AN INTERESTING SKETCH

Of the Life of Gen. A. P. Stewart. the Great Confederate Chieftain.

Gen. A. P. Stewart was born October 2, 1821, in Rogersville, Hawkins county, East Tennessee. In the early thirties the family moved to Winchester, Franklin county, Middle Tennessee, and he was sent to the U. S. military academy at West

Point, having received the appointment of cadet through Hon. Hopkins L. Turney. There were 180 cadets in the class, and in 1841, when the class graduated, the number was 56. Generals W. S.
