## Referendum

| All eligible livestock producers in Hansford County are reminded that they will need to register June 6-17 if they are to vote in the forthooming producer referendum on the Beef Research and Information program July 5-15, says County Extexsion Agent Ronnie Wood. <br> County offices of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) will conduct the registration and referendum. <br> The law requires that beef producers register at least two weeks before the referendum in order to vote. <br> Producers eligible to reg. ister and vote are those who owned cattle during the past 12 months, prior to the referendum, including $4 \cdot \mathrm{H}$ and FFA members, men and women. <br> If the vote is favorable, a Beef Board will be appointed. This board is to consist of not more than 68 memof not more than 68 mem- | bers, selected from the beef producer ranks by the Secretary of Agriculture as nominated by their producer organizations. Representation on the board would be proportional by their production in each state or goographaic area. <br> If the program becomes operational, the Agricultural Marketing Servire of the USDA would monitor it, or serve in effect as a referee, to assure that it stays within the legislative authority, and accomplishes the goals of the program as voted on by producers in the referendum. <br> Should producers approve the program, the initial board meeting might be held in the late fall of 1977. <br> Thus, it likely would be 1978 before a research and information program for cat- tie and beef could be fully tie and beef could be fully ments begin on sales of cattle. |
