Mike Mansfield (D., Mont.), who has always been an extra-ordinarily fair man, commented just yesterday that he didn't think Goldwater "would be nearly as irresponsible as President as some peoplè believe.

Republicans have some need to get over the messianism which makes them condescend to Democrats and treat them as heretics. Mutual vilification accomplishes nothing and recriminations are a waste of time. dates for public office in this election think of something good to say publicly about his opponent. Let each candidate find something he has in common with his opponent and exploit it into a dialog. Let them comfort the voters jointly whenever possible.

This election is neither the last chance to save America from the onslaught of creeping conspiracy, nor one in which we risk changing to a fascist or military government.
