

And in these discordant days, it may be that imperialism is being forced upon us, whether we like it or not. Most experts are convinced that we must maintain the status quo, or a policy favorable to us, in Latin America, no matter what it cost. Give the Axis real strength there, they say, and we would sink into the obscurity of a third-rate power, dependent upon possible enemies for existence and fav-ors. That means that Latin America must follow our lead and if the Republics won't do it willingly, they must in some
