New Ranger Park Med Facility Open

Another phase of the Ranger Park Medical Center has been completed with the construction of the new Health Activities Center, located on the Ranger Park Hospital complex. The new all-masonry building is just off the highway and south of the main hospital building.

Dr. and Mrs. Fil Cabansag have announced the building will be used as a health center and to house classes in prenatal care, family dieting, reducing seminars, stop smoking classes, and nurses aide training. The building will also be available to the public upon request and reservation.

Coleman County Officials Begin Their Terms of Office

Sheriff H. F. Fenton began his new term of office Saturday, January 1, with his three deputies also sworn into office.

Fenton, a veteran law enforcement officer, is a former Coleman County Sheriff, elected to his first term here in 1947. He and his wife, Loretta, and son Shawn are residing at the County Jail. The telephone number there is 625-2846.

M. R. (Bud) Simmons, a former Santa Anna City Marshall and Deputy Sheriff, is Chief Deputy and with his wife, LaVerne, is residing in Santa Anna. They are living at 35 Santa Fe Street and may be reached at 348-3675. Simmons completed an appointed term as Lampasas County Sheriff and also served as Lampasas Chief of Police for a number of years.

Mr. and Mrs. Simmons are parents of four children, Don of Abilene; Pete of Coleman; Shirley Crawford of Lampasas; and Terry of Waco.

Deputies for the County Department are Bill Cooley and Wade Turner of Coleman. Cooley, aged 35, is a certified law enforcement officer with eight years experience. He and his wife, Patricia Ann, live in

Coleman and have four children. He is a former Coleman City Policeman.

Another deputy who started his law enforcement career with the CPD is Wade Turner, aged 24. He is also a certified official with two years experience. He and his wife, Linda, reside in Coleman with their little daughter.

Sheriff Fenton and his deputies are looking forward to serving Coleman County and are seeking the help of everyone in enforcing the law. LeMay succeeds Wallace Dingus as County Attorney; Strickland replaces long-time Commissioner Kay Anderson; and Fenton is newly chosen for his position after serving since April 1975 as night desk man for the Coleman Police Department.

Local Student In A&M Tour Group

Susan Newman, a junior animal science major at Texas A&M University, has been chosen for the Junior Meats Judging Team at A&M the first girl to qualify for the group. Susan, a 1974 graduate of Santa Anna High School, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Tom Newman.

The Meats Judging Team is composed of 13 students and two coaches. The group competes by placing beef, lamb and pork carcasses, meat cuts, yield and quality grades for beef and gives written reasons for their placings.

As a member of the team, Susan will be traveling to Denver Colorado this weekend for the National Livestock Show and contests with meats teams from other Colleges and universities. The group will be representing Texas A&M in the events which will be the first official contest for the Junior Team.

Enroute to Denver, the team will have workouts at meat processing plants at Abilene, Lubbock and Amarillo.

Other contests for the Aggie team will be at Fort Worth in late January and in Lexington, Ky. in March. The same group will represent the University at the Senior team next year.

In a mock contest last fall, Susan was highest ranking individual of the junior group.

Fire Truck Abandoned; No Rural Truck Available for VFD

Misfortune struck the Santa Anna Volunteer Fire Department recently when the 1942-model rural fire truck "gave up the ghost" and pronounced beyond repair. The loss of the antique vehicle left Santa Anna with only one operable truck, the new City Fire Truck.

Another rural truck, a 1952 vintage vehicle, is in Brownwood for major repairs expected to take several weeks, and the old Ford city truck is awaiting installation of a larger water supply tank and pump and is presently not equipped for fighting fires.

VFD officials urge area people to take extreme caution to prevent fires of any type, most especially rural fires of any kind. Due to regulations by the State Board of Insurance, the new truck MAY NOT be taken outside the city limits to fires. This leaves the rural area completely without a tank truck, and with only manpower from the VFD to control fires. Rural trucks from

Coleman or Bangs would be called in an emergency, VFD leaders said.

The annual VFD membership drive and fund drive will get underway in a few weeks, and rural people are urged to lend support so that at least one truck may be put in operation and available for rural fires. It has been stressed again that the rural fire trucks are owned and operated by the membership of the Volunteer Fire Department, not by the City of Santa Anna. The rural segment of the Department gets a small monthly donation from the County for maintenance of the vehicles and no other operating funds.

Santa Anna is fortunate to have a well-organized and well-trained department, and rural people are urged to lend their support to purchase and maintain good equipment for them to use. When contacted, be sure to make a generous donation that will be used for the protection of the area.

Colder than normal weather in November and December is expected to aid the Southwest Screwworm Eradication Program, according to officials of the program. Sterile flies produced in Mexico and released in that country south of Texas are also expected to control or eliminate screwworms from Texas ranges.

There were 171 confirmed cases of screwworms, in the state in December, with only 20 tallied during the last two weeks of the month.

Coleman County had 71 reported and confirmed cases during 1976, fewer than McCulloch's 106 confirmed cases but well over the number from the other surrounding counties.

Registration Required For Child Care Facilities

Anyone who cares for even one unrelated child outside that child's own home is subject to regulation under the Child Care Licensing Act of 1975. This law, which became effective in January of 1976, provides for the registration of any "babysitter" who cares for six or fewer children on a regular basis.

Registration is a simple process which can be done entirely by mail. It involves a fire and health inspection of the sitter's home which is done by local fire and health inspectors. When local inspections are not available, fire prevention and health and safety check lists are completed. The babysitter or caregiver is required to have a test for tuberculosis just as nurses and teachers are. In addition, the parents of the children who are in care are asked to sign emergency medical releases. These allow the caregiver to take the child to a doctor or a hospital in the event the child is hurt or becomes ill.

Registration is mandated by law and civil penalties can be invoked against those who care for children and refuse to be registered. The intent of the law, however, is not to prevent individuals from caring for children. The intent, rather, is to protect the health, safety, and well-being of the children who stay in day care arrangements. This in turn protects the individual giving the child care.

If you are caring for children in your home, or if your child stays in an unregulated day care home, please contact Valeri Deason, the day care licensing representative for Coleman County. Mrs. Deason is available to answer any questions the public might have concerning registration or day care. She handles all complaints concerning licensed or unlicensed day care centers.
