### Fewer But Better

Last year 300 outstanding students were recognized at annual formal recognition services. In this Sunday's service, although Tech's enrollment has increased, only 190 students are to be recognized. This decrease in honor students might make us feel as though our college is loosing all her mental giants.

There is a logical explanation for all this however. Last year's honor students were chosen only because their name had appeared on the honor roll. This year, requirements have become much stiffer. A few of them are: 1) Students were chosen upon the basis of grades and percentile standings during the past two semesters (except freshmen, who were chosen on fall semester grades). 2) Those to be honored were in the upper 3 per cent of their class provided that none had F or Inc. They are to have a grade point average of 2.25 and could never have been on diciplinary probation. 3) Those chosen must have carried a minimum of 12 hours each semester.

In the next few years requirements may be placed ever higher and may be based on four years work. This system will encourage us all to do better work throughout our years in college.—H. B.


