## The Cookbook.

If the pastry be slow in browning, thirow a little sugar on the oven shelf. This will . expedite matters greatly:

## JEFFRIES WINS IN TENTH ROUND.

Detail of Championship Fight Between the
Heavy Weights at San Francisco Friday Night.

Round 1-They came to the bett's head back with left hook center quiokly and Jeff chased Corbett around and missed a left swing for the jaw. They came together and parted carefully. Jeff tried left for the body and head but was blocked. Both. tried to swing and Jim gota right to the body end Jeff then puta light over the heart and left to the body. Jeff seemed inclined to force matters. Corbett shot right to the body and they came to a clinch. Jeff hooked left to jaw and Jim got in with right to wind. As bell rang Jeff went to his corner smiling; Jeff had a little the better of the round but fought very carefally throughout. Jeff astonished his backers by his egality:

Round 2-They went to a olinoh Gid. Jeff got left to Oorbett's nook. As thay came out of a blinoh, Jeff landed hard on Jim's woeg, Jefisprugh hard with loft bat Corbett rushed inside it They came together again and Jeff gotleft to ohest. Jeff alsogot in a right to body Corbett caught Jeff a vioious left swing on the head and the champion then put light right to jaw. Jim ducked left for head and landed right on the neek, in return he received a heary jolt to the ribs. Bell rang. Jeff seamed to have ample steam behind his blow and showed much cleverness.
Round 3-They came together and were separated without any blows. Jeff landed swing in Jim's neck and followed him dow, landing another left to the wind. Corbett esoaped round the ring and Jeff put a straight lett hard to the body. Jeff caught Jim on the jaw with a vioioas right and they clinobed: Corbett claimed foul and Jeff swung left and right to jaw. Corbett protested to the referee that Jeff was holding on and landed a savage right to jaw. Jeff sent in left swing to jaw, they went to olinch. Jeff broke it up with stiff : right and left to the body and the gong rang. The round was Jeff's all through. Corbett suceeded in landing some telling blows.

Round 4-They went into a olinoh and then Jeff foroed Cor-
on the jaw and followed it with two lefts to the head. Jeff rushed Corbett with a rattling left to the jaw and followed it with left oross to the head. Corbett puts his left twice to the heed and they came together in a hard olinoh. Jeff uppercut Corbett with a poworful left to the body and Jim jabbed Jeff with left to the face; Corbett clinching constantly and landed a hard left to body, an other left and right to the body by Jeff which sent Jim to his knees; he took count of nine on one knee and waltzed into Jeff but the latter rushed at him and landed a hard right to the keart. Jim looked anxions at the sound of the bell and it was a weloome sound to him.
Round 5-They did not get to the oenter on time owing to Jeff's glove being examined by the po. lice captain. The examination
 fitte a loft to the wind apdeorbett got in a left sxing to the head also, Corbett feinted with a left and spung right to head, Jeff landed hard left swing to the head and followed quiokly with a similar below, again Jeff swung and landed right and left to jaw. Jeff out fought Jim at all points.
Round 6-Both missed left leads and they went tọ action. Jeff orouching, Jim blocked two hard rights and the champion sent Jim to the floor with a stiff left to the jam. Jim took the count and sent a left while Corbett hang to avoid punishment. Corbett rallied and devoted some good rights. and left to the face: Jeff swung with left twice and landed on the face and Jim clinch. od to ayoid punishment. The bell rang and Jeff again went to his corner smiling.
Round 7-Jeff rushed Jim about the ring and went to clinch. Jeff stopped Jim with left on face, but it was not hard: Jeff drove hard left to the body that was blocked and followed it with left to jaw and followed it with two more to the same place Corbett yelled out: "He oan't knock me out." This angered Jeff. Jim then put right to head and hard left to
wind. Jeff got in light left to body, followed with left swing to jaw. Jim came back with three stiff lefts and rights on face and bell found them in olinch. Corbett smiled as he went to his corner. At this stage Jeff has a long lead.
Round 8-Corbett led with left for head and Jeff-got right to body and Jim got left to face and in ${ }^{\prime}$ return received heavy right swing on neck. Clinch. Jeff caught Jim with right to jaw and left to body. Corbett came baok with stiff jolt to face and followed with two more to same place. Jeff received smart left on face and Jim cleverly ducked two lefts and uppercut. Jeff on the jaw with right. Corbett went in and. jarred the ohampion with a succession of rights and lefts to the face and jaw. Bell rang with Jeff bleeding from month, Corbett showed wonderfal recuperative power in this round.
Round 9-Jeff rushed in like a boll, but Jim olinohed and got in left to jaw. They mixed it and Corbett put. right uppercat to head. Jeff found Jim harder to find every minute. Corbett land: ed two stiff lefts to body and right and loft to head. Jeff poured in with right to body and kidney and in a mix-up Jim knocked Jeff to the body twioe with right and left and stabbed him with sucoession of lefts, to. tgac. Olinoh. Jin, got in on left to face: Teif put $f$ ponderous left to body and right to the head. He pushed Corbett baek with a straight left to the face as the bell rang. Corbett landed the greater amount of blows in this round and seemed to have the champion guessing.
Round 10-They at once went to a clinch. Jeff swung his left to the head and his right to the wind. Corbett put a straight to the face and Jeff got in a hard right to the wind. Jeff floored Corbett with a wioked left hook to the solar plexus. Jeff sent Corbett to the mat for nine seconds with a powerful left hook to the stomach. Jeff finally floored him again and Corbett's seconds threw up the sponge Corbett was carried to his corner and vomited some. Vorbett eventually re oovered and shook hands with his master at the pugilistio game.

The girls are now developing into fine young women, but another orop of gadding girls has come on and the Gazette hopes no one's modesty will be shooked by saying that these little bussies ought to be spanked good and hard. They are between 14 and 17 years old and are just so everlastyears old and are just so everlast-
