'High Pressure'
It is not the desire of The Toreador to question the motives of students in consenting or refusing to pay the $\$ 15$ health and activity fee at registration.

Those registrants who declined to pay heard enough discussion from the officials who had to approve the nonpayments. Others have debated the question thoroughly enough over coffee cups and in dorm rooms.

The only issue for us to take is the charge, made by many students in recent days, that those who did not wish to pay were high-pressured and confused by the procedure they were required to follow: being interviewed by a Student Council committee, the dean of student life, and finally by the vice president in charge of finance.

The system was carefully planned. It was felt that the continuance of such phases of college life as athletic programs, recreation hall events, and all the clubs and activitie sponsored by the Council rated action -even drastic action.

Those of you who agree do not need to be convinced those who disagree would object to any system.

We think it is a case of the end justifying the means.

## 1925-1953

Recently announced are the retirements of two of Tech's original faculty members: Margaret W. Weeks, dean of the Division of Home Economics, and Dr. Charles B Qualia, head of the department of foreign languages.

In 1925 they came to Tech, a school created for West Texas; in 1953 Dean Weeks will leave Tech, which has de veloped into a school for the state and the nation. Dr Qualia, however, will continue to instruct "indefinitely."
