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Bronx cheers and boos given Tech-Texas Mines game offi-cials reflected at least three things, only one of which is on the credit side. The protracted vociferousness of the verbal attack showed that a minority of the Tech student body is capable of composing a capable cheering body if it so chooses. That is good. But the fact that booing was consistent through the game exemp-lifies two major faults. One is that much game officiating at Tech is poor. The other is that the students not only do not realize the power they can possibly possess by giving the bird to officials, but that many Techsans are not well enough ac-quainted with basketball rules to know when a decision is made correctly. correctly.

No excuse will clear the referees in Friday's tilt. They lost control of the ball game within two minutes of the opening whis-tle and could not regain the mastery an official must exhibit to decently call a game. They too easily shut their eyes on in-tentional fouls and tooted their horns when a foul was acciden-tal. There is every reason to believe they called the game as they saw it. They simply did an awful job of officiating. No spectator should be stopped from booing an official who has made an obvious, costly blunder. But in the Tech-Mines contest the referees were jeered both when the decision could have been called either way and when they were perfectly right. Techsans can offer no excuse for themselves in those instances. When officials are hooted continuously, they shut their ears to the crowd, although the two Friday could have called techni-cal fouls on Tech because of the boos they received. But if spec-tators would hold their ire until an obvious mistake has been made, against either team, the jeers would signify something more than the noise made by a bunch of uniformed on-lookers.
