\section*{Tech Constitution Is For Students}

STUDENT GOVERNMENT at Texas Tech is in the form of a Student Council which is made up of four executive positions and representative positions from the various schools.

In the executive positions this year are Donnell Echols, president; David Steinman, vice president; Dan Howard, business manager and Gail Petersen, secetary.

With any government, there must be a constitution by which, and through which, the governing body must act. At Tech it is called the "Constitution of the Student Association of Texas Technological College.'

The constitution is the strongest point of goyernment, because from it come the powers and duties of the entire governing body.

One of the main functions of the Constitution of the Student Body at Tech is the specification of duties of the Student Council. For those who aren't up on their student government, here are the duties:

\section*{The Council shall exercise regular legislative pow-} rs including -
2. Filling vacancies in office provided by this Constitution except where other procedure is specified;
b. Supervising elections;
c. Making all rules and regulations for carry ing out the provisions of this Constitution
d. Plan Student Council sponsoring activitie and co-ordinate all activities of the Spring Festival;
e. Making all rules and regulations concerning use of posters and similar items for use of publicity;
f. Co-ordinate student activities at Homecoming.

These prescribed duties are much more important than they appear on the surface in that they cover many underlying factors which arise daily, cover many underlying factors which arise
These are factors too numerous to mention.

It is the duty of each student, since it is his Constitution, to become informed of it and its working, and also to use the Student Council to gain a better place for the students at Tech. Don't hesitate to exercise your right as a member of the Student Association when something arises.
