

'SUCH APPEALING LITTLE BEGGAR'

CHICAGO, Feb. 21. (P)—Dr. George T. Hanz, 59, a veterinarian, told Municipal Judge Victor A. Kula yesterday that "Spotty" a mongrel dog he had been hired to put to death was "such an appealing little beggar I just couldn't kill it."

Hanz was acquitted of a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses, placed by Mrs. Helen Moderman, 55, who had taken "Spotty" to the veterinarian and gave him \$5 to kill him. Mrs. Moderman said she had given the order in accordance with the dying request of "Spotty's" master, who had feared he might be mistreated.

60 Boosters For Stock Show Will Fly Here

Sixty boosters for the San Angelo Fat Stock Show, which is scheduled for Feb. 27, will arrive in Big Spring by air at 4:40 p.m. Saturday for an overnight stop.

The delegation was to begin today an itinerary covering most cities and towns in this area, and the trips will continue through Sunday.

The arocade is to be composed of 36 private planes, including Beechcraft twin engines, Cessna twin engines, BT-13's Aeronca's and Taylorcrafts.

The Saturday schedule includes stops at Big Lake, McCamey, Fort Stockton, Odessa and Midland, with the entire party to remain overnight in Big Spring.

The local chamber of commerce announced today that hotel accommodations have been arranged for the group, and a local delegation probably will welcome the arocade to the Municipal airport.

Merrill Creighton, local Magnolia distributor, said his company has advised that they are furnishing fuel for the expedition, and all planes will be refueled while in Big Spring.

Power Measure Is Rewritten Changed Rent Rules Allow Petitioning

AUSTIN, Feb. 21. (P)—The job of rewriting a bill by Sen. Gus J. Strauss of Hallettsville which would set up a state commission to regulate public utilities and their rates was in the hands of a senate affairs sub-committee today.

Two weeks were allowed for completing the revision. The action was taken yesterday after attorneys for public utilities companies declared at a public hearing that they did not object to such a commission so much as the language of the bill which they said tied the commission "hand and foot."

J. M. Harris, Austin attorney representing power and light companies, told the committee the 41-page bill could be written in six or seven pages.

"The more you write the more you give the courts to construe," he said. "I would rather be controlled by a commission of six good men given a principle on which to regulate utilities than by an endless volume of laws which tie those men hand and foot."

Representatives Protested Cuts WASHINGTON, Feb. 21. (P)—Texas Representatives in Congress argued strongly against cuts in the National Defense program.

Said Rep. Teague in his first House speech yesterday: "I do not believe in cutting down our farm programs. I do not believe in cutting down on National Defense until international peace is assured."

"I sincerely believe if we had had an adequate national defense program prior to World War II that war would not have happened."

Rep. Thomas was a principal spokesman of the Democratic Party in opposition to the \$6,000,000 budget cut sponsored by the Republicans.

"I yield to no man in my desire for economy," he said, "but I do not believe in weakening our national defense."

Other Texans who argued against cutting the national defense appropriations included Minority Leader Rayburn and Representatives Thomas, Mahon, Lyle and Kilday.

Oil Workers Okay Wage Agreement LOS ANGELES, Feb. 21. (P)—Workers registered 97 per cent approval today of an agreement between two major oil companies and the CIO Oil Workers International Union, and definite end to a strike threat which would have curtailed both transportation and natural gas heating in five Western States appeared assured.

The first group of 1000 workers to ballot on a pact reached yesterday after an all-night conference among federal conciliators, oil company and union negotiators, gave it an overwhelming margin. It provides:

A 10-cents an hour increase on base pay, plus a \$17.70 per month cost of living boost until next Dec. 31. Effective date would be last Jan. 1.

The original union demand was for a 25 cents an hour increase on base pay of \$1.40 an hour. This later scaled down to 22.5 cents. As accepted, it approximates 20.2 cents.

HINDER, NOT HELP THOSE ESCAPEES! LANSING, Mich. Feb. 21. (P)—An \$11,000,000 expense bill hit a snag before it was passed by the Michigan State Senate last night as Republican Senator Edzar F. Down refused to vote money "for expenses of escaped prisoners."

Another Republican, Senator Otto Bishop, hastened to explain the \$778.25 item, smallest on the bill. "That's not to help escaped prisoners," he assured Down. "That's to recapture them."

Boy Grieving For Lost Dog Hangs Himself

CHICAGO, Feb. 21. (P)—Joey Craig's best present last Christmas was a black mongrel puppy, the first dog the 13-year-old boy ever owned.

Joey and "Blackie" were inseparable companions. The boy never went to play in the crowded stockyards district without taking "Blackie." The dog always waited for his young master outside school. Many nights Joey let "Blackie" sleep with him.

Yesterday the dog was missing when Joey came home from school. The boy and his two young sisters and some of his pals searched the neighborhood but they couldn't find "Blackie."

Back home Joey went into his bedroom and told his sisters, Mary, 10, and Norma Jean, 7. "When I knock you come in." After several minutes when there was no knock the girls opened the door and found their brother's body hanging from a closet door. Joey had looped "Blackie's" leash around his neck and attached it to the top of the door.

A fire department inhalator squad worked unsuccessfully to revive the boy. Police notified Joey's parents, Leonard, and Anna, both of whom were at work.
