Financial Trouble

Toyletdor Endangered

M. L. Pennyworth, vice president and comptroller of Tech, announced today to the Council of Deans that the TOYLETDOR is in grave danger of financial collapse and is to be discontinued at the end of the semester.

THE REPORT came after a thorough investigation of a report submitted by C. J. Sparrow, editor of THE TOYLETDOR, and Wild Wallace Gasser, faculty sponsor of the student publication.

The report stated that several factors had contributed to the financial instability of the paper, the most notable of which is editorial office difficulties with the back shop.

SPARROW STATED in his report that the back shop failed to cooperate at all.

The Tech Press which does the printing for the TOYLETDOR denied any difficulties with THE TOYLETDOR editorial staff. Hingie Spaniels, director of Tech Press, cited the incompetence of THE TOYLETDOR editorial staff and their faculty advisors as the major source of trouble.

"But, we don't have any real gripe against them," he said.

DR. GOOF-OFF GOFORTH III, chairman of the Council of Deans, said that a more thorough investigation will take place in the

near future to determine the origin of the difficulties.

Goforth III said also that there was a possibility of foul play. He said that he strongly suspected the Tech Suitcase Club of putting gum in the press because of the stand THE TOYLETDOR took on the recent Beaver dispute.

Course Offered In Brainwashing

Ex-Soviet Premier Nickle Bulganinsky has finally revealed his reason for silently stepping out as the head of the "Scarlet Regime".

He announced yesterday to Toyletdor Editor C. J. Sparrow that he was coming to Texas Ech to teach a course in "The Scarlet Regime and Its Methods of Brainwashing."

Windmill Waskins, chairman of the Tech Board of Directors and the NCPRSSAPC, said the two

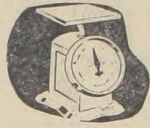
men were chosen because they were head and shoulders above all the other applicants.

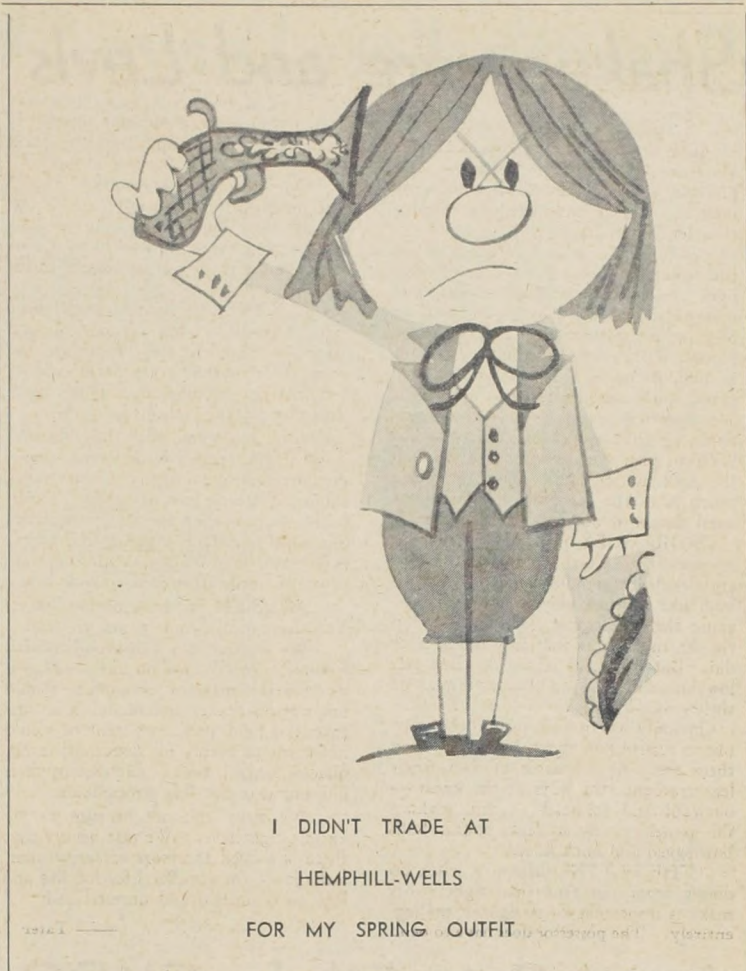

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Basketballers Leave SWC; Form NWC

Texas Ech's Jaded Riders are withdrawing from the Southwest Conference after only one season of basketball competition, head coach Folk "Fidgety" Robertson announced today.

"The SWC members were poor hosts," Robertson commented, explaining that they could have shown some sportsmanship and manners by allowing Ech to take the conference crown in their first season of play.

"But they did everything possible to prevent just that," said Coacher Folk. "Not only did most of 'em bust us one when we played at their place, but a couple of the dogs went so far as to take us on our own court, when they weren't even supposed to be THINKING about winning."

As for the A&M Aggies, who, according to Robertson, pulled the dirtiest trick ever on Ech toward the fins of the season in Municipal Coliseum, the Ridder coach said "It serves 'em right to get those wimmen on their backs. Looking at things realistically, though, the Ridder mentor said, "We can be good next year if Jarrel Miers can learn to hit free throws and Wade Fox can be a little more aggressive under the baskets."

"If Miers can grow a few inches, he might make the BIG all-American team next year," Robertson

said. "We're working on a new 7-foul rule for next season so Fox can get in enough time to letter."

About Hodd Pill and Cholley Lynch, Roberson would not comment. He explained that they had been offered scholarships on the new league team from Sudan, so he didn't know how to make plans for them. "They would probably have made the team next year, too," Roberson offered.

About height, Robertson, a jumping-jack in his own right, said, "With Fat Poakes back and Darrell Dutchins up from the frosh, we'll be fairly well off. If these two boys can grow about a foot by next year, no one can touch us with a ten-foot pole," concluded the Ridder coach.

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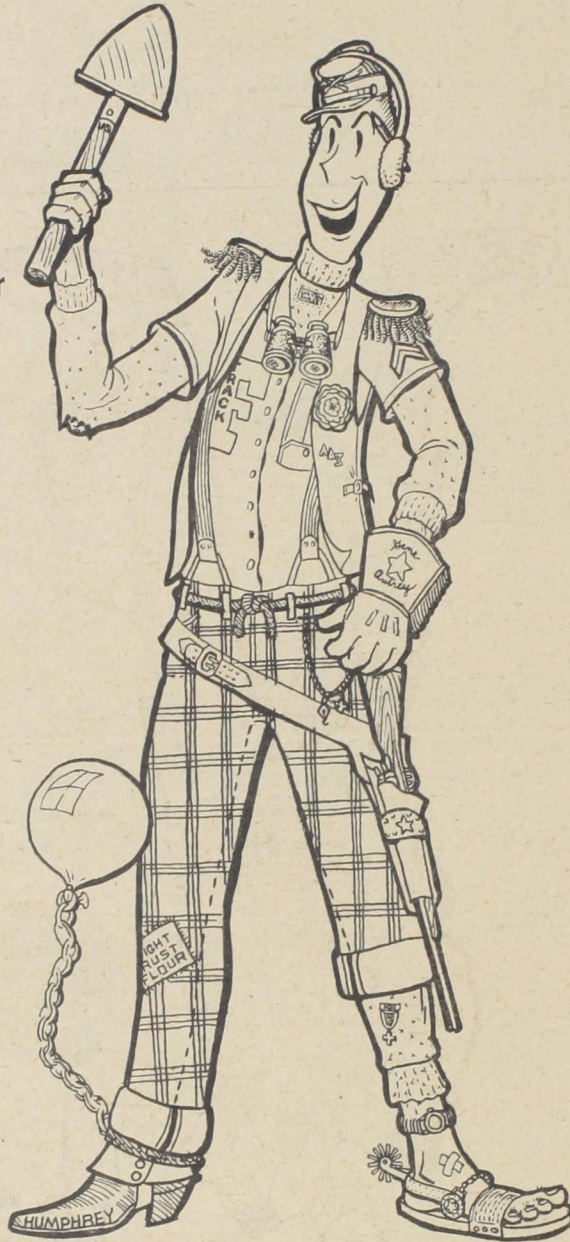
