Diseases can be
reduced by diet

Individuals can substantiall reduce risks of heart disease, through specific changes in eating habits, according to a nationa report released recently.
Dr. Mary Kinney Sweeten,
nutrition nutrition specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service committee has offered this prescription for lowering chronic -Eat less fat and more fruits, vegetabies and the committee which included Texans, completed its three-year study earlier this month. The report complements the Surgeon General's Report on
Nutrition and Health released las year, and is the only othe comprehensive scholarly attemp to examine simutaneously all
known dietary associations with known dietary associations with
chronic disease in an attempt to chronic disease in an attempt to ducing health risks.
Sweeten said the committee recommended that the public: - Reduce total fat consumption saturated fatty acids to less than saturated fatty acids to less tha
10 percent of calories, and choles terol to less than 300 milligrams daily. -Eat five or more servings of a combination of fruits and vege
tables, especially green and yellow vegetables and citrus fruits. Also, eat six or more servings of starches and other complex carbohydrates daily to then 55 percent of calories. -Maintain only a moderate intake of protein. Meet the Recom mended Dietary Allowance (RDA) or proteins each day, but in doing so do not exceed 1.6 grams per
kilogram of body weight, which is twice the RDA guideline
Sweeten said the committee teport advised people to balance their food intake and physical activity to $m$.
body weight.

- 'Individuals will need to devot more time and attention to thei daily diets, and professionals will need to provide guidance to th public in diet planning," she said.
