It might be of interest to note that this derivation from the regular editorial calm is not as radical as our feelings. It is just a heart-to-heart talk with the student body of the Tech about things which should be of interest to every individual in the institution—student or faculty member. The Toreador is eternally referring to the lack of college spirit, and we believe that we are just a little nearer an understanding between the students and the faculty members and officials of the college, and the lack of confidence in the student body on the part of both the students and the faculty members. This opinion has been greatly strength end this week through our efforts to arrange for the "school editions" of The Toreador which will appear in the months of February and March.

Dean Miller of the School of Engineering, when approached concerning the matter, said: "If my boys are not interested, I think it is my duty to get them interested. It is a splendid opportunity for them." We are predicting now that the school of engineering will have the banner issue of the school editions. It is that kind of spirit, and understanding between the faculty and students, that is needed throughout the institution.

However, we did not receive this encouragement from every quarter. It was evident in some instances that confidence in the ability of the students was lacking, and remains to be seen if the understanding mentioned above really exists. We are confident that each of the schools will succeed with its edition if an effort is made, but it is essential that a better understanding exist between the students and the faculty.

We look at this lack of confidence in the light of a challenge to the students to make good in the undertaking. It is quite evident that there is a doubt in the minds of several as to the success of the editions. It is now up to the students to override the indifference that exists, or sustain the skepticism of the pessimists, by failing.

#### COLLEGE TRADITIONS

A great deal is said in this issue of The Toreador about A great deal is said in this issue of The Toreador about college traditions, and mention is made of some of the traditions the Tech should adopt and encourage. This publication has made a weak but an honest effort to encourage proper traditions for this new institution—an institution which is obviously slow in adopting any of the things which would have a tendency to distinguish it from other colleges. As a result of this negligence, many students are likely to leave the institution at the end of the first year without having been brought under the spell of loyalty which a student should feel for his Alma Mater. There are certain traditions, such as the use of the paddle, hair clippers, war paint, instrumments of torture, and other forms of class hazing which will never be permitted in the Tech. But there are many other things which should become as much a part of the institution as the regular curriculum.

A recent issue of Tufts Weekly offered the following comment on the subject of worthwhile traditions:

"Tradition, in the true sense of the word, is a great thing to have in a college. The atmosphere of untiquity and tradition which a school possesses is an asset in creating a spell of loyalty and affection in its students. Tufts should have traditions, but we should not be caught confusing taboos with traditions. The customs and rules of a college should act as positive agents for developing the character of men, not as negative instruments for repressing individuality and setting upfalse values on unsupported foundations.

"Tufs has traditions which are worth perpetuating, and it needs to recognize other traditions of a worthwhile sort... traditions which are part of the history of the college and the ideals of its founders.

"These might be: the pursuance of the aducational ideal in a broad way; the recognition of Tufts as a thoroughly democratic institution, where free expression is to be courted and any repression condemned as hypocrisy; the improvement of the members already here; the tradition of leadership in recognized fields, such as music, the drama, etc. We think of a score of others, and any one of them superior to the whole category of paddle and repression flapdoodle."
