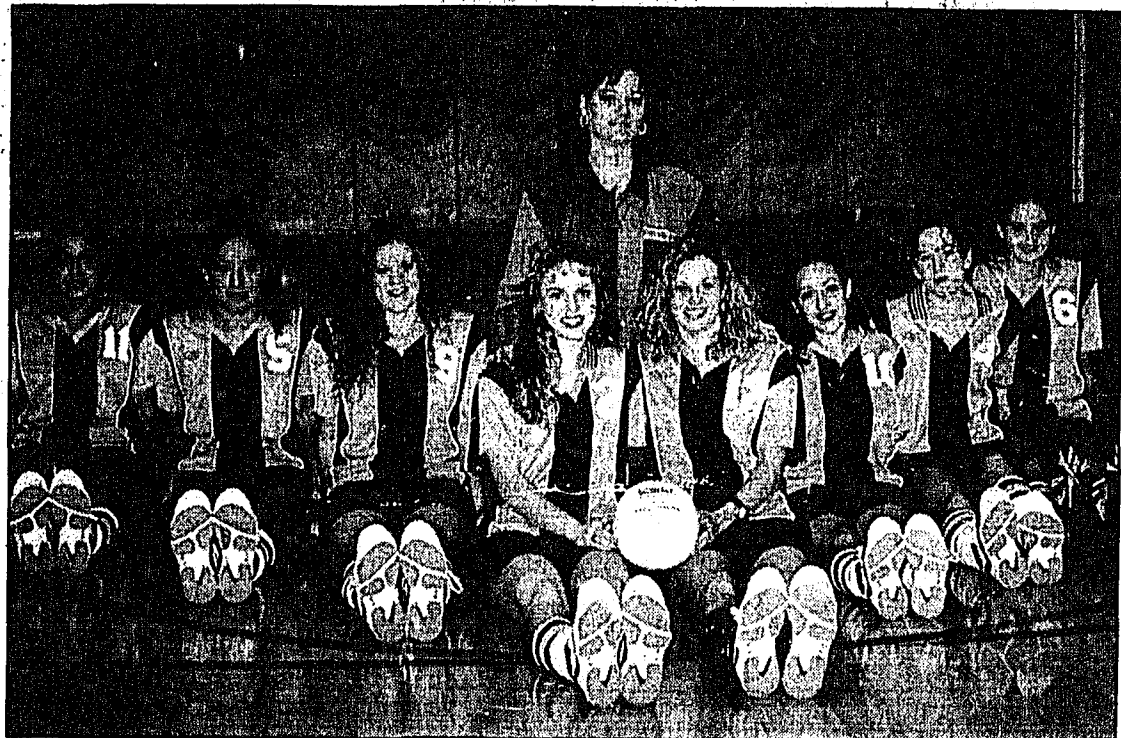

Each member gave a testimony of praise and thanks. "It's a Blessing To Call My Savior's Name" was the closing song.

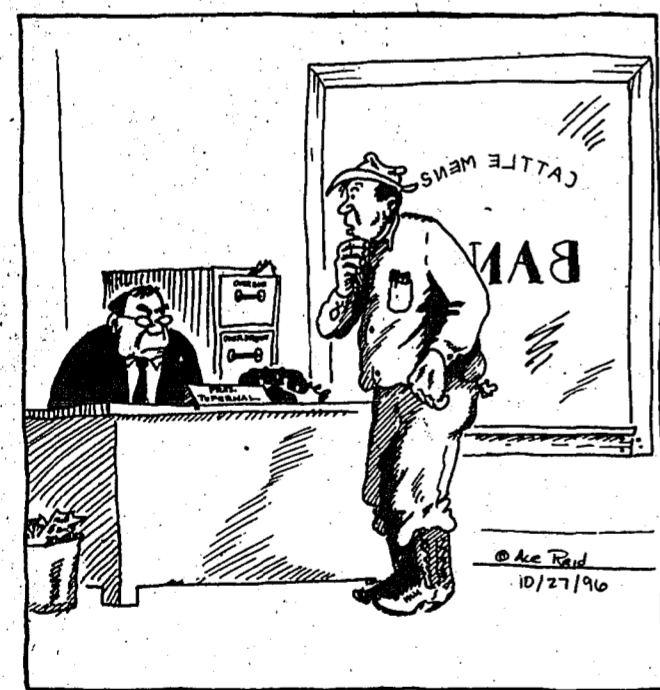

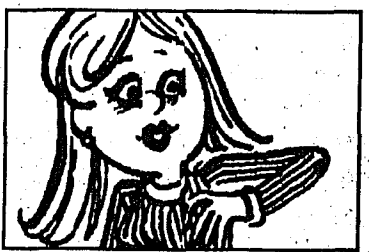
