Texas Tech has to solve its problems the hard way. Should the legislature appropriate funds for a new building, whether an agriculture building, home economics building or a student center, the problem of more classroom and office space could readily be solved. When the new library building was opened it provided for 13 classrooms and 6 offices, but these new additions gave only temporary relief. Now the question is how to adequately take care of the 11 per cent increase in enrollment and the new additions to the faculty.

Professors, instructors, student assistants, and NYA employees are stuffed into little cubbyhole offices all over the campus. Furniture, book shelves and chairs are jimmed together, and over the jumbled voices of the office force, it is impossible for any teacher to give satisfactory service to students or adapt his skill proficiently to his job.

In the departments of English, mathematics, economics, history, government, education, business administration, and psychology, to name only a few, the sections are so large that students cannot cultivate personal interest in their subjects, and it is almost impossible for the instructor to acquaint himself with more than a mass of faces. Also in these large sections, the student's attention is so easily distracted that a sincere effort to master the subject cannot be developed, and soon the professor becomes harassed and often inconsiderate of his pupils.

Paul Gallico, famous sports writer, declares that traditional rivalry is the essence of success in game attendance. Nothing pleases the gladiatorial complex of a public like seeing two furning antagonists meet in midfield with short swords or footballs to "wipe each other out." Last week SMU and TCU, both secondrate teams in their conference, drew 18,000 people. Other teams drawing huge crowds because of a traditional rivalry are Texas and Texas Aggies; Rice and Baylor; and Tulane and LSU. In these encounters, regardless of the style of football played, people flock to the gates to gather the spirit emanating from a "grudge fight"—the more ferocious the battle, the greater the gate receipts.

That should be a lesson to Tech. We liquidated our traditional rival some years ago "the hard way." We unwisely cut Hardin-Simmons off our schedule, forgetting that the spirit behind football is its greatest asset.

About 3500 attended Tech's last game of the season. Why? No rivalry. No spirit. No interest. People just don't like to see a football game, they want to see somebody blasted, torn up, mutiliated, all in the name of good old Huddle College.

Schedule games with West Texas college, Wayland, Amarillo Sandies. A grudge fight with Draughons Business college would pack a stadium more than a lackadaisical exhibition of football form where a battered pigskin has to be the center of attention for thousands of spectators.


