## Moratorium moves to end war

The Vietnam Moraworium today moves to end the war in Southeast Asia. interests come to mind. Some people complain about Tech's administration cracking down on Moratorium plans. To the contrary, the administration and the Moratorium leaders seem to have worked reasonably well together. The only thing disallowed by the administration was the erecting of white crosses on Memorial Circle. The
main purpose to be served by putting crosses on the Circle would be to attract public attention to Tech's Moratorium.
However, some Moratorium people have been saying that they were not allowed to use the crosses to honor war dead, even though that is the assumed purpose of Memorial Circle. This is partly true. probably feared that the crosses would blatantly offend someone who was opposed to the Moratorium. Though crosses could be used to honor war dead, the Moratorium was most seriously hampered for the realistic reason that the crosses could not be used to attract attention. By and large, the students received all the other things they requested. One major problem was that the administration was having difficulty
communicating to the students because several students came in with various requests, saying they were wanted by the Moratorium.
When the situation was finally corrected, definite
leaders of the Moratorium had been selected, and
those individuals dealt with the administration. The those individuals dealt with the administration. The problems began tocedisappear. Most of the requests
made by the selected leaders were accepted by the administration. Those who think otherwise probably do not know what the Moratorium leaders actually requested.
Now, Tech has an opportunity to take part in the Vietnam Moratorium. It is an acceptable way to
protest the war protest the war
It seems unu
It seems unusual though that so many people are
convinced that they have all the facts needed to dire our country in the conducting of a war. Maybe tha will be a goal of the symposium - give people the facts that they need to make a decision.
But, who will go to the symposiums? Most of the people who attend will probably already hav preconceived ideas about
little from the discussions.
This is not meant to take anything away from the Moratorium. It seems likely, however, that people will not respond rationally to what they hear at the symposiums.
On the other hand, such things as Moratoriums are needed by society just to give people the opportunity
to participate in thought provoking, reasonable. to participate in thought provoking, reasonable

Though we do not agree with many of the Moratorium's proposals, we hope that something will be gained at Tech, due to today's Moratorium.
