Manhunt Called Off Tuesday For Brady Jail Escapees

Shades of the Old West! Urgent calls in the middle of the night sought to locate saddlehorses to mount a posse to search for two Brady jail escapees thought to be in Coleman County in the Rockwood area. The pair were still at large Wednesday as residents in the Rockwood and surrounding area kept a watchful eye for the armed men.

State and local authorities joined the search Sunday morning as four young men gained freedom from the Brady jail by crawling through a ventilation shaft. Two of the escapees were apprehended later Sunday three miles east of Brady. The other two still on the loose are Mark Duncan, 21, of Oregon and Jimmy Henderson, 19, of Dimmitt. The two were being held in Brady on burglary

charges.

The two excapees apparently stole a pick-up near Fife which was found Monday morning wrecked near the Colorado River bridge south of Rockwood. A loaded shotgun and a .22 rifle were said to be missing from the wrecked vehicle.


Lawmen from McCulloch and Coleman counties, game wardens and highway patrolmen joined the search Monday with helicopters and dogs. The report of the escapees and the request for the riders on horseback came in the night Monday when an unidentified woman reported seeing an armed man near Whon. After a search by officers, the man was found to be a rabbit hunter from a neighboring community, unaware of his precarious position.

After 48 hours, roadblocks and patrols of the area were discontinued, according to Sheriff H. F. Fenton. Fenton stated the two suspects were thought to be completely out of the area as no confirmed reports of them had been given and no trace found in the search with helicopters and dogs.


Rehm Resigns CCTC Director

summers to work full-time. Not all of the bus driving was on the regular school bus route as many trips have been made with the band, pep squad, ball teams and other groups needing transportation after school hours. Mr. Langford says he has never had any major problems with discipline but admits to 'fussing' at his youthful riders from time to time.

Driving a school bus is a much easier job now as the buses are better and roads considerably improved. In the early years of driving, a rain and muddy roads meant removing the dual wheels and attaching mud chains to the rear wheels. 




