New Plan Used

Drilling Tech Well

A process seldom used in drilling water wells has been tried at Tech recently to develop a profit-able irrigation well out of a small producer. A process of acidizing the well, used extensively in petroleum production seems to be sincessful in the one it has been tried on, says Dr. A. W. Young, head of the department of agricultural engineering.

The well, located on the northwest section of the campus, was drilled in fine sand which seemed to be almost cemented together and yielded a slow flow of water. After acidizing, the water flow was doubled.

However, this process is effective only in new wells where the flow of the water is partially blocked, says Dr. Young. It will not increase the water supply in a well which is going dry.
