A male child, born at the present time in the local area, can be expected to put in fewer years at work during his lifetime than was the case a generation or two ago.

His young sister, however, has the prospect of being on the labor force much longer than her mother or grand-mother were.

That is the trend. It has been developing nationally for a number of years, according to Government statis-

ding to Government statistics.

Currently, as a result, American men are spending smaller and smaller portions of their lives at work while women are spending greater.

The American Coucil of Life Insurance reports, based upon Labor Department studies, that the work-life expectancy of women has increased by about 66 percent since 1950. During the same period, the expectancy of men has dropped nearly 4 Adapting these overall findings to Hansford County, local women, who represent 50 percent of the population, are putting in an average of

25.1 years of work during their lifetime, compared with 15.1 years in 1950.

The average working life of the male population, on the other hand, has decreased from 41.5 to 39.8.



1 DISHWASHER. Load your dishwasher to capacity before running it. Turn off the dishwasher after the final rinse cycle instead of allowing it to run completely through the drying cycle.

**2** RANGE. Be certain you choose the proper size burner for each pan. The pan should be the same size or slightly larger than the surface unit. Use the least amount of water possible when cooking vegetables. Check to see that all burners are turned off when you're through.

**3 OVEN.** Cook several dishes at once wher baking. Avoid the temptation to open the oven door for a "peek" — each time you do your heat loss can be 20%. Preheat only

the required amount of time. Don't line your oven with foil — it interferes with the heating process.

4 REFRIGERATOR/FREEZER. Keep both your refrigerator and freezer full, without overcrowding. A half-empty unit uses more electricity because air is harder to keep cold than chilled foods and liquids.
