No navy existed, and the Israeli Air Force consisted of Piper Cub airplanes. It was estimated that Israel would fall in less than 11 days; instead, she won both the war and additional land. Before the declaration date,
Arabs were warned to leave Israel Arabs were warned to leave Israe
to avoid massive bombing by the Arab nations and to increase Arab nations and to increas people were put into small camps and promised that when Israe lost the war, they would be able to return and take any land they wanted. However, the Arab na camps turned into ghettos and a
breeding ground for hatred of Jews. Israel offered to return
these people their land, but most these people their land, but most refused to return to a Jewish state. From out of these ghetto groups.

The Arab nations boycotted Israel and pressured other na tions to do likewise by using oil a In 1967 the Arabs again launch ed a surprise attack, and, again, Israel not only won, but also quadrupled her territory in six days.

As for the Arabs' claims that Israel stole their land, 70 percent of Israel's original land never belonged to Arab landowners but was British public land; the re-
maining 30 percent was purchased at high prices from rich Arab ed at high pri

The United States must retaliate against the Iranian government for seizing American hostages if America is to save face, Their popposition stressed that punishment would benefit Their opposition stressed that punishment would benefit no
one and that good relations should be established with Iran and all countries, since the United States is interdependent with other nations for energy sources and supplies.
"The Iranian crisis was an embarrassmet. The Iranian crisis was an embarrassment for the United
States, a slap across the face, something to bring us to our knees. The United States must find retaliation for the Irania bring them to their kneese either polititally or economically,"
Tom Nichols, teaching assistant in speech communication Tom Nichols, teaching assistant in speech communication.
Nichol's argument was supported by S.M. Kennedy, Tech fessor of political science, who said he preferred taking action against Iran instead of punishing the Iranian government. United States from Iran and take action. The United States can also carefully look at the agreements made with Iran and decide which are justified and which are not." Kennedy said.
