vestigate charges of racial and sexual discrimination and to review the university's firmative Action programs. The Labor Department w

The Labor Department made earlier visit to Tech Jen 5 to "deter of a complaint filed Apr. 14 by the Chicano Law Student Association, Llanas said. Th complaints were filed with the local, regional, state and federal civil rights agen ies, and charge Tech with discrimination in hiring, admissions, promotion, pay, tenure
and recruitment, Victoria Galvan, past-president of the Chicano Law Student Associa tion, said.
The 40-page complaint documents and substantiates the discrimination charges,
Galvan told The University Daily in April. Statistics showing overwhelming favoritism A m whites and males were provided by Tech, she said.
A major reason for filing the complaint is that "Tech is receiving federal money, but Galvan said.
According to statistics in the report, of the 294 professors at Tech, during 1976-77, 2
were women - one less than in 1973. Forty-seven of the 298 associate professors at ech were women -10 more than in 1973.

tity reciving federal funds must employ a certain number or percentage of minorities

If the corporation or institution does not comply with federal Affirmative Action
guidelines, the entity could lose its federal funds. Other organizations that signed the complaint are the National Organization for
