Q-What right does the IRS have to seize somebody's unpaid taxes?

A-Federal tax law provides several actions that IRS well known Western can take to protect the government revenue when a his obligations voluntarily.

> tax liability. A taxpayer is sent several written notices and afforded conferences. If in response to any one of these notices the taxpayer cooperates, no enforcement action is taken. Only when all attempts to gain the taxpayer's cooperation in regard to the settlement of his tax liability have failed, does IRS initiate action to enforce the

Q-I give my maid lunch. Do I have to pay Social Security too?

A-No. The Social Security tax apples only to cash paid to householdd employees for wages and transporta-You do not have to include the value of the meals

Q-I just got a letter inviting me to a charity ball.

If I buy tickets can I list this as a charitable deduction?

A-This may be a deductible expense if the event is sponsored by a qualified organization. In that case, a deduction may be taken for that portion of the ticket price that exceeds the value you receive by buying the

In other words, if the tickets entitle you to attend a dance then you would have to substract what it would cost to attend a windle dance. cost to attend a similar dance from the amount you pay for the tickets to determine the deduction. If you buy the tickets and do not attend the event the law still requires you to reduce your charitable contribution by the value of your ticket.

To simplify things for con-tributors, IRS has requested fund-raising events list the actual admission price and the amount solicited as a contribution by the value of your ticket.

Q-My boss says that since I didn't file a new withholding certificate by May 1, I have to wait until January 1 to do it. Is that right?




