City Council Candidates Speak Out

Thelma Brooker Mayoral Candidate

Thelma Brooker, a city employee, is running for mayor on of Santa Anna in the election to be held Saturday, April 4.

Brooker attended a Supervisor Managerial Course and a Waste Water Treatment School. She is married and has two sons and two daughters, all married, and five grandchildren.

Mrs. Brooker said "I would like to see something done about the water bill, some improvements on the roads and for the city to work with the people more."

"I am a candidate because I would like to see Santa Anna as a thriving community on Saturday, April 4."

"I think the greatest need for the city is for the Mayor and Council to work with the people in accomplishing goals," added Mrs. Brooker.

J. T. Avants City Council Candidate

J. T. Avants, manager of Santa Anna Coop Gin and farmer, completed school at Whon. He and his wife, Lois, have two sons, Melvin of San Angelo and Larry of Brownwood. They also have five grandchildren and one great grandson.

Avants stated "All action of the City Council should be open to the citizens. I favor straight forward city government," when we asked him what he would like to see accomplished.

He is a candidate for this office "to be instrumental in accomplishing the above."

"Every citizen working together for city improvements, which include respectability, city growth, street improvements and lower water rates," was Avants' answer to the question as to what he felt the greatest need of the city was.

"An efficient family or business plans and maintains a well organized budget. I would like Santa Anna City Council to become so well organized that we can have income, expenditures, laws, and future plans at our fingertips. My education and experiences in business may help unravel some of the paper work. Current government controls and regulations call for much study and investigation by each council member," Spillman said when we asked him what he would like to see accomplished.

Joe Guerrero Mayoral Candidate

Joe Guerrero is running for re-election of mayor of Santa Anna in the city council election to be held Saturday, April 4. Guerrero is a track supervisor for Santa Fe and has been with Santa Fe for 32 years. He and his wife, Yolanda, have four sons, Raul, Benny, Joe Jr. and Danny and two daughters, Dora and Rachel.

When asked what he would like to see accomplished, he replied, "Our city to become financially stable. We need to clean up around our community. Work in close cooperation with the Chamber of Commerce. Keep our citizens well informed about happenings at City Hall. Replace more fire plugs, correct some street, water, and sewer problems."

"With my leadership we have made progress in a number of areas. I take pride in my involvements and improvements we have made to save our taxpayer's dollars. The primary reason I'm running for mayor is that I want Santa Anna to become all it can be. The past two years as mayor I have provided good leadership and the record will show that I can perform a competent

Guerrero feels that the greatest need of the city is to "solve sewer plant problems. I will seek for solutions to obtain a down stream permit to discharge treated water when our ponds are to full or in rainy season. We need city growth—work to attract new businesses."

Alex DeLeon Jr. City Council Candidate

Alex DeLeon Jr., an employee of Kohler, is running for a place on the city council in the election to be held Saturday, April 4.

DeLeon is a 1977 graduate of Santa Anna High School and attended Engineering School for Santa Fe Railroad at Topeka, Kansas. He then attended Concho Career Institute in San Angelo and now has a diploma in refrigeration and heating. He and his wife, Tanya, have three children, CaTrina, age 9, Randy, age 8, and Lexi, age 11 months.

"If elected to City Council, my three main goals are to have something done about the water bills, to have some improvements made on our roads and to attract some new businesses," replied DeLeon when asked what he would like to see accomplished.

"I am a candidate because I have lived here all of my life and I have seen the community as it was and as it is now. I would like to see Santa Anna become a growing, thriving

"I think the greatest need of the city is to get the people, both young and old, more involved in the community, and to work together as one instead of against each other."

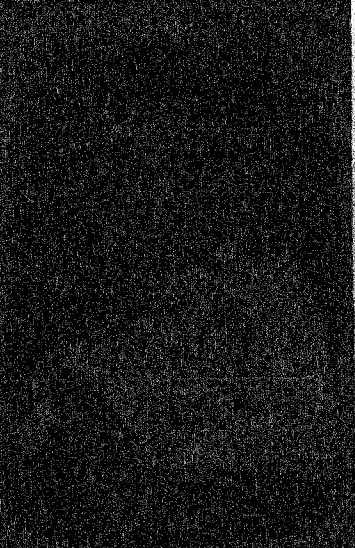
Pearl Wilson City Council Candidate

Joe Taylor Mayoral Candidate

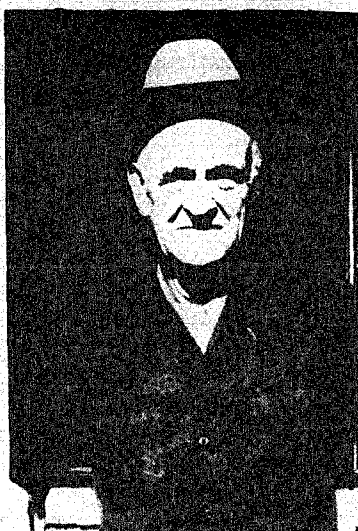

Postal Exams Offered

The U.S. Postal Service announces examinations to establish a Waco Area eligibility register of eligibles from which future clerk carriers in the Waco Area will be filled.

A clerk sorts mail and distributes it by using a complicated scheme, which must be memorized. Carriers have to collect and deliver mail.

Starting salary rate is \$10 per hour. To qualify, applicants must pass a written test and meet physical requirements.

All qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, age, color, national origin, sex, handicap(s), political affiliation or any other non-merit factors.

Two Jobs in 1986? Check SS Withheld

Approximately 5.4 percent of the nation's workforce hold more than one job. The majority of these doubly employed individuals pay social security tax on wages from both jobs.

Those who worked for two or more employers during 1986 and received wages totaling more than \$42,000 should check to see if they are entitled to a credit for excess social security tax withheld, according to the Internal Revenue Service.

Application forms for the examination may be obtained at the local Post Office, March 30 through April 3, 1987.

Applications must be submitted by April 3, 1987. The examination is for positions in the following post offices: Bremond, Clifton, Grosebeck, Hewitt, Hillsboro, Hubbard, Italy, McGregor, Marlin, Mart, Meridan, Mexia, Valley Mills, West, Whitney, Waco, Elm Mott, Lorena, Wortham, Riesel, China Spring, Granfills Gap, and Lott.

Minimum age requirement is 18. No maximum age limit.

Social security tax withheld in excess of \$3,003 can be applied as a credit against income tax only if the individual had more than one employer.

IRS notes that those who file joint returns may not add the social security tax withheld from a spouse's income to the amount withheld from his or her pay to determine the credit. The credit must be figured separately for each spouse.

Workers who had only one employer and had more than \$3,003 withheld may not claim the excess as a credit against their income tax. The employer should adjust this over-collection, the IRS explains.

Vote Saturday

Voters will go to the polls Saturday to elect a Mayor and two city council members as well as two school board members.

The polling place for the City election will be the Mountain City Community Center (located in the center of the highrise apartments).

Voters there will choose a Mayor from the list of candidates that include incumbent Joe Guerrero who is seeking his second term, city councilman Joe Taylor and city employee Thelma Brooker. Candidates for city council seats include incumbents J.T. Avants and Jim Spillman along with Alex DeLeon Jr., James Ford, James Keeney and Pearl Wilson. Mike Makuta who had filed as a candidate for the council has withdrawn from the race although his name will appear on the ballot.

The School board election will be held at the Coleman County Telephone Cooperative building. Voters will choose two trustees of the school district from a slate of candidates that include incumbent Terry McIver seeking a second term. Others in the race are Ronnie Hartman, Bill Gustavus, Robert Pritchard, Quinton Daniel and Jerry Ellis.

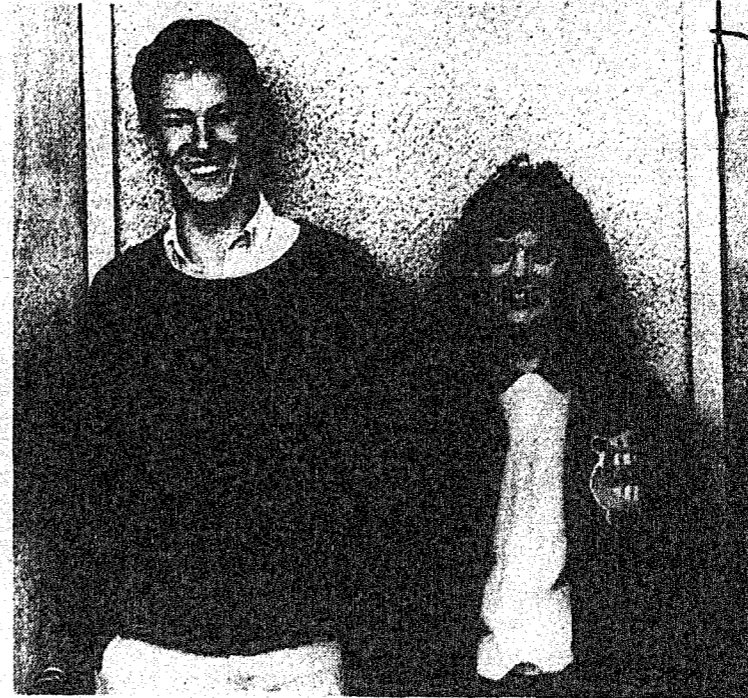
