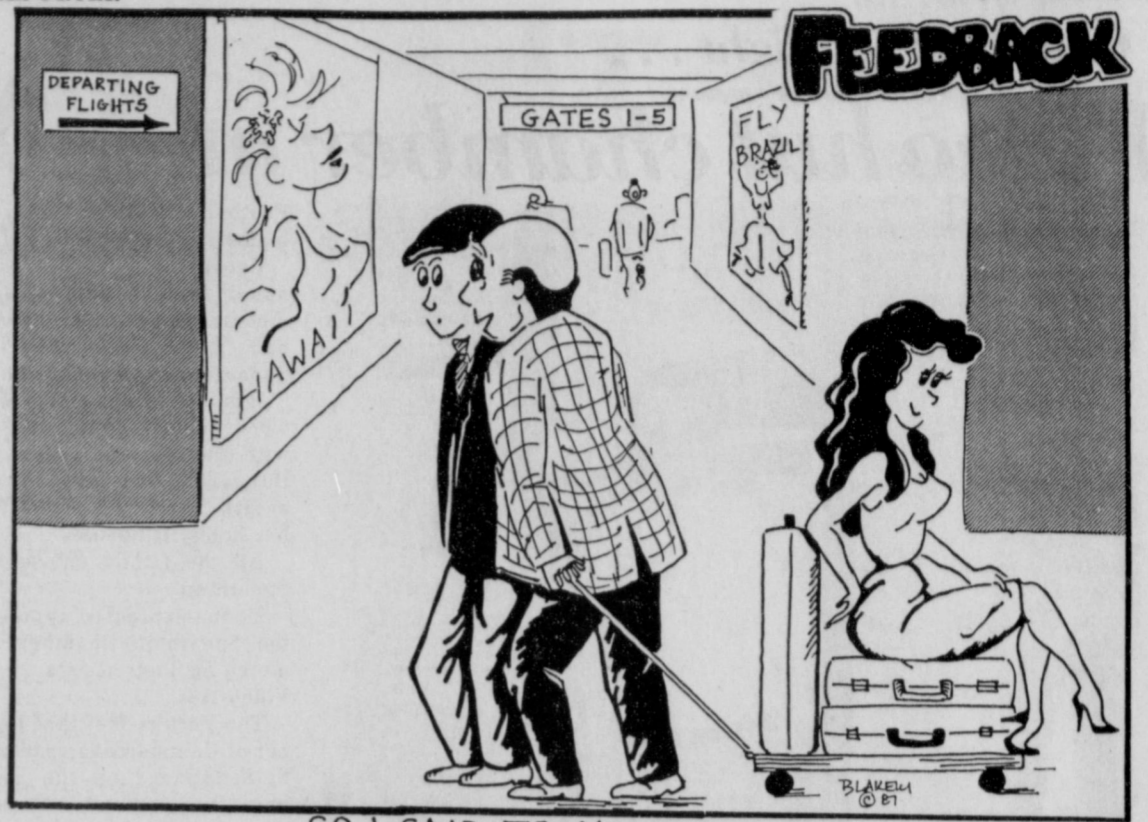

 Oil prices will continue their gradual increase, climbing to \$22 to \$24-a-barrel by early 1988 and to \$26 to \$28-a-barrel by mid 1989. T. Boone Pickens, Jr. said in a keynote address to the International Association of Drilling Contractors.

Pickens, general partner of Mesa Limited Partnership, the nation's largest independent oil and gas producer, also made predictions on natural gas prices, basing them on elimination of the "gas bubble" by the winter of 1989-1990. He said the supply and demand of domestic natural gas will come into balance and that natural gas will not continue to sell at a discount to oil.

"Historically oil sells on a BTU basis at a six to eight multiple over gas," he commented. "Currently,

oil is 14 times the price of gas because of the deliverability overhang."

Pickens predicted that spot gas could be at \$1.75 per MCF this winter and over \$3.00 per MCF by mid 1989.
