Moving of the stands would cost M estimated $\$ 200,000$ and construction of the concrete stands on $\$ 132,000$. Additional improvements would bring the total cost of enlarging the stadium to approxinately $\$ 942,000$.
Double-decking of the present Construction of a new stadium would cost $\$ 2,500,000$. by the most conservative estimate, according to a report by W. D. Watkins,
chairman of the board's athletic committee. In other action, the board ac-
cepted a herd of "straight bred Anxiety Hereford cattle" from the Jack Frost ranches and accepted owners of Piggly Wiggly Stores, to pay $\$ 900$ a year for a period of 10 years for erection of a basketball scoreboard in the Lubbock
